

Ms Huhtaluhta has performed in both Tucson's **Meet Yourself** and the **Tucson Folk Festival**. She's had other engagements in Tucson and Phoenix and also internationally. She was a highlighted performer at the famous **Music Festival** in Kaustinen, Finland.



Marvin Todacheenie is a world-renowned Native flute player from Arizona. He grew up in the tradition of the Navajo/Dine' people, where he learned from his grandfather to design and make traditional flutes. Marvin shares the songs and music of his native culture on his flutes. Marvin and Kathi Huhtaluhta together create a dynamic duo ... blending both their indigenous styles to create a spiritual, cultural



experience. They collaborated on the album "Ela, Tannsia, Laula".

Kathi and Marvin were invited to perform in the opening ceremonies with the prestigious **USA Finnfest** in Sault Ste Marie, Canada as well as with the **USA Finnfest** in Tucson, Arizona, in 2012. They've been invited to perform with Finnish and Nordic Festivals in Washington and Oregon, as well as with "Friends of Finns" in Phoenix and the Finnish American Club in Tucson.



Into Thin Air

In Norway's frozen north, it's not just secrets that are buried...



When nineteen-year-old Iselin Hanssen disappears during a run in a popular hiking area in Bodø, Northern Norway, suspicion quickly falls on her boyfriend. For investigator Jakob Weber, the case seems clear-cut, almost unexceptional, even though there is some suggestion that Iselin lived parts of her life beneath the radar of both family and friends.

But events take a dramatic turn when another woman disappears in similar circumstances – this time on the island of Røst, miles off the Norwegian coast, in the wild ocean.

Rumours that a killer is on the loose begin to spread, terrifying the local population and leading to wild conspiracies. But then Jakob discovers that this isn't the first time that young women have vanished without a trace in the region, and it becomes clear that someone is hiding something ... and another murderous spree may have just begun

He has worked in the Defense Ministry and is now a departmental manager in the Norwegian Directorate for Civil Protection. Crown Prince Haakon's Visit to Luther College October 6, 2025

When I heard that the Crown Prince of Norway was coming to Luther College to celebrate 200 years of Norwegian emigration to the US, I was very excited, because I was just in Norway over the Summer, and now I got to be a part of history.

On the day of his visit, I attended the dedication ceremony of The Royal Family Samlingshall at the Vesterheim museum. There, I wore my Norwegian sweater with pride and got to see the Prince as he made his grand entrance for his speech. My friend Julie was wearing her Bunad, and we both got compliments on our attire by members of the entourage walking by. We were even interviewed by the Iowa Public Radio, along with being photographed several times by all the press.

Prince Haakon was very personable, and after his speech, he made his way around the Vesterheim street fair, shaking hands and talking to everyone (me included!). I enjoyed seeing everyone's Norwegian pride as they waved flags and cheered while he walked by. It made me feel proud of my own Norwegian heritage, and happy that I could be at Luther during this historic moment.

After the Vesterheim celebration, I made my way back to campus to sing in Norskkor, the first-year Tenor/Bass choir, for the Prince's arrival. Past and present members of Norskkor gathered to sing "Oh Sing Jubilee" – the Norskkor anthem – outside on the lawn as the Prince walked by. After singing, I got my trumpet and gathered with my trumpet studio ensemble to play a couple of fanfares as the Prince entered the Center for Faith and Life, where he gave the Convocation speech.

In the Convocation speech, Prince Haakon reflected on 200 years of emigration from Norway to the US, and about his own experience coming to the US to go to college in Berkeley, California. He expressed his gratitude for The US being a place where anyone can come to make a life for themselves. One major point he made is that the essence of a free society is the courage to exchange ideas without fear. This is what he feels strengthens Norway's relationship with the US. It made me very hopeful for the future of Luther, and for my education in a proud Norwegian community.





Viking Voyager and

Single Premium Whole Life

(for the grandkids)



In my last article I talked about a Christmas gift of a Life Insurance policy for your Grandkids and Great Grandkids and the reasons why it's a good idea to do so. I referred to a Viking Voyager policy and a Single Premium Whole Life policy. Here's a sample of what the cost of each is.

Viking Voyager, issues age 0 to 17.

Age Face Amount Premium Age Face amount Premium

•	0	\$10,000	\$362	0	\$25,000	\$504
•	5	\$10,000	\$341	5	\$25,000	\$477
•	10	\$10,000	\$326	10	\$25,000	\$475

These are one time premiums and coverage goes until age 26 at which time they can convert to a Whole Life policy.

The <u>Single Premium</u> policy, the minimum premium is \$2,000, payable one time. Here are two examples:

Age Face Amount Premium {Male} Age Face Amount Premium {female}

•	0	\$12,022	\$2,000	0	\$13,096	\$2,000
•	5	\$10,840	\$2000	5	\$11,692	\$2,000

This policy accumulates cash values and the face amount increases.
