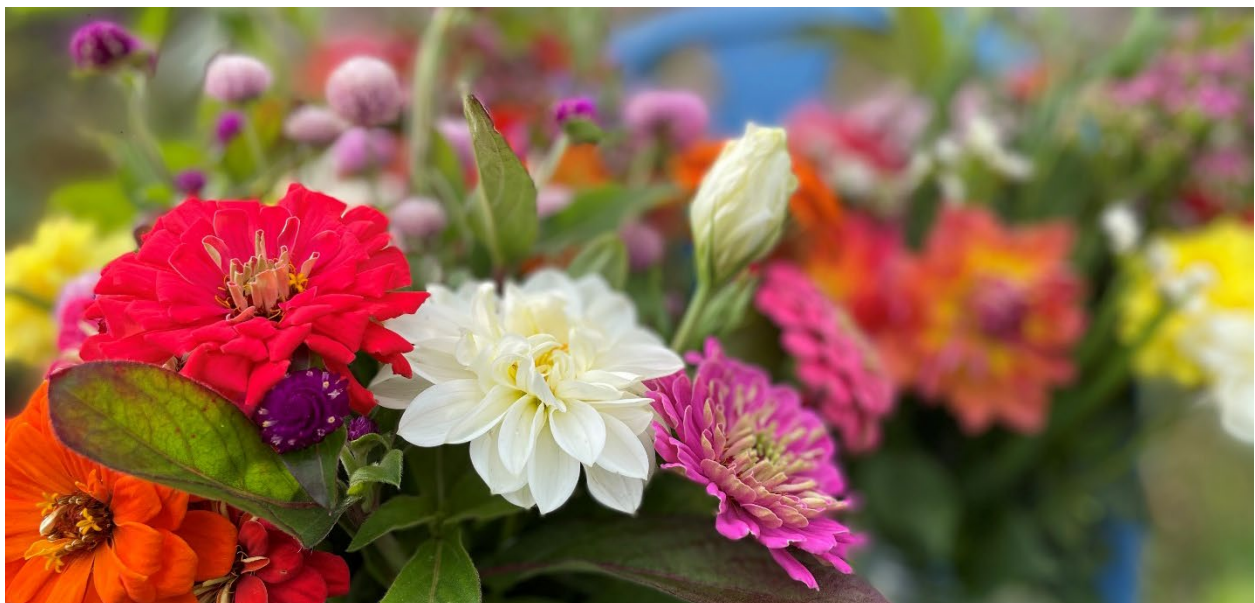
### How it Works:

The Fifty Acre Garden's Freshly Picked subscription will begin Saturday, July 2nd, 2022 and run through and including Saturday, October 8<sup>th</sup>, 2022.

- Subscribers get the first choice of our fresh, local vegetables and fruit at 10% discount from our regular market prices.
- Subscribers will be sent a GoogleForm on the Wednesday before each pickup, which allows pre-selection based on what we *anticipate* harvesting that week (this is not guaranteed, but it the best chance to reserve your favourite products).
- The start time for subscription pickups is one hour before our farm-stand opens to the public, allowing subscribers who do not submit a form to have the first choice of produce.
- Subscribers will get 15 pickups.
- Missed subscription pickups will *not* be carried over into the 2023 season.
- If subscribers are going to miss a pickup and provide advanced notice (by Friday at 12pm), the order value can be carried forward to add onto another weekend.
- At the start of the season, subscribers will be provided with two reusable cloth bags or bins to bring when picking up their weekly order.

### Farm-Fresh Flowers:

- The Flower Subscription will run for six weeks, starting mid-July through September. Flowers are cut stems (as opposed to potted plants) are provided in bunches of a single variety or market bouquets, pending availability, each of a \$20 value.



## Payment Details:

Customers pay upfront at the time of registration. Payment options include (1) cash, (2) e-transfer, or (3) cheque.
