

Handout 1: Federal Feedback on the 2017-2021 Plan

August 2017 CHPC Meeting Summary Excerpt

Ms. D'Angelo stated that the CHPC has been waiting for almost a year to receive feedback from the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) and the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) on the 2017-2021 Integrated HIV Prevention and Care Plan. DPH received the feedback in late July. It indicated three (3) areas of weakness:

1. The need to conduct a new statewide needs assessment, which is planned to occur in early 2018
2. More substantial narrative throughout the document.
3. A greater emphasis on social determinants of health.

She stated that CHPC staff aimed to make the document concise and readable by streamlining the information and including infographics, but it should have included more background narrative. DPH staff members reviewed the document and its related feedback page by page, and noted that some items that reviewers flagged as missing were actually in the document, but other areas that reviewers marked can be improved. DPH is still waiting for feedback about how to proceed. Although it remains unclear whether the CHPC will have to finally submit a Plan Update, CHPC leaders will hold a vote to honor the CHPC process.

- Housing Stability – Indicator to be developed by ad hoc group led by Peta-Gaye Nembhard.
- Not in Care – Indicator to be considered after data presentation on 2021-22 initiative.
- STIs – Need baseline data on additional measures (number of syphilis cases investigated and number referred to PrEP) before setting goal.
- Retention in Care – More accurate measure than in 2017-21 Plan (per Angelique).

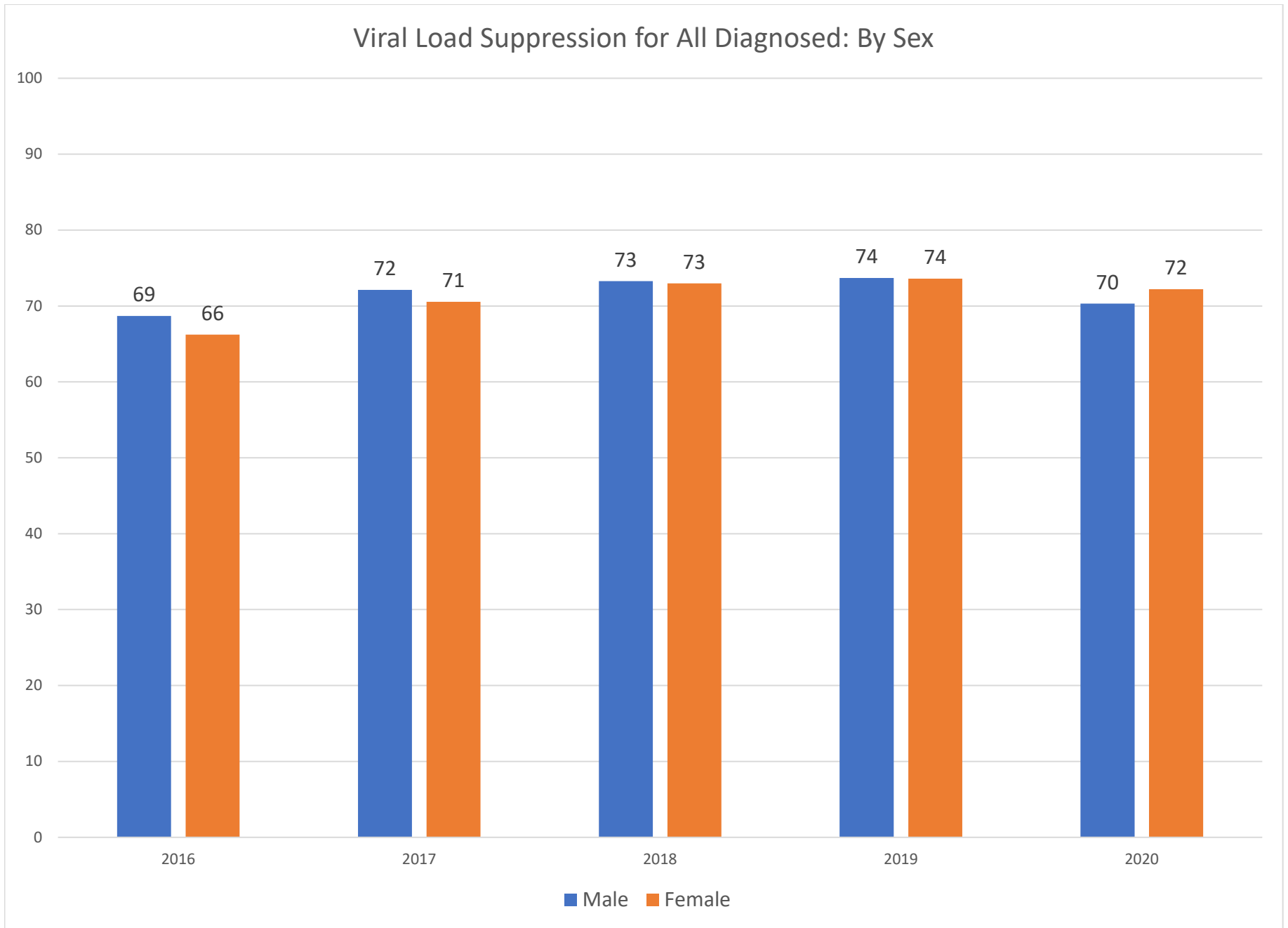
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Viral Load Suppression Indicators

