



We will be discussing our current book, THE GIRL IN THE SPIDER'S WEB, by D. Lagercrantz.

(Roger Espeland recently returned from the Sons of Norway International Convention in Tacoma, WA which he attended as International Director from District Six. He shared this document with the Desert Fjord lodge board. The new dues structure will go into effect January 1, 2018. This gives us a glimpse of the important work Roger does serving in this capacity.)

NEW SIMPLIFIED DUES TALKING POINTS

If 50% of members bought an Insurance product there would be no need for dues.

These talking points were provided to each District President prior to the Spring Board meetings.

Investigating and pursuing a simplified dues structure was voted on and approved by the delegates to the 2014
 International Lodge Meeting. Delegates overwhelmingly supported the following resolution:

WHEREAS the current dues structure and membership categories are complicated and very hard to explain to prospective members AND for current members to understand; now,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that a committee be established by the International Lodge President to present a resolution in 2016 to the International Lodge which will simplify the current membership classifications to include Insurance/Social and Individual/Family and make total dues for each lodge consistent within each country.

- 2. The resolution originally came from the District 5 Board of Directors.
- 3. The general consensus of delegates is that this is a good idea and will benefit the organization because it makes recruitment easier especially at events that attract attendees from multiple cities states or countries. Recruiters will no longer have to refer to lists that display all the various dues for individual lodges.
- 4. We are proposing two dues levels; one for individuals, which is \$60 and a second for families (all under the same roof), which would be \$95. Also during the initial rollout phase this would only apply to US lodges (Canada and Norway would not see a dues change until phase 2).
- 5. This change would create a TRUE family membership category, which is something lodges, districts and international delegates have pursued for many years. The result of a family membership could be an increase in youth involvement within the lodges.
- 6. By offering a family membership, we could reduce the number of non-paying spouses.
- 7. The proposed dues were settled upon after reviewing the full range of dues across the organization. The goal was to ensure that this change would not financially penalize lodges.
- 8. With this change districts and lodges would either see no change or an increase in the amount of dues they receive. This would lead to strengthening the lodge's autonomy and offering each lodge the opportunity to increase its programming or charitable giving.
- 9. This change would potentially help lodges increase the amount they give to the community.
- 10. Each Spring the International Board will still review the dues amount and make changes if necessary.

\$60 Individual Dues <u>Breakdown</u>: (\$32 Int'l \$14 District \$14 Local Lodge)

\$95 Family Dues <u>Breakdown</u>: (\$42 Int'l \$25 District \$28 Local Lodge)

Annual deadline is usually January 2

Established in 2004, thanks to a gift-by-will from Sons of Norway member Helen Tronvold, this scholarship offers up to three \$2,000 scholarships annually. This scholarship supports the Sons of Norway foundation's goal of providing cross-cultural experiences for youth by helping them attend one of Norway's 70 folk high schools for an entire year of study (August-May).

Eligibility:

- Applicant must be a high school graduate, age 18-23.
- Must be accepted to a folk high school.


