Devotionals

“Be Transformed”



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"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." Romans 12:2, ESV

We often pray for change. We ask God for growth, influence, deeper relationship, greater purpose. Yet when the process of change begins, we are surprised by the discomfort. We did not expect it to be so difficult. We did not expect the pruning. We certainly did not expect the removal of familiar habits, relationships, or mindsets.

The Lord lovingly reminds us that change is necessary. If He is to complete His work in us, He must remove whatever hinders our relationship with Him. This is not punishment—it is preparation. Not rejection—but refinement.

Scripture echoes this truth. In Ephesians 4:21–24, we are told to put off the old self and put on the new. In 1 Thessalonians 5:23, Paul prays that we would be sanctified completely. And in 1 Samuel 10:6, we see how the Spirit of the Lord can transform a person into “another man.”

Transformation hurts and life can be our school.

Sometimes we interpret hardship as everything going wrong. Yet God assures us that He can turn what comes against us into something that works for us. Sanctification is not instant; it is lifelong. The stretching of our faith may feel painful, but it is necessary for growth.

You may not see the finished product while you are still in process. The vessel does not understand the Potter’s design while it is still being shaped. But trust is required before understanding comes.

If we want to change the world around us, Father usually starts with us.

God begins transformation from within. When we change, environments shift. When we surrender, humility grows, pride starts to be chipped away. When we allow Him to make us new, we become able to carry what He has prepared.

As surely as the moon rises and sets, His love remains constant. It is because He loves us that He molds us, prunes us.

The process may be uncomfortable, but it is guided by faithful hands, His Holy Spirit that lives in us when we accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior.

Prayer Lord, make me a new vessel. Remove what no longer fits Your purpose in my life. Help me trust You in the stretching and the pruning. Amen
