Director's Note

"Marriage is one of the most difficult tasks two people can attempt. It takes a person's flaws and multiplies them by the expectations of their partner. The natural inclination to settle into a relationship and keep things as they are works against the inevitable life changes, like children coming along and then leaving, or job changes. These tensions and conflicts are obvious subjects for writers to explore, through drama or comedy.

Sitcom writers tend to take the easy route, and make the husbands dim-witted blowhards and the wives sarcastic harridans. The writers of "Til Beth Do Is Part" approach those stereotypes, but show that while everyday life upheavals can push us that way, they can be worked through with love. One of the reasons I wanted to direct this play was that the warmth does shine through when some minor bad decisions escalate into farcical territory. So sit back for a couple of hours and lose yourself in the story of a turning point in the marriage of Gibby and Suzannah Hayden, and how a "Southern Belle from hell" named Beth tries to pull it apart."


