



## DAWN GILBERT SHOW HORSES, LLC. Rules & Guidelines

(not all inclusive, and may change without prior notice)

### Training & General Barn Rules:

- Please abide by barn hours. 9am-9pm. Visits outside of those hours by emergency appointment only.
- You are welcome to visit your horse at any time during barn hours, but please schedule any meetings, lessons or “in person” time in advance. 2 weeks lead time is the average necessary.
- If you engage in any equine activity, please clean up after yourself and follow all posted signage.
- Please leave all doors and gates as you found them.
- If you need to bring in a horse from outside, please consult management first, as additional turn-in of neighboring horses/paddock mates may be necessary.
- All equine diets are custom tailored. Please do not feed your horse or any other horse on the premises any extra hay or grain unless specifically directed by management. *Please do not feed treats to any horse you do not personally own under any circumstances.*
- All bills must be paid in full per training agreement.
- Horses leaving for an extended period (eg: show, medical) will not be entitled to a refund unless DGSH receives no less than 15 days notice AND can immediately fill the empty stall.
- Good manners are always appreciated. Please do your best to include all barn members when applicable. Selective exclusions and drama (limited group texting for example) will result in a warning. Instances of bullying, abuse (horse or human), or other unethical behavior will result in immediate excusal. NO REFUNDS.

### SHOW RULES:

- All outstanding charges must be paid in full before leaving for any show.
- Anyone stalling in the DGSH aisleway, whether a regular training customer or not, must abide by DGSH Show rules.
- Do not “camp” in the aisleway. Do not block traffic with chairs, hammocks, scooters, toys, equipment, grooming products, horses, etc... Everyone is entitled to space in which to prepare, so please do as much as possible in your stall.
- Please do your part to keep your area in front of your stall and in the tack stall clean. This applies even when there is cleaning help hired. If you cannot, you will be warned, and then moved to the end of the aisleway and required to purchase your own tack stall.
- Customers stalling with DGSH are requested to have their own (clean) show clothing. Preference is given to sheets and sleezies in the colors of Navy, grey, silver or white. All stall front bags, etc., (anything that is left hanging in the aisleway) are strongly requested to be navy in color.

- Feeding times at the discretion of DGSH management. Grain feedings, particularly PM, will happen when ALL horses are done showing for the day.
- Unless extra help is hired, all owners (owners of horses being shown exclusively by DGSH are exempt) are responsible for keeping their stalls and water buckets clean and replenished, as well as hay bags filled at all times.
- Unless extra help is hired, all owners (owners of horses being shown exclusively by DGSH are exempt) are responsible for being present to load and unload horses AND tack.
- Unless extra help is hired, all owners (owners of horses being shown exclusively by DGSH are exempt) are responsible of having their own horse prepared to DGSH standards- this includes grooming, clipping, hanging tails, polishing hooves, banding, braiding, etc. When in doubt, ask. If you're unwilling, or incapable of any of the above, please plan accordingly for hiring those tasks out.
- Schooling times will be coordinated and set by DGSH, with consideration for show schedules, etc... Reasonable accommodations will be provided for in the event of extenuating circumstances.
- All stalling and planning questions must go through DGSH or designated agent.
- Good sportsmanship and manners are always appreciated. Any poor attitude, lack of sportsmanship, or exclusion of barn mates will receive a warning. Repeated offenses, bullying, or abuse (horse or human) will result in you being asked to leave immediately upon our return home. NO REFUNDS.