Indicator	Notes	2026 Goal
Percent of people with diagnosed HIV who are virally suppressed	74% in 2019	87%
Viral load suppression among MSM, Black MSM, Latino MSM, Black women, transgender women, people who inject drugs, and youth (13-24)	NHAS proposes eliminating disparities	Proposed: 87% for all (i.e., eliminate disparities)

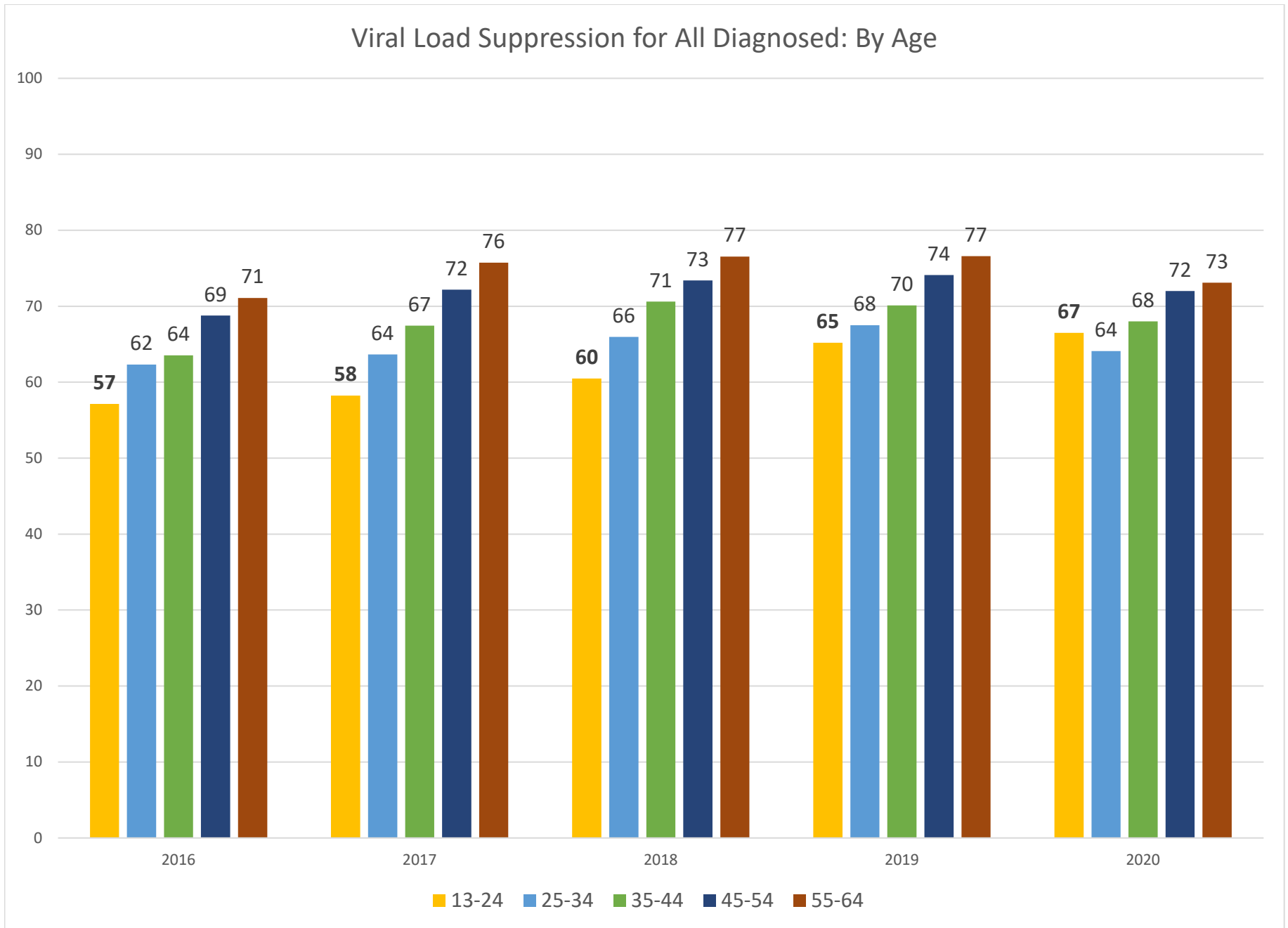
Handout 3: Viral Load Suppression by Population

