

TO THE ENDS OF THE EARTH

A Story About 1000 Norwegian-American Missionaries by Torbiborn Greipsland

Norwegian missionaries started going to China. Many went to US seminaries for additional education. On their furloughs many went to the US to share their experiences in China. As a result, many Norwegian Americans went to seminary schools such as Augsburg and St Olaf. The Hauge Synod encouraged many that had a desire to work with Chinese women. One requirement was to learn the Chinese language. The missionaries survived many changes over the years until they were no longer welcome by the government.

There was also encouragement for missionaries to go Madagascar and work with the native tribes. They established schools and hospitals. They also had to survive government changes. They were expected to learn the native language and French (Madagascar was a French colony).

Additional Norwegian American missionaries went to India, South Africa, Alaska, islands in the Bering Strait which became part of Russia, Mongolia and New Guinea. Their lives and experiences were challenging and fulfilling.

Most of these missionaries were Lutheran but there were also some Adventists.

Jonathan's parents were missionaries in Madagascar 1957 - 1977. During that same period I had a cousin who was also a neighbor and one of my teachers in Madagascar. Sometimes this is a small world!



Desert Fjord Business Meeting

<u>Meeting</u>: Jonathan opened the meeting shortly after noon. The business meeting started with almond cake being served by Janis.

<u>Attendees</u>: Janis Johnson, Arlys Medlicott, Jan and Sherrie Loomis, Floyd Downs, Jonathan Walters, Ed and Phyllis Bergo.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: The September Business Meeting minutes were approved with a minor correction.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Bank balance is \$2,408.37. Money is being set aside in savings to cover future expenses for the District Six convention in 2020. We are doing well because we have been cautious in our spending. Jonathan suggested a 50/50 raffle to raise money in upcoming H&C meetings. This will begin in October. The additional money will be needed for the special events like March 24, 2019.

<u>Desert Fjord Task Force</u>: Jan Loomis reported on the progress of planning for the March 24 event. The Stoughton Dancers are secured for that date. They bring their own musicians, so we may need some performance lighting. The Task Force is looking into having a photo booth, a well-known author or a genealogist to speak, face painting, food demos, chip carver, arts and crafts displays etc. Jan has the name of a prominent Ancestry.com genealogist (from Luella Grangaard) as a potential speaker. We have reserved space with the Masonic Lodge for that Sunday. We anticipate the event will run from 2-5 PM. Facebook ads for this event as well as printed notices to the Lutheran churches should be among the ways to promote it. Save the date flyers should be given out at the Jul Bazaar in November.

<u>Membership</u>: Floyd gave a report on membership from June to Sept. Active member's figures have gone from 133 to 124. He and Ross arranged a luncheon meeting with JoAnn Nelson. Her husband Clarence, former head of our library, recently passed away. He will email new membership lists to Jonathan and Phyllis.

<u>Library</u>: Arlys said that the more current books show activity in being checked out, but older books do not. Jonathan suggested a book display at the March event. Another suggestion was to give away or sell off the older books to make the library more manageable in size. Arlys will review these options.

Programming: The current PA system has been updated with some new wiring and should work for Jana's presentation in October. Jackson Loomis has a 4-minute video on Camp Norge to show at our next H&C meeting. The presentation will further introduce Camp Norge to our lodge members. Floyd Downs mentioned the PBS travel log about the building of the Scandinavian Railroad as a good program.



Meeting was adjourned by 1:20 PM. The next Business Meeting is scheduled for November 3rd.
