Ms. McDaniel provides guidance to healthcare systems and public/private organizations on how to successfully implement and sustain equitable systems of service delivery to address health disparities. Ms. McDaniel is also a Doctoral Fellow at Morgan State University, and an AIM Clinical-Community Bundle Integration Specialist with the National Healthy Start Association. Ms. McDaniel's current research interests are in anti-racist healthcare practices and eliminating disparities in birth outcomes for African American women. Ms. McDaniel employs a critical equity framework through



which to understand all healthcare systems, policies, and practices. As a licensed certified social worker, she has dedicated her career to improving health outcomes for women and children; and as a leader in the field, she demonstrates cultural humility, effective communication, and sound content expertise.