Please note, HIV surveillance data reporting in 2020 was disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic - interpret with caution.



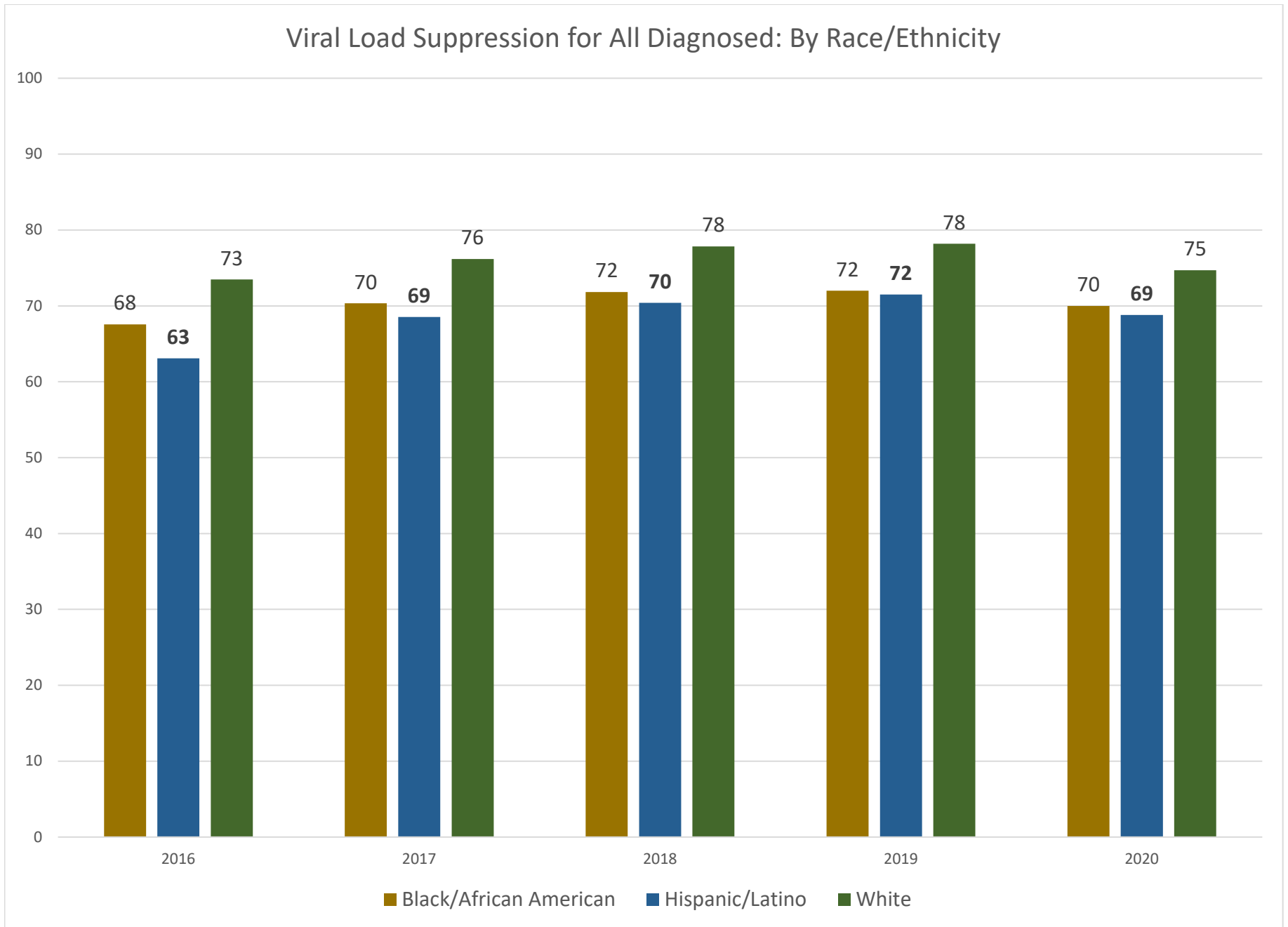
