The Parade will start on Baldwin Avenue, near the Veterans cemetery, turns right onto Makawao Avenue, then turns right onto Makani Road and into Kalama school.

MANDATORY MEETING: A mandatory meeting is scheduled for Thursday, June 20, 2024 at 6:00 pm at the Oskie Rice Event Center.

No Show, No Go, No Refund!

- All entries are required to have Hae Hawai'i and the American Flag.
- No entry is confirmed until the Parade Application form, list of rules and waiver documents are signed by participants and confirmed by the parade committee.
- Parade Participant parking is FREE with Parade Placard at Oskie Rice Event Center.
- \$5 \*\* CASH ONLY \*\* Parking is available at the Oskie Rice Event Center for NON Participants.
- **No Studs:** Absolutely NO STUDS will be permitted in this parade. Any unit in violation of this rule will be removed immediately and will not be allowed on the parade route.
- Cooperation: Any participant who refuses to cooperate within the parade, who fails to carry our instructions or assignments, and in general creates disharmony in the parade WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE.

## Parade Application Form 56th Annual Makawao Parade RULES & REGULATIONS

#### NO PARKING IN TOWN OR STAGING AREAS

#### **PARADE RULES:**

Our community has enjoyed the Makawao Parade for years because it celebrates democracy, freedom, and our veterans. It is important for us to maintain its community-based flavor without getting too commercialized. We certainly appreciate all our sponsors and entrants for their time, commitment, and dedication in preparing for the parade. However, there are certain important rules that must be followed for the safety of our participants and spectators. Please understand that these rules have come after years of experience.

- 1. The Parade Committee shall have the final determination in who may participate in the parade. Entries that are not appropriate for children's viewing or who promote controversial and/or negative advocacies and/or are deemed objectionable will not be allowed to participate in the parade.
- 2. An authorized representative must attend the **MANDATORY MEETING** on Thursday, June 20, 2024 at Oskie Rice Event Center at 6 pm.
- 3. Each unit is required to display a minimum of one Hae Hawai'i and the American flag. More is preferable.
- 4. Parade entries and individual participants shall conduct themselves in an appropriate manner at all times.
- 5. It is prohibited from passing out leaflets and/or fliers. This includes political solicitations and handouts.
- 6. Tossing or throwing candy or hard objects into the crowds is ABSOLUTELY PROHIBITED due to the risk of the smaller kids getting trampled. Instead, we ask that you designate people walking in your unit to hand out items.
- 7. If you have animals participating in the parade, remember to bring them water and protect them from overheating. The asphalt gets very hot, so dog booties are strongly recommended. CLEANING UP AFTER YOUR ANIMALS IS REQUIRED.
- 8. All entrants are urged to provide some type of creative entertainment for children. This adds to the enjoyment for all.
- 9. **BE PUNCTUAL!** Please be punctual andmake sure your unit is ready when the Marshal asks you to move into position for entry into your parade sequence.
- 10. All entrants must follow the instructions of the street marshals to avoid unnecessary delays and proper spacing of the parade. No substitutions in line-ups are allowed.
- 11. Entrants shall make every endeavor to maintain close spacing with the unit ahead. Activities that require a unit to stop and perform along the parade route are discouraged.
- 12. For the safety of all, a height limitation of 14' (feet) and width limitation of 11' (feet) will be enforced on all floats and vehicles entered in the parade.
- 13. **CROWD CONTROL:** Community volunteers will be assisting with the parade security and safety. Marshals will be visible in event shirts and are available to advise them of any parade problems.
- 14. Vehicles breaking down in the parade will be moved to the side of the road to allow the parade to continue.
- 15. **AWARDS:** Awards will be distributed during the concert at the courtyard on July 04, 2024. Parade results will be printed in The Maui News and announced at the Rodeo.
- 16. **PARKING:** Parade participant parking is at OSKIE RICE ARENA EVENT CENTER for FREE with Parade Placard. There is a shuttle. Parking for parade entries is also available at Kalama School.

## Parade Application Form 56th Annual Makawao Parade MAKAWAO PARADE WAIVER

I, the undersigned, indemnify and hold harmless, agree to release, waive and discharge Makawao Parade for all personal injuries known or unknown or death or injuries to real or personal property, caused by or arising out of my voluntary participation in this event, or somehow related thereto, including but not limited to any damage or injuries caused by horses, other animals, spectators, or participants.

I, the undersigned, understand that Hawaii Law (ACT 249, 1994 Hawaii Legislative Session, Effective June 29, 1994) limits the civil liability of persons sponsoring equine (horse, pony, mule, donkey, or hinney) activities. I understand that there are inherent risks of injury, including death, when participating in an equine activity, which risks include but are not limited to (1) the propensity of an equine to behave in ways that may result in injury or death to persons on or around them, (2) the unpredictability of an equine's reactions to such things as sounds, sudden movement, and unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals, (3) hazards such as surface and sub-surface conditions, (4) collisions with other equines or objects, and (5) the potential negligence of another participant, such as failing to maintain control over the equine, or not acting within the participant's ability.

**Insurance:** This annual event does not carry insurance for any participant in any of the celebration events. It is recommended that each participant obtain their own coverage or that your insurance agent be consulted on whether your homeowner's or renter's insurance policy covers you for this type of event.

The Makawao Parade Committee is not responsible for any injuries or damage by any and all participants in this event. By signing this application, you indicate that you have read and agree to all the conditions and stipulations set forth concerning this event. ALL APPLICATIONS ARE SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE PARADE COMMITTEE AND ALL DECISIONS ARE FINAL.
