

The Scandinavian Spirit!

New Nordic cuisine has taken the trendy restaurants of the world by storm in recent years, so more and more people are being introduced to the Scandinavian spirit. The name is derived from the Latin *aqua vitae*, or water of life. Aquavit is a flavored spirit that has been produced in the Nordic countries since the 15th century. The flavor comes from the spices and herbs, which can vary, but the main flavoring must be from caraway or dill in order to be termed aquavit, according to European Union rules.

Don Johnson will speak about the history of home-made aquavit and how to keep warm in Trondheim, Norway: the story of one-toe and three-fingered Ole Olmquest, master lumberjack and aquavit maker "It was a cold, wet, rainy morning in Trondheim with a Nor'Easter blowing in from the west. Ole knew what that meant to logging that day.....double Aquavit for the men....and why Aquavit was so important" — So sit back and listen to the rest of the story.......First, what is Aquavit?

Sons of Norway Foundation

The SON Foundation is a separate entity established by SON in 1966 and dedicated to preserving and promoting Norwegian heritage and culture as well as providing various forms of assistance to our members, lodges and communities.



The SON Foundation's largest area is the granting of various scholarships for many different areas of education. The Foundation issues scholarships through 14 different types of educational scholarship programs. These vary from regular college to apprenticeship and vocational schooling opportunities. The scholarships are usually available to students who are members of SON, children or grandchildren of SON members. Listings of these various scholarships are available on the SON website in the Foundation section. There are scholarships for students who attend college in Norway and there are even Camperships for kids across the United States to attend Norwegian cultural camps.

The other major area of the Foundation are the six categories of grants. Three of the grant types are for Heritage and Cultural funding and three are for individual funding grants. Heritage and Cultural grants rules and guidelines are available in the Foundation section of the SON website. Individual grants can be Helping Hands grants for Children, for Medical Relief or Disaster Relief. These Helping Hands grants are for SON members and their families who are in times of need.

The SON Foundation is a 501 (c) (3) tax exempt entity. There are two basic contribution types, there is a form on the SON website in the Foundation section under Donate on the left margin. There are also Legacy gift procedures on the form with a contact person and phone number for information on Legacy gifts.



A Book Review by Jan Johnson

The Demon of Dakar

In The Demon of Dakar, Ann Lindell and her motley crew of colleagues are faced with a most baffling murder case in which all clues lead straight back to a popular local restaurant named Dakar. The owner, Slobodan Andersson, has some shady connections in his past, and his partner's reputation is equally murky.

The kitchen crew is not above suspicion, either. The meat chef is an oddball, to say the least, while unbeknownst to the rest, the newest hire's personal life is a tangled web of lies. Even Eva Willman, the seemingly blameless older woman returning to the workforce as a waitress, has skeletons in her closet. And then the tension rachets up a number of notches as it becomes apparent that one murder has not satisfied the killer in the least. If Ann is to prevent a bloodbath at Restaurant Dakar, she must match wits with a killer whose motives are seemingly completely obscure.

Born 1953 in Uppsala, Kjell Eriksson is a Swedish writer, author of the detective chief inspector Ann Lindell crime novels. Shining Path, the first of the Lindell series, was named Best First Novel of 1999 by the Swedish Crime Academy. The Princess of Burundi, fourth in the series, was awarded the Swedish Crime Writers' Academy Best Swedish Crime Novel Award in 2002. Open Grave, published in 2009, was the tenth and final novel in the series. Currently only eight Lindell novels are available in English, though St. Martin's Press has the rights to the whole series.

Original Nordic Folk Music from Copenhagen at the

Musical Instrument Museum in Phoenix Monday, October 9 at 7:00 pm

New York, NY: September 18, 2023 -- Dreamers' Circus is an award-winning trio of remarkable, classically-trained Scandinavian musicians whose original Nordic folk music is infused with jazz, pop and classical sensibilities. The trio comes to the Musical Instrument Museum (MIM) in Phoenix on Monday, October 9 at 7:00 pm. For tickets and venue information, visit the MIM website.

