

## Co-President's Column

Established 1984

We are celebrating the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of Sons of Norway (SON) this year. However, like most of our other celebrations during this time of COVID, the celebration is primarily virtual. The timing is almost ironic as the founding fathers of (SON) came together during a time of chaos to create an organization, comprised of Norwegian families and friends, that would take care of members during hardships. Many of our ancestors arrived from Norway in the 1880's and 1890's, just before the financial panic of 1893 occurred in the United States. Eighteen Norwegian immigrants living in Minneapolis were from Trondheim. They were familiar with a program in Trondheim where families made a small weekly financial contribution and the pooled



funds were used to help those families who had un-planned needs. This model was quickly adopted, and Sons of Norway was founded.

A group of Norwegian men (our founding fathers) met to determine a means to protect one another and their families. Many of these men originated from Trondheim, where in exchange for a small weekly fee, members were given access to medical care. The immigrants built on this idea and started to develop Sons of Norway.

The purposes and goals of the Founders were to protect members of Sons of Norway and their families from the financial hardships experienced during times of sickness or death in the family. Over time, Sons of Norway's mission has expanded to include the preservation of Norwegian bers! People have visited our web site and the heritage and culture in our Society. 
# LIBRARY CORNER

A Book Review by Jan Johnson

This is an electrifying work of literary suspense from international bestseller author Katrine Engberg. A young woman is discovered brutally murdered in her own apartment with an intricate pattern of lines carved into her face. Copenhagen police detectives Korner and Werner are assigned to the crime. Very soon, they establish a connection between the victim and her alcoholic landlady who is writing a novel. The murder mystery story line of the novel parallels



real life. The detectives must dig more deeply into the women's past. They need to discover the identity of the brutal puppet master pulling strings in this heart-stopping thriller.

(A former dancer and choreographer with a background in television and theater, Katrine Engberg launched a groundbreaking career as a novelist with the publication of her fiction debut, **The Tenant**. She is now one of the most widely read and beloved crime authors in Denmark. Her work has been sold in over twenty-five countries. She lives with her family in Copenhagen.)



Desert Fjord lodge members make a difference in the world by involvement in community service projects.




(this is a story for those of us who have learned to be diligent about hand washing)
