

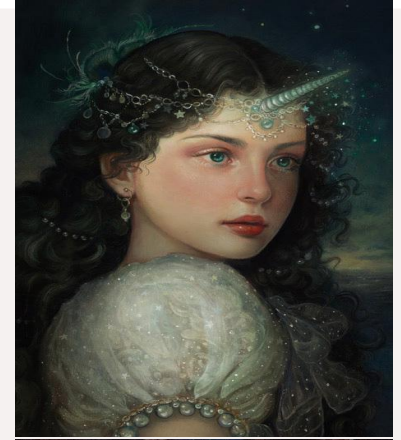

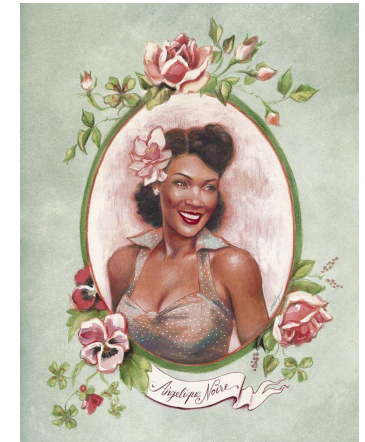
Maly Siri

These sketches are concentrated on some of the ideas for future projects.

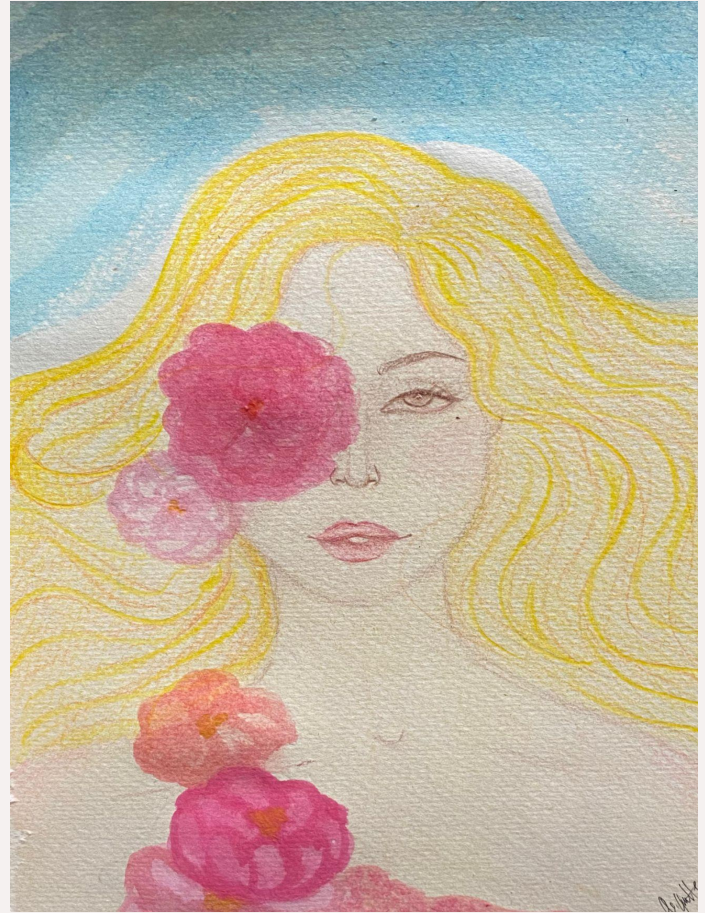
They also focus on my mistakes and how practicing and trying to perfect your mistakes makes you better.

Pink 50'

