Whitney Houston (1963-2012)

Whitney Elizabeth Houston, who was born on August 9, 1963, was one of the best-selling music artists of all time. She sold more than 200 million records world wide, and in 2023, the "Rolling Stone Magazine" proclaimed the second greatest singer of all time. Her most appropriate nickname was "The Voice."


Houston was part of a talented musical family, Her mother, Emily Cissy Houston was also a successful professional singer, and her cousin, Dionne Warwick, is one of the best selling American singers.

Whitney Houston was also a very successful actress. Her debut performance was in the romantic thriller film, "The Body Guard" in 1992. It became the 10th highest grossing film to date, and its soundtrack won the Grammy award for album of the year. That soundtrack is still the best selling film soundtrack of all time.

Unfortunately, Whitney Houston passed away prematurely from substance abuse. The important lesson herein is that none of us are immune from the overpowering effects of substance abuse.

Deion Sanders, Sr. (1967 -)

Deion Luwynn Sanders, who was born on August 9, 1967, is the head football coach at the University of Colorado Boulder. Sanders is a former Major League Baseball and National Football League player. He was an outstanding NFL cornerback for 14 seasons, who was in two victorious Super Bowls. His nickname was Prime

Time. Sanders was a major league outfielder for 9 seasons, and he played in the World Series in 1992 making him the only athlete to play in both the Super Bowl and the World Series.

After retiring from professional sports, Sanders enjoyed success as a television sports analyst before becoming a very successful head coach at Jackson State University, a Historically Black University in Mississippi. He led Jackson State to two consecutive Celebration Bowl Appearances and their first undefeated season in 2022.

Sergeant Joi Franklin Is A Sensational Sister By Aries Franklin

Typically when you watch any movie or television show that has to do with jail or prison, you don't see many female guards. I mean, there may be a few, but not enough that would spark a young person's interest to take on such a challenging career. ESPECIALLY, in the African American/

People of Color community. It's far too often that anything that has to do with corrections, actually sits on the opposite end of what people of the community want to do. Often people turn their noses up at career choices like this, not even taking into consideration how hard a position like this is.

However, Sergeant Joi Franklin has taken this stigma and completely burned it to the ground. Twenty-eight years ago, this wasn't her "dream job." When she first took interest in the position, she was only looking for a reliable income stream. She states, "It turned out, although it wasn't by my desire to work in corrections, it was by God's design that I was placed there."

Before becoming a sergeant, Joi was not only the first woman to receive the officer of the year award, but also the first African American woman to receive this honor. Through that she stayed humble, became a sergeant, and still considers raising her children to be her greatest accomplishment. She revealed, "I raised children that are

responsible, respectful, smart, resilient and overall good human beings. They're everything that our ancestors dreamed of."

You can only imagine how hard a position like this can be both physically and mentally. Her comment is, "The toughest part of my profession is always holding out hope for the betterment of mankind. Even when dealing with some people that have so much despair and hopelessness. You want to see people at their best and usually I see them at their worst. However, I try to show up in a positive way, to show young girls and women like me that we have a seat at any table we want to sit at."

Sergeant Franklin's goals are staying in her position until retirement and starting her own business. Just from her walk you can tell she carries herself with pride and honor of her accomplishments. When asked what advice she'd give to anyone coming out of "the system" or people that walk on the edge of becoming a part of the system she simply stated, "Life isn't easy. We're all learning together. Don't let what other people think of you determine your destiny or put you in situations that can alter your destiny. Oftentimes, it's pure luck that they get it right. Just know that God is bigger than any situation and oftentimes the test you're going through is just a promotion for what he has in store for you next."

Thank you Sergeant Franklin for creating a pathway for women to walk with their heads held high.

along with William Folk, the director of the Reading YMCA, talked about summer activities.



We are blessed to have numerous healthy summer activities in Berks County.



Big Ben stands up after having been knocked on the ground by Super Bo, and he says, "Please don't hit me again!"




Bo punches Big Ben.

A Book Review of "White Fear" by Roland S. Martin

Title: White Fear:


How the Browning of America

Is Making White Folks Lose Their Minds

Publisher: Ben Bella Books, Inc.,

This is the most important book published in 2022. It addresses the problem that has plagued the United States since its



inception. Its exploitation of people of color. However, the problem is now more catastrophic than ever before! Roland Martin clearly identifies why the problem has become worse than ever before: By 2043, less the 47% of the population of the United States will be white. That fact is petrifying millions of Americans.

White fear has motivated Republicans in several southern states to use political gerrymandering to redraw voting district voting districts in order to weaken the Black vote. Martin revealed that the state senate in Texas has passed a bill limiting extended early voting hour, prohibiting drive-through voting, banning local election officials from proactively sending vote-by-mail applications, and allowing poll watchers to videotape voters receiving assistance in filling out their ballots, essentially allowing poll watchers to intimidate voters.

Martin sets forth agendas for both black and white Americans for confronting white feat and calling out and eliminating voter suppression laws, gerrymandering, relining, predatory loans, underfunded school systems, gentrification, police brutality, and any other practices that prevent people of color front sharing in the American dream.

White Fear... should be a "must read" for all Americans in order for us to live up to the promises of the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence.
