

We bring the Gospel behind bars, help with reentry, and now, we're reaching youth and families to break the cycles before they start.

Whether through Bible study, job coaching, art therapy, or simply being present—we remind people that they are not forgotten. That God still has a plan for them. And that with the right support, they can build something new.

# **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

At Lowcountry Prison Ministries, community engagement is at the heart of everything we do. We believe true transformation happens when faith, service, and partnership meet. Throughout the year, we have:

- Hosted Bible-based workshops inside Coastal State Prison and Palmer Pre-Release, providing mentorship and spiritual support to over 200 incarcerated men.
- Launched youth outreach initiatives in partnership with schools and detention centers to guide young people toward positive life choices.
- Collaborated with local leaders and churches to support returning citizens with housing referrals, job coaching, and reintegration support.

- Joined forces with Offender Alumni Association (OAA) to help reform former gang members and mentor youth through real-life testimony and accountability.
- Expanded our community presence through local events, food drives, and our new partnership with Hot 2100 Savannah to bring faith-based content and resources to the broader community.

This engagement isn't just outreach—it's relationship building. Together, we are rebuilding trust, restoring families, and reshaping futures through the power of faith, service, and consistent presence.

### **Our Solution**



Lowcountry Prison Ministries continues to grow in both financial support and program impact. Our projected three-year budget reflects a commitment to transparency, sustainability, and mission-focused spending.




