109-Year-Old College of the Holy Spirit Manila Closed its Doors but the Spirit Lives On

On Apr 29, 2022, CHSM closed its doors on one sweltering hot day. With a palpable sense of loss, tears flowed, and sweat dripped that added to the intense humidity of the day for the alumni, Sisters and guests who gathered to say their farewell to our grand old dame, the College of the Holy Spirt Manila (CHSM).

CHSM was founded in 1913 by the Missionary Sisters Servants of the Holy Spirit (SSpS sisters). In an official statement in October 2020, Sr. Carmelita Victoria of the Provincial Leadership of SSpS, announced that the 109-year-old institution faced many challenges, making it difficult to attract new students in the past decade. "Private education has faced an increasingly challenging environment resulting from (i) government policies on K-12; (ii) free tuition in-state colleges and universities, local universities and colleges, and state-run technical and vocational institutions; and (iii) the significant increase in public school teachers' salaries compared to their private school counterparts."

Here in Mississauga, as I prepare for my Golden Jubilee grand reunion on February 2023, it hit me that there is no CHSM Campus to go home to. My heavy-laden heart remembers our old Alma Mater song. "Someday when far from you we roam; our thoughts will surely travel home. And mem'ries sweet will be to me, those dear old days..." February 2020, 2021, and 2022 were about virtual homecomings as the world knelt in a standstill to address the covid pandemic. Finally, on February 2023, there is hope we can do a face-to-face homecoming. 

College of the Holy Spirit Schools and Missions Run by SSpS Sisters

College of the Holy Spirit Manila (CHSM) is now a page in the long history of the SSpS Missionary Sisters in the Philippines. CHSM is gone but we, the alumnae, are her living past igniting the present to keep the Spirit of our school alive in the future.

"With One Heart, One Mind, Keep the Spirit alive" is not just a bold but empty slogan to be used at our Grand Reunion on Oct 1, 2022. We have put this slogan into action by advocating for education through the SSpS Congregation.

College of the Holy Spirit North America Foundation Inc (CHSNAF) has pledged to support the SSpS schools by providing financial support to deserving students in the following schools under the SSpS System of Schools:

- School of the Holy Spirit of Quezon City, BF Homes, Q.C.
- Holy Spirit School Cubao, on Ylang-Ylang Street, Q.C.
- College of the Holy Spirit of Tarlac, Tarlac City, Tarlac
- Holy Spirit Academy of Malolos, Malolos, Bulacan
- Holy Spirit Academy of Irosin, Irosin, Sorsogon

At the same time, the SSpS are active in ministering to the marginalized - two tribes of Indigenous People, the Aetas in Tarlac and the Mangyans in Mindoro. Our SSpS Sisters live among the people in their communities, ministering to their spiritual lives while tending to their corporal needs:

- Aeta Mission, Tarlac K-6, Maruglo Elementary School- Yangka School Annex
- Mangyan Mission K-6 Naswak Hatubuan Bangon Elementary School and its K-1 Extension School in Hugon Liguma

The children go to the public schools set up by the Department of Education for them and the Sisters provide tutoring, catechetical studies, formation of Christian values and morals. In Tarlac, the children live in dormitories weekdays and hike up the mountain to their village homes for the weekend. Because of poor nutrition, the Sisters has a feeding program for the school children in the dormitories.

With the closing of CHSM, CHSNAF has redirected its Scholarship and Grant-in-Aid program to the SSpS schools and continues its fund-raising for this program. In 2021, CHSNAF started its support of the Indigenous Peoples' Mission Schools and raised funds for its annual operating budget covering the two sites.
