General Guidelines for OGOSS Annual Competitions

- ♣ All OGOSS students who wish to participate in the OGOSS Annual Competitions are mandatorily required to fill the online registration forms and submit the forms before 31th May 2025. For any clarifications, contact OGOSS helpdesk at (WhatsApp # 00 965 6990 5111).
- 4 All participants can register for one or more events as long as they fall within the age bracket pertaining to the event.
- → All competitions (unless otherwise specified) will be conducted as live events online on Zoom. The name of the participants will not be disclosed to the judges, instead, participants will be identified by chest numbers.
- ♣ Parents are encouraged to support their child's participation in the competitions.
- ♣ Parents should ensure that their child is well-prepared, meets competition deadlines, and follows competition rules.
- ♣ Rewards and Recognitions
 - The names of the winners will be posted on OGOSS Social Media handles.
 - All winners will receive a Digital Merit Certificate.
 - All participants will receive a Digital Participation Certificate.
 - Menorah Torchbearers Regional Overall Champions:
 - a. A Menorah Torchbearer (overall champion) will be recognized for each region and respective age category. The participant who secures the highest cumulative points in their age bracket within their region will be awarded the same.
 - b. For each competition, the following points will be awarded to the winners:

First Place 5 points Second Place: 3 points Third Place: 1 point

General Rules and Regulations for Musical Competitions

- 4 All music competitions are live events that will be held online on Zoom.
- The videos of the participant must be turned on to ensure that the participant is visible to the judge throughout the entire performance.
- ♣ No pre-recorded videos will be accepted. The participants will have to perform live before the judges.
- Mixing of Languages will not be allowed.
- Background music/ karaoke/ shruti boxes/ metronomes etc. cannot be used while singing. The use of the same would lead to disqualification.
- 4 It is recommended that the participant uses earphones/ headphones for better quality while performing.
- Any form of external assistance including prompting of lyrics will lead to disqualification of the participant.
- The judging panel will be decided by OGOSS. The decision of the Judges will be final and cannot be contested.

Action Song Competition

1. Eligibility:

- **★** The competition is open to students in the Beginners category.
- ♣ There will be no gender-based categories; both boys and girls will compete in the same competition.

2. Competition Format:

- **↓** The competition will be conducted live on Zoom.
- → Participants will be identified using assigned Chest Numbers during the competition.

3. Song Selection and Actions:

- Participants must sing a Christian song of their choice in any language (English, Malayalam, or other Native Languages).
- ♣ Along with singing, participants must perform suitable actions coordinated with the song.

4. Judging Criteria:

- ♣ Participants will be judged based on the following criteria:
 - Expressiveness: The participant's expressiveness and effectiveness of actions.
 - Vocal Impression: The feel and voice range.

- *Tune and Rhythm*: The participant's ability to maintain suitable tune and rhythm during the performance.
- *Clarity of lyrics:* The clear enunciation of lyrics.

5. Time Limit:

- **♣** Each participant will be allotted 3 minutes for their performance.
- ♣ A triple stroke bell will signal the end of the three-minute time limit.
- ♣ Participants must ensure they do not exceed the 3-minute limit, as 2 marks will be deducted immediately after the participant exceeds the 3-minute limit and 1 mark will be deducted of every subsequent minute.

6. Participant Identification:

♣ Each participant will be assigned a unique Chest Number for identification during the competition.

7. Competition Setup:

- **♣** The competition will be conducted live over Zoom.
- ♣ Participants are responsible for ensuring a stable internet connection and suitable technology for participation.

English Solo Singing Competition

1. Eligibility:

- → The competition is open to students in the Primary, Juniors, Intermediate & Seniors Categories.
- ♣ There will be no gender-based categories for Primary and Juniors Categories; both boys and girls will compete in the same competition.
- **↓** There will be 2 gender-based categories for Intermediate and Senior Categories; boys and girls will compete in separate competitions.

2. Competition Format:

- **↓** The competition will be conducted live on Zoom.
- ♣ Participants will be identified using assigned Chest Numbers during the competition.

