It's a living online document and the desire is to have it serve all of the members and visitors as well as it can.

Whidbey Playhouse Buy-Out. We just completed that event on Father's Day and JR deserves a BZ and huge vote of thanks from all of us for putting together another great event. "Charlie's Aunt" was a fun production to see, generated lots of laughs for the audience, and when you have that and the inimitable JR doing his thing on stage? Twice? Golden, pure golden.

Thanks to all of you who attended, with of course a bit of extra thanks to those who also brought along the munchies to lay out and share. Most importantly, at the end of the day it was a huge success financially as well. We had 86 paid attendees, bringing in \$1,370 in ticket sales, plus an additional \$270 of income from the raffles, plus some additional income from items sold at the event itself. As a result of this, we will be able to once again fully fund our support for two JROTC units, returning to the former \$500 cash grant per chapter, covering that from ticket sales alone; any funds left over plus all of the raffle income will be put into our scholarship funds. Thanks again, everyone!

**Picnic**. This is now 'Event the Next' as we used to say in the Old Navy. Jim Patton and his team have been hard at work on getting this set up for some time now. The specifics will be mentioned elsewhere in this newsletter again, so I'll limit myself to reminding you that this is a revenue neutral event, meaning that we will set the ticket price as close to expenses as we can get it. It's always a good time, and I hope to see as many of you joining us out there as can possibly make it.

We have welcomed a good number of new members in during the past months, and I would offer special encouragement to them to make an effort to come out and join us, to meet and get to know some more of the members and let them see your happy shining faces too.




#### "Tales of Military Service" – Volume III