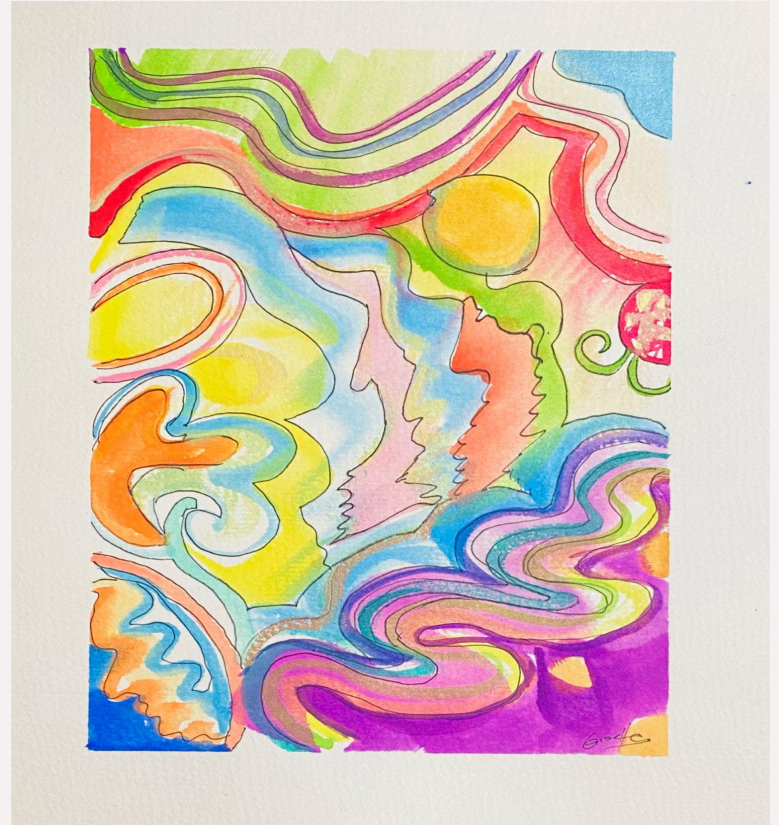

Out of Line

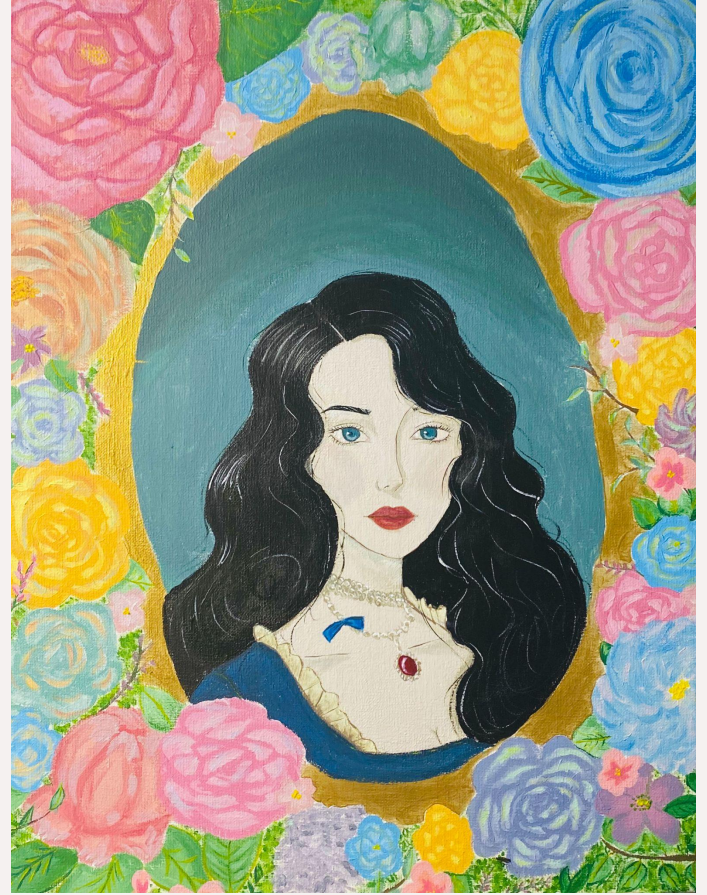