3. Song Selection:

- **♣** Participants must sing a Christian song in English.
- Singing a Christian song in any other language for this competition will lead to disqualification.
- ♣ Singing a liturgical/ sacramental Hymn- in any language will lead to disqualification.
- ♣ Singing a non-Christian (secular) song in any language will lead to disqualification.

4. Judging Criteria:

- **♣** Participants will be judged based on the following criteria:
 - **Vocal Impression**: The feel and voice range.
 - *Tune and Rhythm*: The participant's ability to maintain suitable tune and rhythm during the performance.
 - *Clarity of lyrics:* The clear enunciation of lyrics.
 - Intonation and Tone

5. Time Limit:

- **4** Each participant will be allotted 3 minutes for their performance.
- ♣ A triple stroke bell will signal the end of the three-minute time limit.
- ♣ Participants must ensure they do not exceed the 3-minute limit, as 2 marks will be deducted

immediately after the participant exceeds the 3-minute limit and 1 mark will be deducted of every subsequent minute.

6. Participant Identification:

Leach participant will be assigned a unique Chest Number for identification during the competition.

7. Competition Setup:

- **★** The competition will be conducted live over Zoom.
- ♣ Participants are responsible for ensuring a stable internet connection and suitable technology for participation.

Native Language Solo Singing Competition

1. Eligibility:

- → The competition is open to students in the Primary, Juniors, Intermediate & Seniors Categories.
- ♣ There will be no gender-based categories for Primary and Juniors Categories; both boys and girls will compete in the same competition.
- **↓** There will be 2 gender-based categories for Intermediate and Senior Categories; boys and girls will compete in separate competitions.

2. Competition Format:

- **↓** The competition will be conducted live on Zoom.
- → Participants will be identified using assigned Chest Numbers during the competition.

3. Song Selection:

- ♣ Participants must sing a Christian song in a Native Language of their choice.
- ♣ Singing a Christian song in English for this competition will lead to disqualification.
- ♣ Singing a Liturgical/ Sacramental Hymn- in any language will lead to disqualification.
- ♣ Singing a non-Christian (secular) song in any language will lead to disqualification.

4. Judging Criteria:

- ♣ Participants will be judged based on the following criteria:
 - *Vocal Impression*: The feel and voice range.
 - *Tune and Rhythm*: The participant's ability to maintain suitable tune and rhythm during the performance.
 - *Clarity of lyrics:* The clear enunciation of lyrics.
 - Intonation and Tone

5. Time Limit:

- **Leach** Each participant will be allotted 3 minutes for their performance.
- ♣ A triple stroke bell will signal the end of the three-minute time limit.
- ♣ Participants must ensure they do not exceed the 3-minute limit, as 2 marks will be deducted immediately after the participant exceeds the 3-minute limit and 1 mark will be deducted of every subsequent minute.

Liturgical Solo Singing Competition

1. Eligibility:

- **↓** The competition is open to students in the Beginners, Primary, Juniors, Intermediate & Seniors Categories.
- ♣ There will be no gender-based categories for Beginners, Primary and Juniors Categories; both boys and girls will compete in the same competition.
- ♣ There will be 2 gender-based categories for Intermediate and Senior Categories; boys and girls will compete in separate competitions.

2. Competition Format:

- **↓** The competition will be conducted live on Zoom.
- ♣ Participants will be identified using assigned Chest Numbers during the competition.

3. Hymn Selection:

- ♣ Participants must sing one of the hymns from the choices given below for their respective categories.
- ♣ Participants are free to sing the hymn in English, Malayalam, or Hindi.
- ♣ No additional resources e.g.: videos/ audio recordings of the specified hymn will be provided by OGOSS.

