Join us as we explore some of the emerging artists and trends out of Norway and the Nordics. We'll discuss how their commitment to the arts, along with Nordic cooperation, is helping to inform the global art conversation.


# LIBRARY CORNER

Still Waters is the first in the popular Sandhamn Murder Series from bestselling Swedish author, Viveca Sten. What secrets does the idyllic island of Sandhamn hide?

Together, they attempt to unravel the riddles left behind with two additional deaths on the island. While investigating, they are both trying to make sense of the difficult twists their own lives have taken since the shared summer days of their youth.



**Meeting:** The meeting was called to order by Jonathan Walters at 3:56 pm.

**Attendees:** Jonathan Walters, Janis Johnson, Jan Loomis, Phyllis and Ed Bergo, Lynn and Donald Solie, Berit Miltun, Jana Peterson, Ali Berg, and Nina Poe.

**Secretary's Report:** Minutes of the January meeting were approved – a motion by Jan and seconded by Janis. Motion carried.

**Treasurer's Report:** As of Feb.1st we have \$1,084.00 in checking, \$50.00 in savings, and \$1702 in the convention fund. Janis presented the budget for 2020. Last year we finished \$66.00 in the black. Jan moved to accept the budget and Ed seconded. Motion carried.

**Cultural Report:** Jana Peterson reported that the April 19<sup>th</sup> (not April 12<sup>th</sup>) meeting will be Max Stevenson from Norway House, presenting a program on Contemporary Art in Norway. (Our usual meeting would fall on Easter Sunday.) A 50/50 raffle will help offset the cost of the \$500 airfare for our speaker.

Membership: we have as of today two new affiliate members.

**Social Report:** Berit announced the food for the April meeting will be Smørrebrød (open-faced sandwiches).

**Scandinavian Viking Festival:** March 28 will be our Viking festival held at the Scottsdale United Methodist church on Miller Rd. Jan Loomis has spent \$50 on a Facebook ad. We need more flyers and ads in newspapers and local RV parks. We need email distribution to our members as well as having our members share our Facebook page. The \$10 admission is for the Ole andLena show which is separate from the vendors and food suppliers. Jonathan is in charge of the Vendor registration. It was recommended by Nina that we have food vendors where people could eat something onsite. We could ask Shannon to have a food for sale table. Jana reported that rømmegrøt sold for \$3 per cup at another event.

**District Six Convention:** The convention dates were announced; June 18-21 at the Sheraton Wrigleyville Hotel in Mesa, AZ. Desert Fjord's approved list of delegates and alternates must be submitted by April 15. Jan Loomis will be a delegate as well as parliamentarian for the event. Janis Johnson and Jonathan agreed to be delegates. Phyllis Bergo agreed to be an alternate and will find someone to fill the fourth delegate needed as well as additional alternates.

#### **New Business:**

- Our Syttende Mai parade and picnic may need to be held at another location due to the lack of space at the Railroad Park. Jonathan will work with the Norwegians Worldwide organization.
- Jan Loomis will remove our disconnected phone number from the website.
- We'll maintain our Sunday meetings at the present time and location and not change to a Saturday.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:37 pm with a motion by Jan and seconded by Janis.

## A Recipe for you to try:

Drengsuppe a traditional Sámi stew

(reindeer, other game meat or beef with root vegetables and oatmeal)

# Kjøttsuppe med havregryn

(Meat Stew with Oatmeal)

### Ingredients:

3 strips bacon, cut into 1-inch pieces

2 lbs. beef chuck or venison, cut into 2-inch chunks

1 large onion, chopped

3 carrots, peeled and chopped

2 small celery root, peeled and chopped

6 cups beef stock or water

2-3 medium russet potatoes

½ cup rolled oats

1 cup frozen green peas

A few hours before cooking, cut the meat into 2-inch chunks and season generously with salt, and refrigerate. About 30 minutes before cooking, set out meat at room temperature to warm up a bit.

In a 5-quart pot or Dutch oven, cook bacon until the fat renders and the bacon becomes crispy. Remove the bacon to a paper-towel lined plate and leave the bacon fat in the pot (add vegetable oil if you need more fat).

In two or three batches, sear the beef cubes until browned on all sides. Set aside. Sauté the onion, carrots, and celery root until the onions turn translucent. Add the beef chunks back into the pot, and add 6 cups of beef stock or water. Cover, bring to a boil, and reduce to simmer. Cook for 1.5 hours or so. Add the potatoes and oatmeal, and cook for another 20 minutes or so, until the potatoes are fork-tender, and the meat is fully cooked.

Garnish with reserved bacon and green peas for a bit of color. Serve with flatbread or lefse, if desired.

Like all good things, this stew tastes even better with a day of rest in the fridge.

## **Ceremonial Order Circa 1984**

(Re-printed from the first issue of the first newsletter for Desert Fjord Lodge, November 1984.)

At our first meeting you may have wondered what was that all about? Well, as with most fraternal societies, Sons of Norway observes certain procedures as proper contact during the lodge meetings. The purpose of these procedures is to provide order and dignity to the meetings and ceremonies. Careful observance of these procedures is encouraged.

- 1. To gain admittance to the lodge room after the meeting has started, the member raps lightly on the inner door. The guard will open the door and the member gives the guard the password. The member will then be permitted to enter the lodge room whereupon he advances to the back center of the room and salutes the president with the sign of the order. The president answers with the same and then the member may be seated.
- 2. When any member visits another lodge and arrives after the opening of the meeting, he follows the same procedures except he informs the guard of his name and the name and number of his lodge.
- 3. In the event a member arrives after the opening of the meeting and has forgotten the password, the guard upon the order of the lodge president shall inform a member of the password after the member has presented satisfactory proof of membership.
- 4. If a member wishes to retire from the lodge room during the meeting, he advances before the Vice President and salutes with a sign of the order. If there is no objection to the member leaving the room the Vice President will answer with the same sign.
- 5. If the member wishes to cross from one side of the hall to the other during the meeting, he must first obtain permission of the President by advancing and saluting. When the President returns the salute, the member may proceed.
- 6. Out of respect for the office of the President no one shall pass between the center table and the President, except when necessary during ceremonial activities.
- 7. If a member wishes to gain recognition to speak, he rises, salutes the President with a sign of the order, and says "Brother (Sister) President." When the President recognizes the member, he may then speak.
- 8. Officers and members should address each other as sister and brothers during meetings and closed ceremonies of the lodge.

The above excerpt was read at Desert Fjord's Heritage and Cultural meeting last November when we celebrated the lodge's 35th Anniversary. One of our members requested that we include this in the newsletter and we think that's a good idea. This gives you some sense of how far we've come over this time. We have some order and ceremony today, but nothing at all like this! It's shared for your enjoyment but also for your appreciation of our lodge's history.


