My first monthly report as President of the Association. The financial state of Swansboro Country POA is stable, with no reason to raise assessments in the foreseeable future.

This year the plan is to follow up the removal of over 120 logging truck loads of dead trees with a Defensible Space Campaign. Working closely with the Mosquito Fire Safe Council which was revived in 2015 alongside the El Dorado County Fire Safe Council, SCPOA will be offering a "free" chipping program to all our lot owners. A signup sheet will be available on the scpoa.info website throughout the year. Those who sign up will be contacted for scheduling.

On another subject, the SCPOA Airstrip, aka the Mosquito Airport, has been inspected recently by CalTrans and has been provided with a list of compliance issues. In addition to SCPOA's maintenance crew changing some pf the markings on the runway surface, representatives of the SCPOA Board will be working with property owners along the runway to remedy these compliance issues to the satisfaction of the Law, CalTrans, and our liability insurance carrier.

The only other pressing concern that I see this year is the audit that was begun last year and is not yet completed. That report will be made public as soon as we receive it. Until the next newsletter, I hope every member is happy with his/her neighbors. Continue to be good to each other.

WOW! - Some drivers must feel like they are in the Indy 500 in regards to driving our narrow, bumpy, and winding roads. A request was made to El Dorado County to provide and install safety signs along Mosquito Road and Rock Creek Road that will alert drivers of the presence of a playground at Dyer Lake. Residents know that the playground is there, however, non-residents do not. With spring and summer approaching there will be an increase in use of the roads as people access the forest areas bordering the association. Stay tuned for the county's response.

Recently there was a a special election regarding the Mosquito Fire Protection District. The ballot measure requested the creation of a special tax. The measure required a 2/3rds yes vote to have it go into effect. The table below is from the county's website showing the results, the measure did not pass.

<u>CLOUD EGGS</u> <u>Ingredients</u>: 8 large eggs; 1 cup grated parmesan; 1/2lb chopped deli ham; salt, ground black pepper; fresh chopped chives for garnish. <u>Directions</u>: 1-Preheat oven to 450, grease large baking sheet with cooking spray. Separate egg whites and yolks placing whites in a large bowl and yolks in a small bowl. Using a whisk, or hand mixer, beat the egg whites until stiff peaks form, about 3 minutes. Gently fold in Parmesan and ham and season with salt and pepper. 2- Spoon 8 mounds of egg whites onto prepared baking sheet and indent centers to form nests. Bake until lightly golden, about 3 minutes. 3-Carefully spoon an egg yolk into center of each nest and season with salt and pepper. Bake until yolks are just set, about 3 minutes more. 4-
