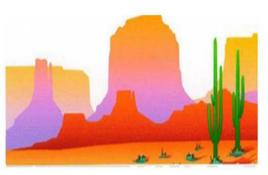

Scandinavian Viking Festival Success

Almost a year ago the leadership of our lodge discussed options on how we may be able to reach out to the community, build interest in Sons of Norway, appeal to a younger demographic, and increase our membership. We quickly decided a well-publicized festival that featured one or more popular performers and exhibitors would be our best option. To minimize our financial risk, we decided to utilize our regular meeting facility and limit the festival to a 3-hour "open house" format. We considered a variety of dates but decided on March 24th when we were able to book the Stoughton High School Norwegian Dancers for two performances during their spring tour of Arizona and Nevada.

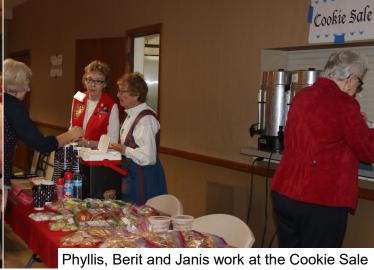
To appeal to a younger demographic, we decided to specifically focus on the popularity of Viking lore. Just the mention of "Viking" on our Facebook page garnered considerable interest and even more interest when we added a blacksmith to our list of exhibitors. Facebook became our primary means for reaching the public and the results were tremendous. We only spent \$150 in advertising and more than doubled the number of people following our page. Every few weeks we would highlight another event on our page that could be experienced at our festival - blacksmith, genealogist, Ancestry DNA Kit giveaway, Viking folklore author, dancers, etc. Each of those event posts resulted in more people expressing interest in the festival, sharing the information with friends or commitment to "going". By March 23rd over 250 people indicated they were coming to the festival and another 2,000 people had indicated they were interested.

I awaited our festival opening on March 24th with a lot of anxiety. Would people really show up? Would we have a traffic jam on Scottsdale Rd? Would people come and walk away when they couldn't find parking? Would the police show up and shut us down? Having taken some precautions to avoid the worst-case scenarios, we experienced an opening crowd of several hundred people anxious to see the first dance performance, sample cookies and visit exhibitors. Over 120 people sat in on the first dance performance and almost 100 more saw the second performance. In total, we estimate between 300 and 400 people came through the festival doors. We sold out our cookies within the first 30 minutes. Dirk had a constant line of people waiting for a taste of krumkake. Over 50 children completed a crafts project with Heather. Our Festival Viking greeted the crowds and posed frequently for pictures with kids and adults. People had fun and the exhibitors were all pleased with the outcome.

With a successful festival now behind us, we need to focus on securing the lodge renewal results we had hoped for. The increase in followers on our Facebook page has given us quick access to a larger group of people who are interested in the kinds of things our lodge does. We need to create programs and regularly promote them to these people, encouraging them to come to our meetings and potentially join SON. These new "followers" are younger in age (25 to 45 years old) and 70% are female, so we need to plan accordingly. I'm also pleased to announce that we handed out over 20 membership applications at the festival and three people completed applications to join that day. We had over 100 entries for our DNA Kit giveaway; several of these people also indicated an interest in joining our lodge. Finally, we had over 30 new people subscribe to our web site and we are in conversation with several them who asked about membership.

Thank you to everyone for making our festival a success. Special thanks to the lodge leadership for taking a leap of faith and committing the funds for the event. A big thanks to those who helped set up, tear down, bake cookies, take pictures, man a table and assist with crowd control. Desert Fjord Business Meeting

Meeting: The business meeting was held at the Scottsdale Methodist Church and was opened by Jonathan Walters at 1:15 PM.

Attendees: Jonathan Walters, Janis Johnson, Arlys Medlicott, Sherrie and Jan Loomis, Jana Peterson, Nina Poe, Berit Miltun, Ed and Phyllis Bergo and Ross Berg.

Secretary's Report: Jan moved to accept the minutes of the January meeting. Ed seconded. The motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Janis gave a treasurer's report. \$1100 is now set aside for the District Six convention in 2020. Our balance of \$2,150.97 is available in checking. Ali spent \$185.00 for boutique inventory. \$50.00 has been sent to the foundation in memory of Sharon Clunk and Roger Espeland.

Social Report: Berit did not have a report since the Viking Festival occurs in place of our March meeting. April food will be decided later.

Programming: Nina reported that Bruce Folken from Minneapolis Norway House will present the program in April

Membership: Sherrie reported that William Jacobson passed away. Jonathan reported that the lodge achievement forms were completed and sent in on time. Nina made a number of suggestions about successfully recruiting new member and potential member dinners as well as joint meetings with Norwegians Worldwide (which we do at Syttende Mai) and shared websites.

Library: Arlys reported that most books except recent mysteries aren't being checked out.

New Business – Survey: Ed gave a brief report of the survey results: Forty members responded to the survey. A snapshot of where we are as a lodge shows that <u>quality programing</u> is the greatest incentive for attendance. More emphasis on cultural skills was mentioned as well as a suggestion to not repeat the same programs. 75% say the cost of the meals are acceptable with 25% reporting they are too expensive. We need to <u>formally welcome new members and visitors</u> at each meeting and lodge members are encouraged to be welcoming and not clannish.

Viking Festival: Jan gave an update on the plans for the March 24th Viking Festival. Five DNA kits were purchased, three of which will be used at the Viking Festival in a drawing and the other two used at our 35th anniversary this fall. Table assignments and locations for the cultural skills are in place. Flood lights have been purchased for the Blue Room as well as traffic cones and caution tape. Directing traffic is a concern. Members are asked to park in the shopping center south of the Masonic Lodge. The Stoughton Dancers will go to Payson to overnight following our event. Jonathan will contact the Sunday church group to determine how early we can get into the Masonic Lodge building that Sunday. Jan indicated that the Facebook announcement of this event is creating substantial visibility.

Ross will use the International Sons of Norway paperwork to apply for a foundation grant to help cover some of the costs of this event.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting by Sherrie and seconded by Ed

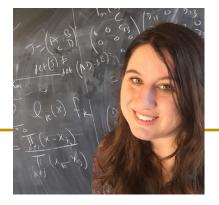
Flood Damage on the Home Front
