I have had several inquiries as to Spring Gatherings. I feel that you should go ahead and plan your Gatherings using the necessary precautions. The Northwest Minnesota synod is so large and each area is dealing with COVID in their own ways, it is impossible to determine the if you should or should not have a Spring Gathering. If the churches in your conference are meeting, I would go by their guidelines. If you feel strongly that you do not want to meet, I understand and leave the decision to each conference.

My goals for the Northwest Synodical Women's Organization are as follows:

Communication – the board is working to contact each congregation to verify the contact information. They are also contacting inactive units to make sure that SWO information is available to them. You do not need to have an active unit in your congregation to participate in WELCA activities. We have our website Synod Women's Organization (SWO) – Northwestern Minnesota Synod, ELCA (nwmnsynod.org) and Facebook page Northwestern Minnesota Synodical Women's Organization of the ELCA | Facebook to keep you updated on WELCA activities.

Training – the board is looking into having at least one training opportunity for members and units during the year. We will communicate this activity to you when plans are finalized.

Racial Justice – we will use social media to advise you of any racial justice information we receive. I would suggest reading *Stringing Rosaries: The History, the Unforgivable, and the Healing of Northern Plains American Indian Boarding School Survivors* by Dr. Denise Lajimodiere. Watch for a review of this book in the upcoming SNOW newsletter.

Bible Study – the board presents the Gather Bible Study the 4th Monday of each month at 7PM via ZOOM. The study is for 1 hour. The next 4 sessions are by Mark Allen Powell who was a presenter at the WELCA Gathering in Minneapolis in 2017. The title is "The Kingdom of God." The 2021 Fall Conference 8 Gathering was held on Thursday, October 14th at Esther Lutheran Church, rural Parkers Prairie. After a two-year absence from meeting due to the pandemic, it felt good to be together again. Sixty women from 16 congregations attended.

The Theme was “Eagle’s Healing Nest”, with Melony Butler from “the Nest” being the guest speaker. The theme verse was Galatians 6:9 “And let us not grow weary in well-doing, for in due season we shall reap, if we do not lose heart.”

After gathering for coffee and goodies in the fellowship hall, there was a hymn sing in the sanctuary lead by Sue Ellwanger and pianist Kevin Lee.

Welcomes were given by Conference 8 Coordinator Nancy Kjeldahl and Esther Lutheran WELCA President, Luella Thom. Pastor Scott Hoecker gave a devotion entitled “What Should I Wear”?

A communion service was conducted by Pastor Rachel Stout from First Evangelical, Parkers Prairie.

Roxanne Swisher, Conference 8 Board representative was also in attendance. John Severson from Thrivent gave updated information on Thrivent Action Teams, Choice, and a new program, Money Canvas.

Her passion to help Veterans has been the driving force for the establishment of a place where veterans can find healing and wholeness. Her personal journey of helping “family” was a difficult one fueled with love. 

Book Review

Book review of *Stinging Rosaries: The History, the Unforgivable, and the Healing of Northern Plains American Indian Boarding School Survivors* by Dr. Denise K. Lajimodiere

I became familiar with this book when The NWMN Synod offered a Zoom discussion of the book with the author. This is definitely a hard read, but I feel a necessary read. We need to know what our neighbors, the Northern Plains American Indians, endured and continue to endure due to our government and religious organizations. We need to become familiar with terms such as historical trauma, intergenerational trauma, collective trauma, multigenerational trauma, and unresolved grieving. It is the story of the consequences of Richard Pratt's educational experiment designed to transform the Indian into the white man's image. His mantra was "Kill the Indian in him, save the man." These children were torn from their homes and raised with rigid, harsh military-style discipline. We need to know these stories and the human rights violations that were endured by our neighbors.

I also watched the documentary, "In the White Man's Image," which was mentioned in the book. It gives more of a background of how the boarding schools came to be. I would recommend that you watch this documentary. It is available on You-Tube.

This book tells the experience of those in the boarding schools. At times I cried, became angry, was terribly saddened, was ashamed, and just could not believe what our government put these children through. I also found it so terribly depressing and incomprehensible that so many churches engaged in this atrocity.

We need to educate ourselves regarding the suffering that Native Americans have gone through because of our government and the church. Please read this book and watch the documentary to help understand the things that have been done to our neighbors, the Native American community.


What kind of action?