Beginners	One of the following Hymns sung during the Sleeba Namaskaaram Maathru vishudha smruthi sambantham (Bovuso of Mar Jacob) OR Jananee parishudha prarthanayal nadha (Bovuso of Mar Balai)
Primary	One of the following Hymns sung during the service of Hossana (Ooshana) Oliveenthal thalakal eduth ooshana OR Yerushalemile vanmalamel
Juniors	One of the following Hymns sung during the service of Easter (Uyirpu) Oh, Mariyaame njan OR Jaathikale Modhippin
Intermediate	One of the following Hymns sung during the service of Christmas (Yeldho) Shishuvay Swayame velivaayi OR Aaralavu Varnnipaan bethalahemil
Seniors	One of the following hymns sung during the service of the Holy Theotokos (Shoonoyo Perunaal) Indiayil nin enganne yerushalem OR Bhagyavathee mruthiyalakasam

4. Judging Criteria:

♣ Participants will be judged based on the following criteria:

- *Vocal Impression*: The feel and voice range.
- *Tune and Rhythm*: The participant's ability to maintain suitable tune and rhythm during the performance.
- *Clarity of lyrics:* The clear enunciation of lyrics.
- Intonation and Tone

5. Time Limit:

- ♣ Each participant will be allotted 3 minutes for their performance. Hence, the number of stanzas for the big hymns should be chosen accordingly, as per the given time limit.
- ♣ A triple stroke bell will signal the end of the three-minute time limit.
- ▶ Participants must ensure they do not exceed the 3-minute limit, as 2 marks will be deducted immediately after the participant exceeds the 3-minute limit and 1 mark will be deducted of every subsequent minute.

6. Participant Identification:

♣ Each participant will be assigned a unique Chest Number for identification during the competition.

7. Competition Setup:

- **★** The competition will be conducted live over Zoom.
- ♣ Participants are responsible for ensuring a stable internet connection and suitable technology for participation.

Instrumental Solo Competition

1. Eligibility:

- **↓** The competition is open to students in the Primary, Juniors, Intermediate & Seniors Categories.
- ♣ There will be no gender based categories; both boys and girls will compete in the same competition.

2. Competition Format:

- **↓** The competition will be conducted live on Zoom.
- ♣ The participant along with their instruments should be clearly visible to the judges.
- ♣ Participants will be identified using assigned Chest Numbers during the competition.

3. Song Selection:

- ♣ Participants must play a Christian song of their choice.
- ♣ Playing a non-Christian (secular) song will lead to disqualification.
- ♣ Singing and/or accompanying tracks are not allowed and will lead to immediate disqualification.

4. Judging Criteria:

- ♣ Participants will be judged based on the following criteria:
 - Rhythm
 - Chords/ Complexity
 - Clarity of Tone
 - Intonation and Notes

5. Time Limit:

- **Leach** Each participant will be allotted 3 minutes for their performance.
- ♣ A triple stroke bell will signal the end of the three-minute time limit.
- Participants must ensure they do not exceed the 3-minute limit, as 2 marks will be deducted immediately after the participant exceeds the 3-minute limit and 1 mark will be deducted of every subsequent minute.

6. Participant Identification:

♣ Each participant will be assigned a unique Chest Number for identification during the competition.

7. Competition Setup:

- **↓** The competition will be conducted live over Zoom.
- **♣** Participants are responsible for ensuring a stable internet connection and suitable technology for participation.

- 4 All elocution competitions are live events that will be held online on Zoom.
- The videos of the participant must be turned on to ensure that the participant is visible to the judge throughout the entire performance.
- ♣ No pre-recorded videos will be accepted. The participants will have to perform live before the judges.
- It is recommended that the participant uses earphones/ headphones for better wie quality while performing.
- Any form of external assistance including prompting will lead to disqualification of the participant.
- The judging panel will be decided by OGOSS. The decision of the Judges will be final and cannot be contested.

Christian Character Carnival Competition

1. Eligibility:

- **★** The competition is open to students in the Beginners category.
- ♣ There will be no gender-based categories; both boys and girls will compete in the same competition.

2. Competition Format:

- ♣ The competition will be conducted live on Zoom.
- ♣ Participants will be identified using assigned Chest Numbers during the competition.

3. Character Selection:

♣ Participants must dress up (in advance) as characters of the Bible pertaining to the given topic.

Topic for Beginners: Parables come alive.

(Dress as characters from a parable told by Jesus)

- ♣ Along with being dressed up as the character, participants must say at least one sentence describing the character they have dressed up as. E.g.: "I am the Wise Builder. I built my house on the rock!" "I am the Mustard Seed. I may be small, but I grow with God!"
- ♣ Participants are free to perform in any language of their choice.