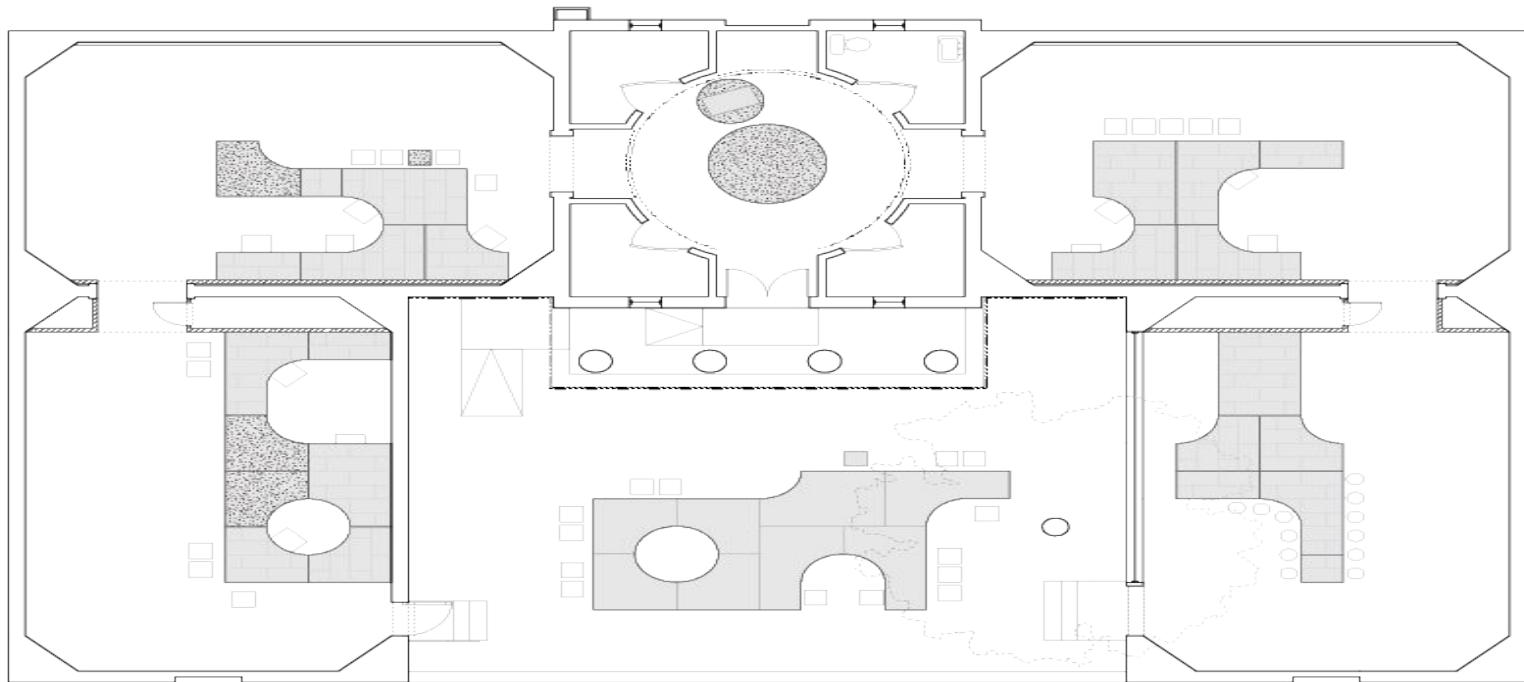

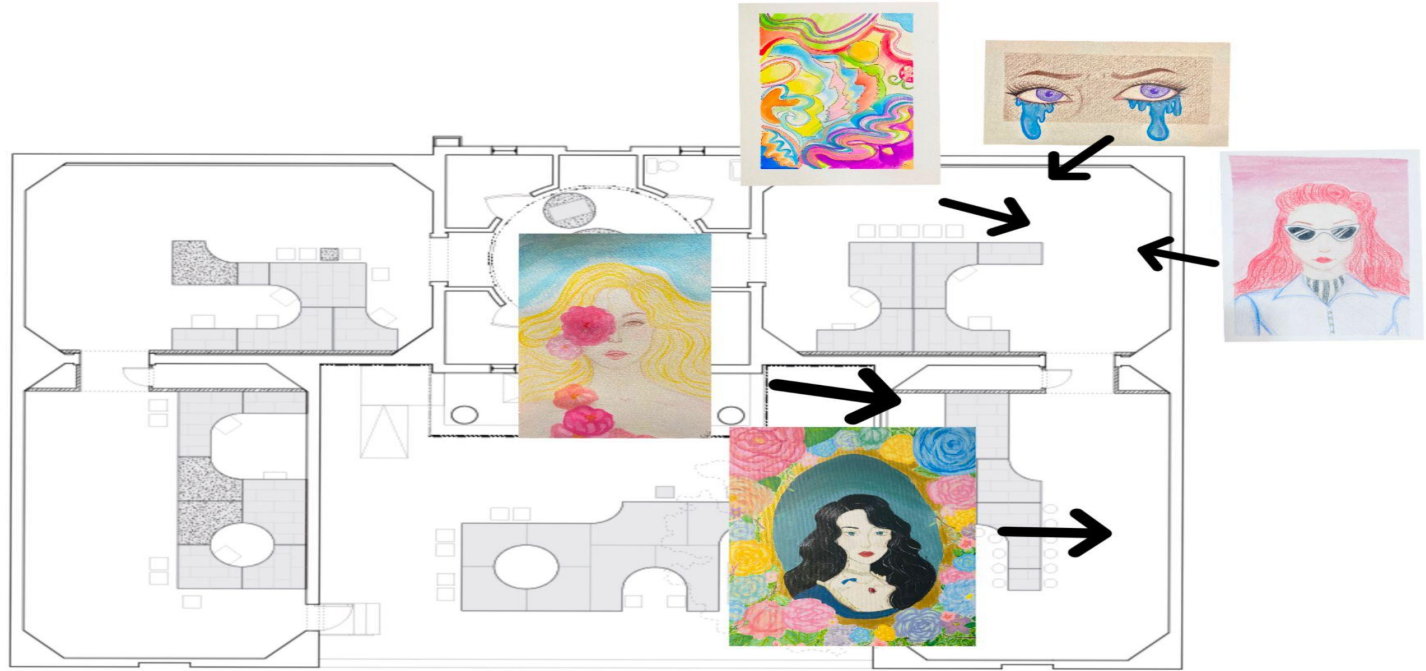
