

Finally, Ole said, "And we're saving on laundry with the new washer and dryer."



Winner of 2021 Petrona Award announced – a first win for Historical Crime

The winner of the 2021 Petrona Award is:

TO COOK A BEAR by Mikael Niemi



The judges' statement on TO COOK A BEAR:

The judges adored **TO COOK A BEAR**, a historical crime novel set in northernmost Sweden in 1852, and were unanimous in our decision to select it as the Petrona Award winner for 2021. We were particularly impressed with the novel's use of historical detail, its fascinating reimagining of a figure from history, the sense of location and atmosphere, the rumination on religion versus the natural world, and the depiction of early forensics. T**O COOK A BEAR**'s superb characterization of the main protagonists Læstadius and Jussi, which is tinged with sadness yet hope, also allows the author to explore the issues of literacy and class with sensitivity and compassion. The beautiful translation by Deborah Bragan-Turner lets the novel shine for English-language readers around the world.

Traditional Norwegian Cooking

Norway's cuisine reflects both its climate and its culture. Because of the country's high mountains, steep fjords and sweeping plateaus, only a small percentage of Norway's land is arable. From the 1500s, Norway's population remained at the very limits of what the country's agriculture could sustain. In order to survive, Norwegians had to supplement their diets with hunting, fishing and gathering—as well as pioneering some fairly extreme methods of preserving and storing foods. Even though Norway itself was relatively poor, its strong maritime connections brought foreign foods and ingredients to Norwegian homes. For example, spices that aren't native to Norway—cardamon, cinnamon, and coriander—occur widely in traditional Norwegian cooking.

Surviving on a meager food supply for centuries had an indelible impact on the Norwegian culture. People learned to live and thrive on what they had. Thrift, perseverance and moderation became treasured traditional values.

Sons of Norway Norwegian Cooking Cultural Skills

The Sons of Norway Cultural Skills Program provides a framework for learning about tradition and contemporary culture. Each cultural skill has three parts that can be done in any order or all at once. The Cooking skills parts are Traditional Favorites, Baked Goods and Desserts and Preparing Meat and Fish Dishes. You can use your own recipes and refer to the excellent Recipe Box on the Sons of Norway website site.

There is paperwork to fill out which includes photos of what you prepare, review of each item prepared, complete one elective activity, and a unit evaluation form.
