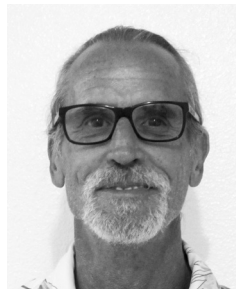

WORTHY PRESIDENT



The Aerie leadership is proposing a by-law change to institute an issue resolution process that emphasizes resolution of incidents at the lowest level and promotes resolving conflict versus dishing out punishment. I want to share this process so members are well informed of the process instead of the sole verbiage of the by-law change. Additionally we can modify the process for improvements without having to process a by-law change.

CRYSTAL RIVER EAGLES AERIE 4272 ISSUE RESOLUTION PROCESS

In the spirit of unity, respect, and brotherhood/sisterhood, the members of the Crystal River Eagles Aerie 4272 agree to seek amicable resolution of any disputes, misunderstandings, or grievances that may arise within the Aerie. As a Fraternal order, all parties need to agree to approach the process in good faith, with the shared goal of preserving the harmony, dignity, and fellowship of the organization.

An amicable issue resolution process for a Fraternal Order (such as the Fraternal Order of Eagles) should be a structured, low-conflict method for settling disputes without resorting to for Trustees to investigate and determine punishment and the potential of going to trial. This process is designed to come up with a resolution that satisfies all parties involved as well as preserve the "brotherhood" or internal community by prioritizing negotiation, mediation, and mutual agreement.

Key Principles

- Restoration of Relationships: Unlike typical issue resolution processes, the primary goal is to restore the fraternal relationship between members.
- Confidentiality: Amicable resolutions are typically private, protecting the internal reputation of the two members and the order, reducing divisiveness among club members and providing a just and satisfactory resolution.
- Voluntary Participation: The effectiveness of the process relies on the willingness of the members to engage in problem-solving rather than "winning" a "verdict".

Core Components of the Process

- Informal Consultation: The process begins with the aggrieved member discussing the issue directly with the Trustees to understand the details of the issue, understand the aggrieved members desired solution that is reasonable and just.
- Mediation: If direct discussion fails, the next step is for the Trustees to facilitate a dialogue between parties to find a mutually agreeable solution.
- Mutual Agreement Process: The Trustees would develop an "action plan" that involves the parties understanding the issues, accepting responsibility if necessary rather than strictly fighting allegations, and resolving the issue as early in the process as possible.
- Trustees Formal Actions: If these informal steps cannot resolve the dispute then the Trustees will proceed with the formal and decision process as defined by the statutes and by-laws.

Practical Implementation Steps

1. Initial Discussion – Members involved in a disagreement shall first make a sincere effort to resolve the matter privately through open, respectful dialogue following the obligation we take when we become an Eagle member.
2. Incident Report - If the matter remains unresolved, it shall be brought to the attention of the Trustees via a completed Incident Report. The Trustees will first discuss with the individual(s) the incident at hand and discuss desired solutions. Following that initial discussion, the Trustees will facilitate a fair and impartial discussion between the parties. This is done by clearly outline the conflict and attempt to resolve it at the lowest possible level (e.g., between the two members). If this step does resolve the issue then the Trustees will proceed to the Formal process as outlined in our statutes and by-laws.
3. Formal Process: Trustees follow the statutes and by-laws to provide due diligence to all parties, collect evidence, determine house rules or statutes violated and dispense fair and equitable justice.
4. Appeal Rights: The statutes provide an opportunity to appeal the Trustee's decision.

By trying to resolve issues and incidents this way we hope to reduce the amount of formal proceedings, getting a solution earlier in the process, and resolving the problem at the lowest possible level (the two effective parties). It can also help keep these issues from the social room and public scrutiny with can cause divisiveness between fraternal brothers/sisters at our club.

TRUSTEE REPORT



Congratulations to all the newly elected officers.

To help reduce the costs and improve the accountability for meals provided by the Foe 4272. A new procedure will be initiated starting with the Independence Day meal.

The meals determined below will be advertised at least **two months in advance** in our newsletter, on message boards, on bar placards and any other place as deemed necessary. Due to limited seating capability, the meals for some of the more popular dates such as Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter may require designated seating times.

These advertisements will include the following info when necessary: The **Menu** that is planned and a statement "**Members who wish to attend the designated dinner must sign up at the Bar**". The designated seating times if required, so that the members may sign up for those times.

