








Between Rocks and Hard Places

What do you like best about being a member of Sons of Norway?

I'd like to revisit Bergen sometime and also go to Sogn og Fjordane – my grandfather's parents were from a small town there, Davik.

Do you have a favorite Scandinavian food?

My favorite Scandinavian food would have to be lefse. Whether eaten simply with butter and brown sugar or if it's part of a more elaborate meal of lutefisk, meatballs and potatoes, there's something wonderful about this food. It conjures up memories of family holiday meals. My aunt and grandmother would make lefse on the farm on the woodstove. Whether it comes off the woodstove or the lefse grill, it's a Norwegian comfort food. Delicious!
