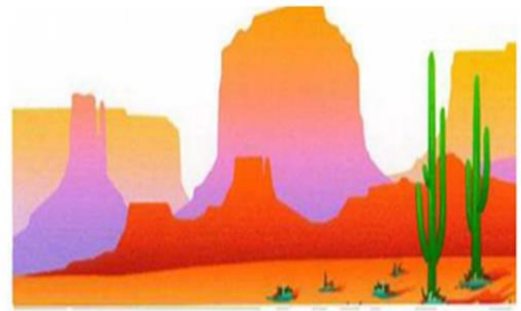

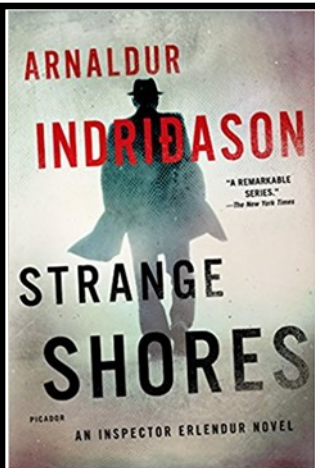

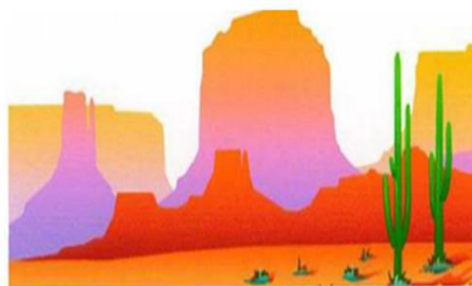

Ten members participated in our initial planning meeting for an "All Lodge" event to be held in late Fall 2018. Initial thoughts are to host a half-day Scandinavian Heritage

Festival. The event would include food, music, genealogy information, dancing, bunads, cookies, face painting, performers, exhibits and more. It would be open to the public free of charge, with a nominal charge for a "sampler ticket" that would be used to obtain a bottle of water and limited samples of various cookies, desserts, foods, lefse, etc.

Our intent is to publicize this event to the greater Phoenix area using posters, mailings, email and social media; appealing to anyone who may have an interest in their Norwegian roots and/or Scandinavian heritage. Due to the limited availability of parking and time at the Masonic Lodge for setting up or tearing down, we are exploring other local venues, so we can comfortably be open from 1 to 5 PM.

We'll be applying to the SON Foundation for a Culture and Heritage Grant to cover some of our expenses. We'll be gathering information from visitors and will conduct a campaign to encourage them to join as members. This event will be in lieu of a regular monthly meeting, so we're asking everyone to attend and participate in some manner. As always, we welcome everyone to join our "Renewal Task Force". 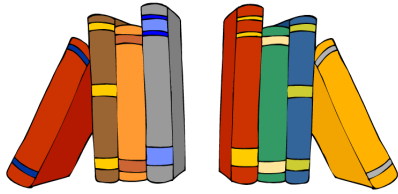

LIBRARY CORNER

I've done some research on Syttende Mai; I hope it will be of interest along with a list of several books that celebrate the Norwegian Constitution signed on May 17, 1814. Norway became an independent kingdom to avoid becoming part of Sweden after the Denmark-Norway defeat in the Napoleonic wars.

Children's parades are the norm in Norway. There's music including singing of the Norwegian national anthem, carrying the Norwegian flag of red, white and blue, and the wearing of these colors. People dress up for the event, rain or shine. Bunads are worn ... most have them. Singing and cheering with rattles and whistles are part of the celebration.

Many celebrations are held in the immigrant communities of the U.S. – Bay Ridge Settlement in New York City; Petersburg, AK; Stoughton, WI; Decorah, IA; Ballard neighborhood of Seattle, WA; Poulsbo, WA; and many other small communities. And finally in Phoenix, AZ the Sons of Norway lodges along with Norwegians Worldwide celebrate on the Saturday before May 17: food, music, parade, children's games and catching up with those only seen at the annual Syttende Mai. And it is usually a warm day so bunads are changed for more seasonal Arizona clothing.

There are two books in the library about Norwegian history:

- **The History of Norway** by Larsen
- **A Brief History of Norway** by I. Midgaard

Three additional books about Syttende Mai (Not in library):

- **Poulsbo** - earliest Scandinavian community on the Olympic Peninsula; was largest supplier of cod on the Pacific coast.
- **The Best Words Ever** - Olaf to give speech on May 17 but had a problem - stuttering.
- **A Syttende Mai Son** - Son of divorced parents proved himself despite his stepfather's hatred
