

It is with heavy heart that we announce the passing of another stalwart of Sons of Norway, Roger Espeland. He passed away on February 3, 2019 at the age of 82. A Celebration of Life service was held Sunday, February 17th at Messenger Mortuary in Scottsdale. Roger retired from the Bureau of Land Management, Denver Center, in 1994 and moved to Scottsdale in 1997. Summers were always spent in Norway. Roger was active in the Sons of Norway, serving as President, Posten Editor, and Webmaster in Desert Fjord lodge. He also served as District 6 Treasurer and International Director, Sons of Norway. Our thoughts and prayers go out to Sissel and the rest of the Espeland family. He will be missed!

Update on the simplified dues structure that was effective January 1, 2018:

- The new plan includes a Family Membership where all members in a household share the same renewal date. The members must reside in the same household, at the same address, and belong to the same lodge. The current rate is \$95/year. Individual memberships are \$60/year.
- Dues for the Heritage Membership (ages 0 to 15 years) remain FREE.
- Unger Venner Membership (ages 16 to 23 years) is discontinued; they can be included under Family Membership.

Desert Fjord Business Meeting 4140 N Miller Road, Scottsdale, AZ February 2, 2019

Meeting: The Desert Fjord business meeting was opened by Jan Loomis at 1:10 pm.

Attendees: Janis Johnson, Arlys Medlicott, Ed & Phyllis Bergo, Jan & Sherrie Loomis and Berit Miltun.

Secretary's Report: The January Business Meeting minutes were tabled and will be reviewed next month.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was given by Janis. We have \$2,339.06 in checking and \$900 in savings which is set aside for the District Six convention in 2020.

Programming & Social:

- Berit reported that the Cod dinner will be \$17.00 due to the 20% increase in wholesale cost of the cod. A suggestion was made to have chicken as an alternative to the cod and have lemon bars for dessert. Berit will discuss these suggestions with Shannon.
- There was a discussion about future meals to be more flexible and not necessarily Norwegian food. Shannon would like to use real plates. The details of that will have to be worked out with the Masonic Lodge.
- Sherrie mentioned that November is our 35th anniversary. Wine, cheese, and appetizers were discussed for this meeting. Would we consider getting a Hardanger fiddler for that event?
- Jan reported that our programs are listed online but people want to get it on their calendar as early as possible. It would be helpful to have programs listed for the entire year.

Cultural programs for 2019 are as follows:

- February: Kate Martinson from Vesterheim: Sugar Barons (Norwegian) of Hawaii.
- March: No regular meeting but March 24 Viking Festival at our lodge location.
- April: Speaker Bruce Folken from Norway house in Minneapolis
- May 11: Syttende Mai at the McCormick-Stillman Railroad Park
- June: Ice Cream Social and Movie
- August: Picnic in the Pines

Membership: Sherrie will call members whose dues are overdue. She has all of Floyd's files now. She couldn't check on pins and applications with Minneapolis due to their being closed because of bad weather. Welcome kits are needed for new members. International reported we reached 75% of our goal for new members. The goal is set by the International board.

Library: The Easter custom in Norway is to read a mystery during that week. We haven't ordered any new ones. The Viking magazine listed 6 suggestions for this last year.

New Business:

- A detailed report was made by Jan regarding the March 24th Viking Festival event. A separate budget of \$1,575 was noted for the Viking Festival.
- A memorial black drape will be placed in the front of our meeting (as well as a single white rose) in honor of Sharon Clunk.
- A motion was made by Ed and seconded by Sherrie to accept the proposed budget for 2019.
- The D17 form and E form to the IRS will be mailed out according to schedule by Janis.

Hello spring!


Spring is the season of renewal and new beginnings. It is also the time of year many of us do spring cleaning to clear out the dust and spaces in our homes.