Flower of Primetemps

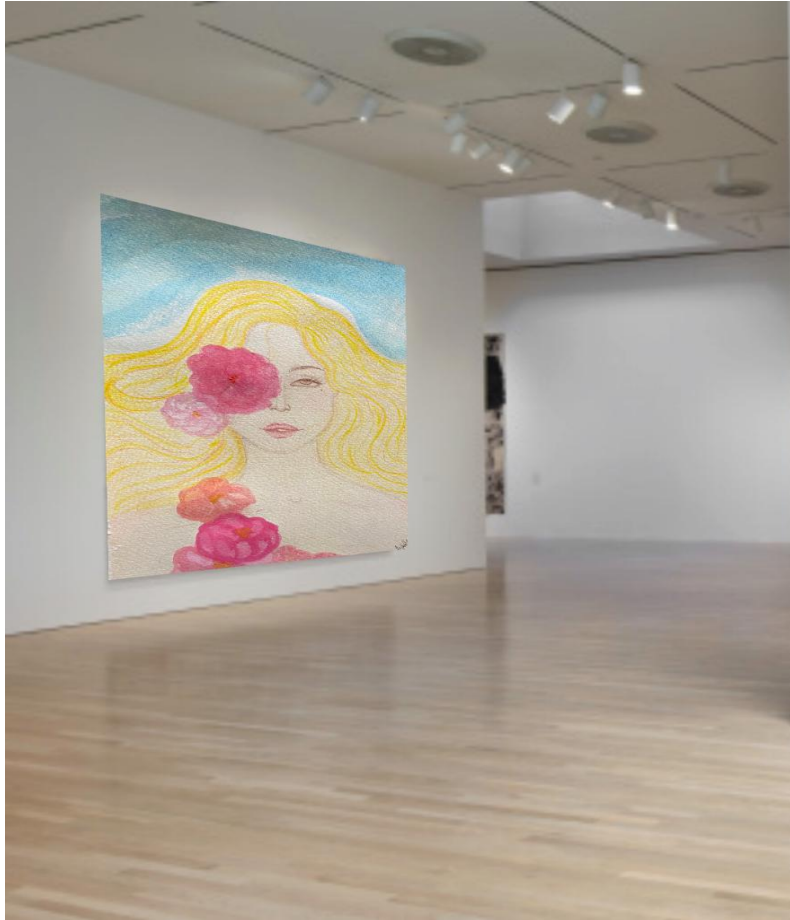


Exhibition layout
