


Of the few Scandinavian hymns that crossed the ocean and was remembered into the next generation, this Christmas tree hymn from Norway ranks among the top,

along with "Children of the Heavenly Father." Written to be sung on Christmas Eve when the tree was being decorated, it tells parents, especially mothers, how they should teach their children about the faith as they decorate the tree. The first stanza of the text is well known in Norwegian yet in America. This hymn first appeared in the *Nynorsk Salmebog* of 1926. It very quickly appeared among the Norwegian Americans and was translated by P.A. Sveeggen, for inclusion in *The Concordia* in 1931.

Secretary's Report: The October Business Meeting minutes were approved. Motion made by Ed and seconded by Arlys.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was given by Janis. Everything is all paid up. \$700 is in savings as a set aside for the District Six convention in 2020. Ending balance is \$1348.99. A suggestion was made to have a 50/50 raffle at the Nov. meeting. Janis will begin to compile data from 2018 in anticipation of creating a 2019 budget. This must include money to hold the March event.

Programming: No meetings have been scheduled for December but members will be encouraged to go to the Lutefisk dinner and the Julebord in Mesa. Both will be announced at our November meeting and in the November and December Posten.

The Scandinavian Spring Fest is scheduled for March 9, 2019, at St. Peter Lutheran Church in Mesa. This offers an additional opportunity for us to participate with our boutique and its expanded inventory. The MIM has announced that Scandinavian Experience will not take place in 2018; therefore, Desert Fjord will not need to provide staff for that weekend event.

Membership: Jonathan reviewed the headquarters Membership activity report. A number of changes in membership were noted. Some follow up will be required.

Library: Arlys discussed the book report that she prepared for the November Posten on "To the Ends of the Earth", a new title added to our library.

Old Business: A lapel microphone has been purchased. Ed and Jonathan will meet next week to check out the modified sound system.

New Business:

- There was a preliminary discussion about changing the date and time of our monthly Business Meeting. This discussion will continue at the next Business Meeting. Would there be some way to save Jan and Sherrie Loomis a trip from Payson by connecting the Business Meeting and the H&C meeting on the same day? Mesa has done this with their Business and Social meetings. We should confer with Blaine Monson and see how it works for Overtro Fjell.

Meeting was adjourned by 1:55 PM; the next Business Meeting will be held in January 2019.
