



Over the holiday season we are reading "Don't Cry, Pappa" by Gunnar Skollingsberg.

The youngest child of a Norwegian immigrant family to the United States, Gunnar grew up with feelings of alienation and loneliness. He later developed a persistent, profound depression which was only alleviated upon the birth of his first child. This little baby boy became the joy and purpose of Gunnar's life.

Parents live in perpetual, subconscious fear of losing a child. For this author, this ultimate nightmare has come true not once, but twice; a tragic car accident took the life of his two year-old son, and - many years later - his 15 year-old daughter drowned while on a camping trip.

In his moving, new memoir, Don't Cry, Pappa, Gunnar Skollingsberg chronicles his journey from devastating, suicidal depression to tentative, fragile healing. Fortunately, he was able recover the drive to live beyond his children's deaths. He eventually refocused his life's purpose to bring moments of happiness and laughter to other children.





Desert Fjord Lodge's Agnes Stieler Education Fund

Safeguarding the Lodge's Scholarship/Grant Monies

Members attending the November 13th meeting were asked to vote on a proposal to move this endowment fund to a Sons of Norway Capital Account. They unanimously approved the move. This fund currently has about \$49,000 in it and the interest and dividends are to be used for scholarships and grants. Prior to this, the money had been held in a different Sons of Norway fund.

Why would we want to move this money to a Capital Account?

Our International Board representative, Roger Espeland has participated in discussions about these new funds for some time. He encouraged us to make this transition. But why:

As a Capital Account, we will get a better return on our money. This new fund is incorporated into the Sons of Norway insurance company investments; the fees on that larger amount are lower. Secondly, our members will be able to make tax deductible contributions to this account; this provides an incentive to increase the amount of money in the account. Thirdly, the money is permanently protected as an endowment and is not available to be spent by the lodge. We believe that this is what Agnes Stieler would have wanted us to do with this money. Only the interest on the money may be spent.

Desert Fjord Lodge has decided to give both grants to our current members and scholarships to our college students. This started in 2016. The grants are to be used by our members to participate in Scandinavian cultural events. The scholarships are available to our college students to extend their education. New application forms are available and will soon appear on our website. Please contact a Board Member if you need more information.

Editor's Note: As a soon-to-be graduate, I can't talk about the importance of scholarships enough; they are the reason I was able to attend university and why I have the blessing to work with all of you!