4. Judging Criteria:

- ♣ Participants will be judged based on the following criteria:
 - Appearance
 - Speech Delivery (Expression and Voice Modulation)
 - Clarity
 - Promptness

5. Time Limit:

- ≠ Each participant will be allotted 1 minute and 30 seconds for their performance.
- ♣ A triple stroke bell will signal the end of the 1 minute and 30 second time limit.
- ♣ Participants must ensure they do not exceed the time limit, as 2 marks will be deducted immediately after the participant exceeds the 1 minute and 30 second limit and 1 mark will be deducted of every subsequent minute.

6. Participant Identification:

Leach participant will be assigned a unique Chest Number for identification during the competition.

7. Competition Setup:

- **★** The competition will be conducted live over Zoom.
- ♣ Participants are responsible for ensuring a stable internet connection and suitable technology for participation.

Christian Character Description Competition

1. Eligibility:

- **4** The competition is open to students in the Primary and Junior categories.
- **↓** There will be no gender-based categories; both boys and girls will compete in the same competition.

2. Competition Format:

- **↓** The competition will be conducted live on Zoom.
- ♣ Participants will be identified using assigned Chest Numbers during the competition.

3. Character Selection:

♣ Participants must dress up (in advance) as characters of the Bible pertaining to the given topic.

Topic for Primary: Children in the Bible

(eg: Samuel -as a child in the temple, the boy with five loaves and two fish, Jairus's daughter, Miriam-as a girl)

Topic for Juniors: Great Leaders of the Bible

(Moses, Joshua, Nehemiah, Deborah, Esther, King David, Solomon)

- ♣ Along with being dressed up as the character, participants must say at least one verse with Bible reference related to the character they have dressed up as.
- ♣ Participants are free to perform in any language of their choice.

4. Judging Criteria:

- ♣ Participants will be judged based on the following criteria:
 - Appearance
 - Speech Delivery (Expression and Voice Modulation)
 - Clarity
 - Promptness

5. Time Limit:

- ♣ Each participant will be allotted 2 minutes and 30 seconds for their performance.
- ♣ A triple stroke bell will signal the end of the 2 minutes and 30 seconds time limit.
- ▶ Participants must ensure they do not exceed the time limit, as 2 marks will be deducted immediately after the participant exceeds the 2 minutes and 30 second limit and 1 mark will be deducted of every subsequent minute.

6. Participant Identification:

♣ Each participant will be assigned a unique Chest Number for identification during the competition.

7. Competition Setup:

- **★** The competition will be conducted live over Zoom.
- ♣ Participants are responsible for ensuring a stable internet connection and suitable technology for participation.

Story Telling Competition

1. Eligibility:

- **↓** The competition is open to students in the Beginners and Primary categories.
- ♣ There will be no gender-based categories; both boys and girls will compete in the same competition.

2. Competition Format:

- **★** The competition will be conducted live on Zoom.
- ♣ Participants will be identified using assigned Chest Numbers during the competition.

3. Topic Selection:

♣ Participants must prepare their stories based on the topics given below:

Topic for Beginners: God Provides

(eg: Manna in the wilderness, the widow's oil, feeding of Elijah by ravens etc.)

Topic for Primary: A Prayer that Changed Everything

(eg: Hannah's prayer for a child, Elijah on Mount Carmel, etc.)

◆ Participants are free to narrate the story in English/ Hindi/ Malayalam.

4. Judging Criteria:

- **♣** Participants will be judged based on the following criteria:
 - Content
 - Voice Modulation
 - Presentation
 - Language

5. Time Limit:

- ♣ Each participant will be allotted 3 minutes and 30 seconds for their performance.
- ♣ A triple stroke bell will signal the end of the 3 minutes and 30 seconds time limit.
- → Participants must ensure they do not exceed the time limit, as 2 marks will be deducted immediately after the participant exceeds the 3 minutes and 30 second limit and 1 mark will be deducted of every subsequent minute.

6. Participant Identification:

Each participant will be assigned a unique Chest Number for identification during the competition.

7. Competition Setup:

- **★** The competition will be conducted live over Zoom.
