#### **SAMI FESTIVALS**

Sami National Day: The Samis celebrate their National Day on February 6th - the date the first Sami congress was held in 1917. The day is marked differently in different places. Sami week in Tromsø, for example, features reindeer racing, lassothrowing championship, a Sami market and more; while in Oslo, the carillon in Oslo City Hall plays the Sami national anthem as the Sami flag is raised. In Finnmark,

The Easter Festival: Traditionally Easter was the time of year when the reindeer-herding Sami gathered in the towns of Karasjok and Kautokeino to celebrate the end of winter. Easter was also a time for weddings. Today celebrations are still religious in character, but Easter is also a time when Sami culture takes center stage, with many events in both Karasjok and Kautokeino. The Sami Grand Prix and the annual reindeer race are two of the highlights, but other events include concerts, theatre performances and exhibitions.

# **Business Meeting Minutes**

# Sons of Norway – Desert Fjord Lodge 6-133 Business Meeting at Granite Reef Senior Center January 9, 2016

- 1. Meeting called to order by Ed Bergo at 1:00 PM. In attendance: Roger Espeland, Ross Berg, Floyd Downs, Elizabeth Lenci- Downs, Phyllis Bergo, Jonathan Walters, Janis Johnson, Jana Peterson, Berit Miltun, and Lynn Eide. Quorum (4+): Yes
- 2. Floyd made a motion to accept November 2015 business meeting minutes as published in the Posten. Janis seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- 3. Treasurer's Report Roger handed out November and December 2015 financial statements for review.
  - Checking balance is \$1,749.28. Roger will prepare and submit a financial report to budget committee for use in preparing 2016 budget.
- 4. Review of January 10th Heritage and Cultural Meeting.
  - Reviewed preliminary meeting agenda.
  - Cultural Director's Report –Program on January 10<sup>th</sup> from 2:00 to 5:00 PM
    - Program will feature bunad video followed by bunad parade with wearer's descriptions of bunad's background and geographical origin.
    - Bennie Jo Hinchey will officially install newly elected officers for 2016.
    - February meeting will be a presentation about the Sami people, by Kate Martinson of Vesterheim Museum in Decorah, Iowa. Kate will also be promoting classes held at the museum for which Desert Fjord could provide scholarship assistance to members interested in attending.

### 5. Committee Reports

- Membership Lodge membership activity report: 137 active members (includes juvenile members with active insurance). Floyd reviewed November and December 2015 membership activity reports with the board.
- Library All books pertaining to bunads will be on display for January social meeting.
- Genealogy-No meeting was held in January 2016. Board discussed Ross inviting 2 members in genealogy group each month to handle group discussion. Discussion was held regarding a charge of \$3.00 per person per month to attend meeting. Monies would go toward room rental.
- Posten –Posten was prepared and mailed with printed version handled by Ross while Tyler is recuperating.
- Publicity-Janis will take and submit photos of February social meeting to Viking magazine.

#### 6. Old Business -

- Board reviewed proposed updates for the Lodge's Rules and Policies.
- Board approved Rules and Policies document with condition that 3.2 be revisited at later date.
- Online membership directory is now available.

#### 7. New Business -

- Leadership Workshop for members and officers will be held January 30, 2016 at Granite Reef Senior Center from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM. Jonathan will handle reservations.
- Education committee will meet to review and revamp all applications.
- Phyllis made a motion that Janis, Ed, and Jonathan review items in Lodge storage room and storage unit on January 15<sup>th</sup> to determine what could be removed with the hope of eliminating storage unit or moving to a smaller unit.
- Budget committee has been asked to develop a policy billing "no shows," charging those who attend only the programming and do not eat the meal, free meals for first time attendees, free meals for new members and budgeting for meals provided to non-members who are participating in lodge programming.
- Meeting was adjourned at 3:30 PM.

## The Rules and Policies Updated

On Desert Fjord's website, you will see a link to our Rules and Policies. This past fall, several Board members met at Roger Espeland's home to review the 3-4 year old version. These areas needed to be adjusted to better reflect what was planned for the lodge:

- A member directory will soon be available. This will list name, telephone number and email addresses of those who have elected to participate.
- Scholarships will be available for members to attend educational events. This broadens the scope of our current scholarship program and will allow more members to go to these special opportunities.
- The nomination process for all of the Sons of Norway is being modified to allow a broader group of participants to serve in elected positions. You may have noticed announcements inviting members to volunteer for leadership positions. Hopefully, this will allow more people to be involved in leadership.

The updated version was approved at the January Board Meeting. Now we need to determine how best to communicate passwords and the mechanics of accessing the online member directory. We also need to assemble an Educational Committee to edit the applications for a new scholarship group. Please let our President, Jonathan Walters know if you would like to volunteer for this Educational Committee.