The trio, based in Copenhagen, are hugely popular and critically acclaimed in Denmark. They made their London debut this summer at Kings Place. They have taken home five Danish Music Awards and were named 2023 Artist of the Year by the Danish national classical radio channel P2 (the first non-classical group to earn that honor). Their official line-up is fiddle, cittern and piano/accordion, but collectively, they also play ukelele, guitar, keyboard/ synthesizer, kannel (a Northern-European box zither), and clog fiddle (a Swedish instrument made from a wooden clog), among others.

The trio says, "We think of Dreamers' Circus as a group of friendly musical disruptors! The various strands and traditions that form the roots of the remarkable variety of American music inspire us, and we love coming across the Atlantic to celebrate those traditions and introduce (or re-introduce) some of our own tunes from the Nordic countries. We've got some new music and some very old music to share with you. Looking forward!'

Swedish multi-instrumentalist **Ale Carr** (cittern) is recognized as one of the leading players of plucked string instruments in Nordic folk music today. He has won five Danish Music Awards in addition to the ones he earned with Dreamers' Circus and appeared this summer at the BBC Proms at Royal Albert Hall with The Deutsche Kammerphilharmonie Bremen. **Nikolaj Busk** (piano/accordion) is a composer and pianist who grew up on traditional Danish songs as well as Louis Armstrong and the Beatles before being "adopted," as he puts it, by folk music. Violinist **Rune Tonsgaard Sørensen** is probably best known to US audiences as violinist in the Danish String Quartet, which just released PRISM V on ECM records. Lesser known fact: Rune also studied church organ and was formerly concertmaster of the Copenhagen Philharmonic.



A Proclamation on Leif Erikson Day, 2023

It is believed that, roughly a millennium ago, Leif Erikson and his crew became the first Europeans to set foot in North America. These Norse explorers boldly charted new paths that would inspire adventurers for centuries to come. With bravery, optimism, and tireless effort, Leif Erikson embodied many of the same traits that future generations of Danes, Finns, Icelanders, Norwegians, and Swedes would weave into the fabric of America's story. This Leif Erikson Day, we join together to honor the heritage of our Nordic communities and celebrate all they have done to strengthen our country.

Throughout our Nation's history, countless Nordic immigrants have come to America – many with little more than the hope in their hearts. Motivated by the promise of possibilities and the search for the American Dream, these families packed up their lives on distant shores to build new homes here. Establishing communities across our Nation, Nordic Americans have contributed so much to our society. Nordic migrants helped lay our country's foundations by fighting for liberty in our Armed Forces; establishing churches, schools, and businesses; and playing essential roles in the labor movement. And as public servants, doctors, engineers, entrepreneurs, community leaders, and so much more, Nordic Americans continue to push our Nation ever forward, enriching every part of American life.

Today, my Administration also reaffirms our strong relations with Nordic nations and their people. Grounded in our shared values of democracy, freedom, and justice, America is working with our Nordic partners to take on our greatest challenges. We are collaborating to address the climate crisis by increasing opportunity and investments in emerging technologies. And we are working together to preserve a free and open Indo-Pacific and to provide security and humanitarian assistance to the people of Ukraine as they defend themselves against Russia's brutal invasion. In service of these missions, last year, the Untied States supported the ratification process for Finland to join NATO – culminating in the fastest ratification period in modern history. We continue to fully support Sweden's membership in our alliance. Our nations are stronger together, and we will continue working with these capable and committed partners.

This Leif Erikson Day, we celebrate the tremendous contributions of Nordic Americans to our Nation. Most of all, we rededicate ourselves to the American spirit of adventure embodied in Leif Erikson's journey roughly a millennium ago. Let us continue to pursue bravely principles of liberty, equality, and justice so all people in our country can achieve the American Dream.

To honor Leif Erikson, son of Iceland and grandson of Norway, and to celebrate Nordic-American heritage, the Congress, by joint resolution (Public Law 88-566) approved on September 2, 1964, has authorized the President of the United States to proclaim October 9th of each year as "Leif Erikson Day."

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSEPH R. BIDEN JR, President of the United States of America, do hereby proclaim October 9, 2023, as Leif Erikson Day. I call upon all Americans to celebrate the contributions of Nordic Americans to our Nation with appropriate ceremonies, activities, and programs.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand this sixth day of October, in the year of our Lord two thousand twenty-three, and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred and forty-eighth.