A signup sheet will be located at the Bar where members will sign indicating their intentions to attend the meal and their preferred seating time. The signup sheet shall be at the Bar **until 2 weeks** prior to the event at which time it will be taken down and given to the trustees who will review it and give a copy to Wendy Fournier who can calculate how much food she needs for the event. **There will be no additions or deletions to this sign in sheet** after it is removed from the Bar and given to the Trustees and Wendy.

If a member is planning on bringing a guest that member must provide the guests name/s and note them as guests on the sign-up sheet. **Members Meals are free to the members, but you must sign up to get one.** If you do not sign up, you may not be able to obtain a meal (see ***Note**)

Guests Meals are not free and must be paid for by the sponsoring member at a rate of **\$15.00 per meal or a rate to be determined by the Tenant and trustees prior to the event.**

The Day/night of the meal: Members will identify themselves to the event Coordinator, who in turn will look them up on the sign in list and if their name appears there she/he will present them with a Coupon to be used for their respective meal.

Guests must also identify themselves with the event coordinator who will again verify that the guest is on the dinner list. Once identified the Guests sponsor will pay the event coordinator or the meal and a Guest Bracelet will be issued to the guest as proof of payment.

Please remember to Tip the Cook as she makes very little from these events.

These meals are listed below:

New Years Eve

Valentines Day will be at the discretion of Wendy who will set up the menu and charges. Applicable Payments will be made to her or her designated event coordinator directly.

Easter, Mother's Day, Father's Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.

There will also be buffet events that will not require sign up, and charges for Guests will be determined by the Kitchen Manager prior to each of these events and those funds will be paid to the Bartender on duty at the time of the event.

Superbowl Sunday, Kentucky Derby, Adult Christmas Party, Independence Day, Installation of Officers, and Veterans Day.

(*NOTE) There may be a left-over meal or two due to no-shows, if there are, they will be very few. They will be sold on a first come first serve basis at a rate of \$15.00 per meal. When they are gone there will be no more for that event. So, sign up to guarantee your meal.

The Trustees of Crystal River Eagles are constantly asked why do guest need to pay to hear bands. So let me attempt to explain: 1st and foremost the Eagles pays for these bands as a benefit to you as members not for the benefit of Guests. Therefor they should pay to help offset some of the expenses. The same thing goes for meals. Members are free and Guests must pay. The best way to look at this is a guest can join the Eagles for \$50 per year, but think of it in this light, as a member they can come to every band night without payment wov 52 weeks of Bands Regularly \$260.00 plus they get up to 13 meals free Regularly \$ \$195.00. Now you can see that for \$50 per year you are receiving \$ 455.00 worth of benefits. I can not think of a better way to sell memberships.

Proposed By-law and House Rules

PROPOSED CHANGE TO HOUSE RULES - RULE II - CONDUCT

6. Once the Trustees receive a completed Incident Report the Trustees will discuss the incident with the individual(s) and explore desired solutions. Following this initial discussion with the accuser, the Trustees will facilitate a fair and impartial discussion between the parties, clearly outlining the conflict and attempting to resolve it at the lowest possible level. If this step resolves the issue, no further action is needed, and the incident report should be withdrawn. Otherwise, Trustees proceed to the formal process outlined in statutes and by-laws.

Intent: New incident process promoting resolution between the parties prior to the formal incident resolution process.

PROPOSED CHANGE TO HOUSE RULES - RULE IV - AERIE PROPERTY

3. Solicitation on the Grounds or in the Social Room or Bar of The Eagles is prohibited. Vehicles of Patrons, Guests or Companies performing authorized service such as deliveries, repairs, installations, construction or visitations, with advertising on them may be allowed to park in the Eagles Parking lots during the day must be removed by the end of each day.

Signage may be posted in front of the Eagles for specific work being done on Eagles property for a specified amount of time with the approval of the Eagles Trustees.

Intent: New rule prohibiting on site advertising

SECTION 5.7 (NEW) FEE FOR MEMBERSHIP TRANSFERS WILL BE PRORATED BY MONTH OF TRANSFER TO RECOVER FUNDS NECESSARY TO PAY PER CAPITA TAX TO THE GRAND AND DEPOSITED IN THE BENEFIT FUND.

Intent: TO COVER THE COSTS DUE TO THE GRAND FOR TRANSFERRED MEMBERS

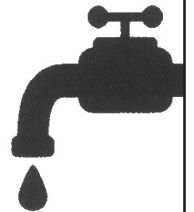
