

Program: THE SCANDINAVIAN FOLKDANCERS OF PHOENIX



The folk dancing group was started by members of the VASA Order of America in the early 1970's. The group's goal is to preserve traditional dances and costumes of Scandinavia.

Primarily made up of Norwegians and Swedes, the group wears traditional costumes, and they always present a colorful performance. Bruce Carlson, director of the group, says "A wide range of traditional couple and group folkdances from the Scandinavian countries are demonstrated by the dancers. A wonderful benefit is that we also have a great deal of fun doing it! We invite you to make a few friends, get a little exercise and have fun along with us."

Membership is open to anyone and all are welcome to come and dance or just watch. Please come and enjoy the colorful dancers. The dances range from child-like fun movements, to more intricately woven pieces. Business Meeting Minutes - December 9, 2017

Meeting called to order by Jonathan Walters at 1:10 PM.

- Quorum (4+) was met? Yes
- **1.** OCTOBER MINUTES: Floyd made a motion to accept the October 2017 business meeting minutes as published in the Posten. Motion seconded by Berit and passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Janis submitted her report to Jonathan before the Business Meeting: checking account balance as of December 9 is \$2,401.45. The Jul Bazaar income / sales were deposited directly by Ali and totaled \$792. Janis will review the deposit with Ali later this month.

2. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Library

Arlys has not ordered any books at this time. She was able to determine that a "missing" DVD
in a cook program was actually never received from the donor. The library inventory is
complete.

Cultural/Program

- The December 16, 2017, meeting will be a joint Julebord meeting with the Mesa lodge.
- Jonathan reported that the Scandinavian Dancers will perform at the January H&C meeting. February will be a Cream Cake Contest. In March, Jana Peterson will give a presentation about three museums she visited in Iceland and Norway.

There are 130 active members. Floyd handed out the report from headquarters showing two
transferred members and one new member. He also reviewed the printed materials distributed
at the MIM earlier this month and reminded everyone that the international and local lodge
dues will change in January 2018. A number of membership applications and Desert Fjord
Postens were distributed at the MIM December 2-3.

May this year, 2018, be full of possibilities and good health for you and your family.


