

Let's hoist the sail of our Viking ship and catch the fresh, favorable winds ahead ...





“Little Norway in Pictures”

How the Royal Norwegian Air Force trained in Ontario, Canada during WW II 1940 and forward ... compared to what's happening today in our own backyard.

The Royal Norwegian Air Force Training program was presented by Lt Col Martin Tesli at our Heritage and Culture meeting in March. Norway has several F-35s; since 2015 Norwegians have been in training to fly and maintain these amazing planes at Luke AFB, AZ. He gave a brief summary of how this program fits into Norway's history as well as the commitment that's been made to this program. Other countries are also training here, but Norway has the largest contingent of planes and related staff.




The awards are as follows:




Compare this to the result of Norway being invaded by Nazi Germany on April 9, 1940 and the subsequent temporary defeat. The commitment and desire of young Norwegians to retaliate was presented by Ola Myra. He trained at Little Norway in Toronto, Canada as a pilot for the Royal Norwegian Air Force. He, along with all other trainees, had one goal – return to England and defeat the Nazis. These young men traveled to Little Norway through England and the North Sea and around the world thru South Africa and South America to achieve their goal.

Combat planes had been purchased from the United States prior to April 1940 but did not arrive in time and were then delivered to Little Norway for use by the reorganized Royal Norwegian Air Force. These planes were used for training future pilots and mechanics who maintained them. Other types of combat planes were also provided to the R.N.A.F.

The recruits and trainees were visited by Crown Prince Olav, Crown Princess Martha, Prince Harald, and Princesses Ragnhild and Astrid.

The recruits and trainees were well fed – familiar Norwegian fare. Residents of the area entertained them but they retained their Nordic customs. The climate was similar to Norway, skiing and winter sports were possible. In the warmer months, soccer, boating, swimming were off-duty amusements. Norwegian Independence day, the 17th of May, was celebrated with parades, demonstrations and possibly some Canadian additions. Denmark and Sweden had trainees and donated funds.

Desert Fjord Library is fortunate to have the book “Little Norway in Pictures”. It’s out of print, but it’ll be on the library table during the lodge meetings for you to see and check out if you’re interested. As I read this book I wondered how many US citizens knew of the training being done long ago by Norwegians in Canada. I did not.
