TREASURER'S CORNER

Greetings to my fellow WICMOAA members. Are you getting about as tired of all this smoke as I am? I'm going to try to make this a bit shorter than some have been in the past, so will just talk briefly about money and dues, then close with a quick look at upcoming major events.



We remain in a good financial state, with sufficient cash on hand and our NFCU CD (\$21,676.64) and Scholarship Savings Accounts (\$4,940.23) also in good shape. \$3,000 of the savings is earmarked for this year's scholarship awardee, with the \$1,900 balance, supplemented by donations between now and then, to be applied towards next year's awardee.

Our membership is now sitting at 78, 75 of whom are dues-paying. As of the end of September we had 30 members already paid up for the current year (40% of the goal), with more than a few paid out into 2024 and beyond as well. No increase in dues is now needed and no increases are being considered for the immediate future.

For some time now I have also been maintaining the Chapter Roster. If any of you would like to have a copy of that for your own use, just drop me a line or grab me aside at a meeting and I'll be happy to shoot you a PDF version of it.

November is our chapter's Annual Meeting, at which the candidates for the various positions on the Board of Directors (BOD) are presented and voted upon and other business is also optionally taken care of. Can you think of a more fun thing to do than that on the odd Thursday afternoon? I can't either, so hope to see a good turnout for that.

Additionally, sometime in the next few months the BOD will be proposing to the membership a series of amendments to our bylaws. These changes will primarily involve the creation of a new class of membership to receive most of the current Auxiliary Members, this done to bring our structure and operations into closer alignment with what MOAA is now doing. More details will be forthcoming, and you all will receive copies of all of the proposed amendments for your consideration and review well before we gather at one of our regular meetings to vote on them.

Between now and then, though, we have the Burger Burn at the VFW this Saturday. It's free, folks! If you're just now deciding to attend then, please, let someone know you're going to show up so that Terry can make sure we have enough of the main stuff there for feed everyone. I Bond

Within the past year the Federal Government has offered a CD style savings bond called an I Bond. The I Bond can only be purchased online at treasurydirect.gov. Its purpose is to help purchasers combat inflation by offering this security at an attractive interest rate. There is no risk to the principal. The fixed interest rate is zero, but the variable interest rate is recalculated every 6 months (May 1 and November 1) based on the effect of inflation as determined by the Consumer Price Index, CPI. The current rate is 9.62%.
