BABY RAVEN AMIGURUMI PATTERN

Abbreviations used in this pattern:

★ Ch(s): Chain(s)

★ St(s): Stitch(es)

★ Sc: Single Crochet

★ Dc: Double Crochet

★ SC2TOG: Single Crochet 2 Together (Decrease)

Materials:

- ★ Black and Grey yarn
- ★ 1 pair of 12mm safety eyes
- * Stuffing
- ★ 3.5mm Hook (E-4) If you crochet loose, consider downsizing your hook or making your stitches tighter. Practice!
- * Scissors
- ★ Tapestry (yarn) Needle
- ★ (Optional: Wire brush)






Please note: This pattern is crocheted in both loops unless otherwise stated. Also, please do not worry if your end of round stitch count doesn't match mine, missing one or two stitches here and there will not affect the overall outcome of your project!

Head

- 1. Ch. 4, connect row
- 2. Sc 2 in each st (8 st)
- 3. Sc 2 in each st (16 st)
- 4. Sc 2 in every other st (24 st)
- 5. Sc 2 in every other st (36 st)
- 6. Sc the next 8 rows (36 st/round)
- 7. SC2TOG in every other st (24 st)
- 8. SC2TOG in every other st (16 st)
- SC2TOG in every other st (11 st) Tie off.



Stuff the head and set aside. (Be aware of overstuffing, if you start to see your stuffing peak through your stitches you may be overstuffing).







Body

- 1. Ch. 4, connect row
- 2. Sc 2 in each st (8 st)
- 3. Sc 2 in each st (16 st)
- 4. Sc 2 in every other st (24 st)
- 5. Sc the next 6 rows (24 st/round)
- 6. SC2TOG in every 3rd st (18 st)
- 7. SC2TOG in every 3rd st (15 st)
- 8. SC2TOG in every 3rd st (12 st)
- 9. Stuff the body!
- 10. SC2TOG in every 3rd st (9 st)
- 11. Add additional stuffing to the end as needed.
- 12. SC2TOG the next 5 st (roughly)

Tie off, tuck end. Use your hook to adjust fiber as needed.

Decide how you'd like your baby raven to be positioned and sew the head onto the body.











- 1. Ch. 4, connect row
- 2. Sc 2 in each st (8 st)
- 3. Sc 2 in each st (16 st)
- 4. Sc 2 in every other st (24 st)
- 5. Sc 2 in every other st (36 st)

Fold the circle in half and sc around the edge (sc through both halves). Make sure you fold the wing in half so that your working stitch is at an endpoint. Tie off. Repeat for the second wing.

Again, depending on the body position you've chosen, sew the wings on.



- 1. Ch. 4, connect row
- 2. Sc 2 in each st (8 st)
- 3. Sc 2 in every other st (12 st)
- 4. Sc row (12 st)

Tie off.

Repeat for the second foot, and again for the beak.

I did not stuff either of these pieces when I sewed them on, but feel free to do so if you'd like.

Make sure you use BLACK yarn to sew the pieces onto the body.