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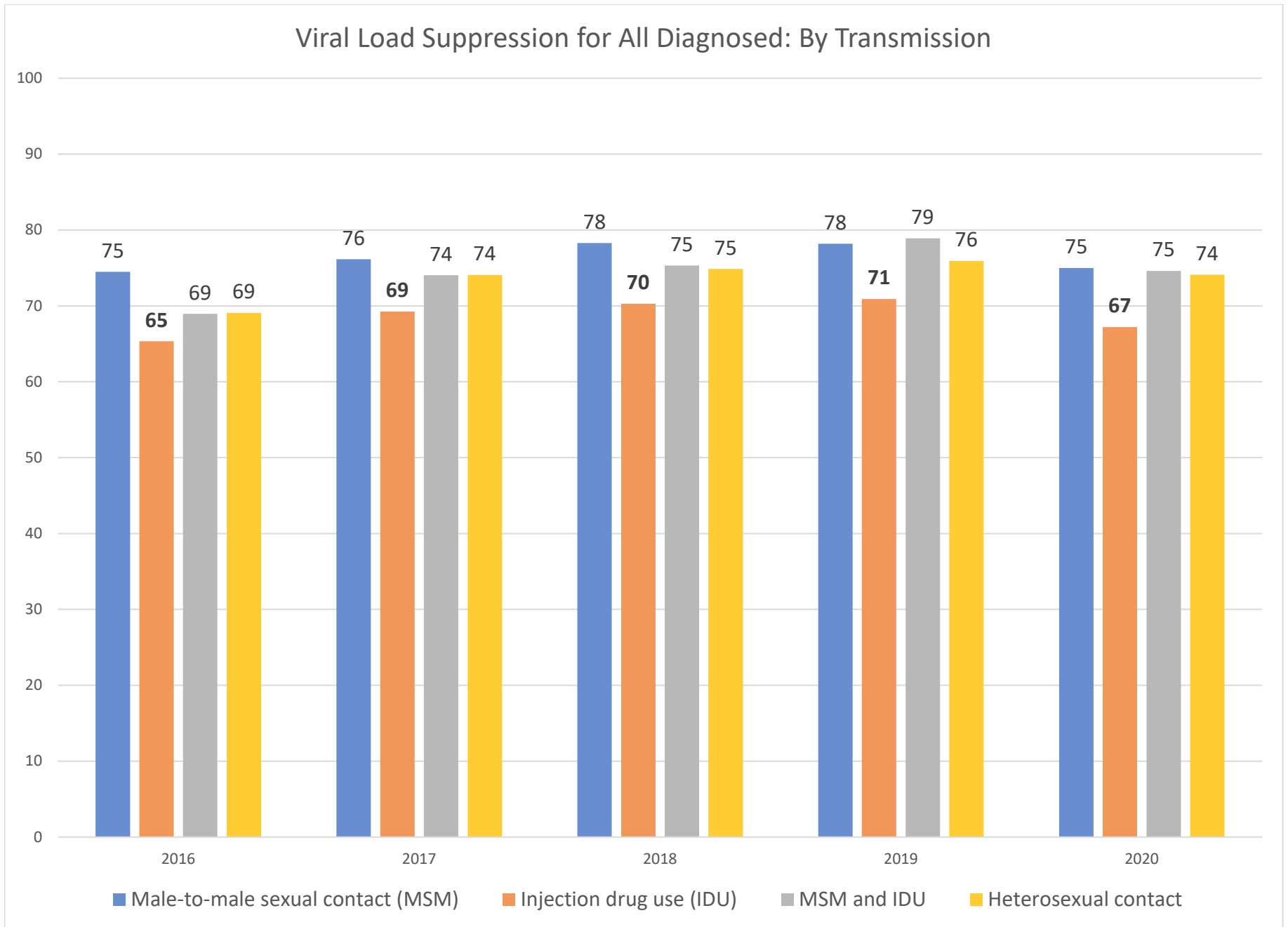
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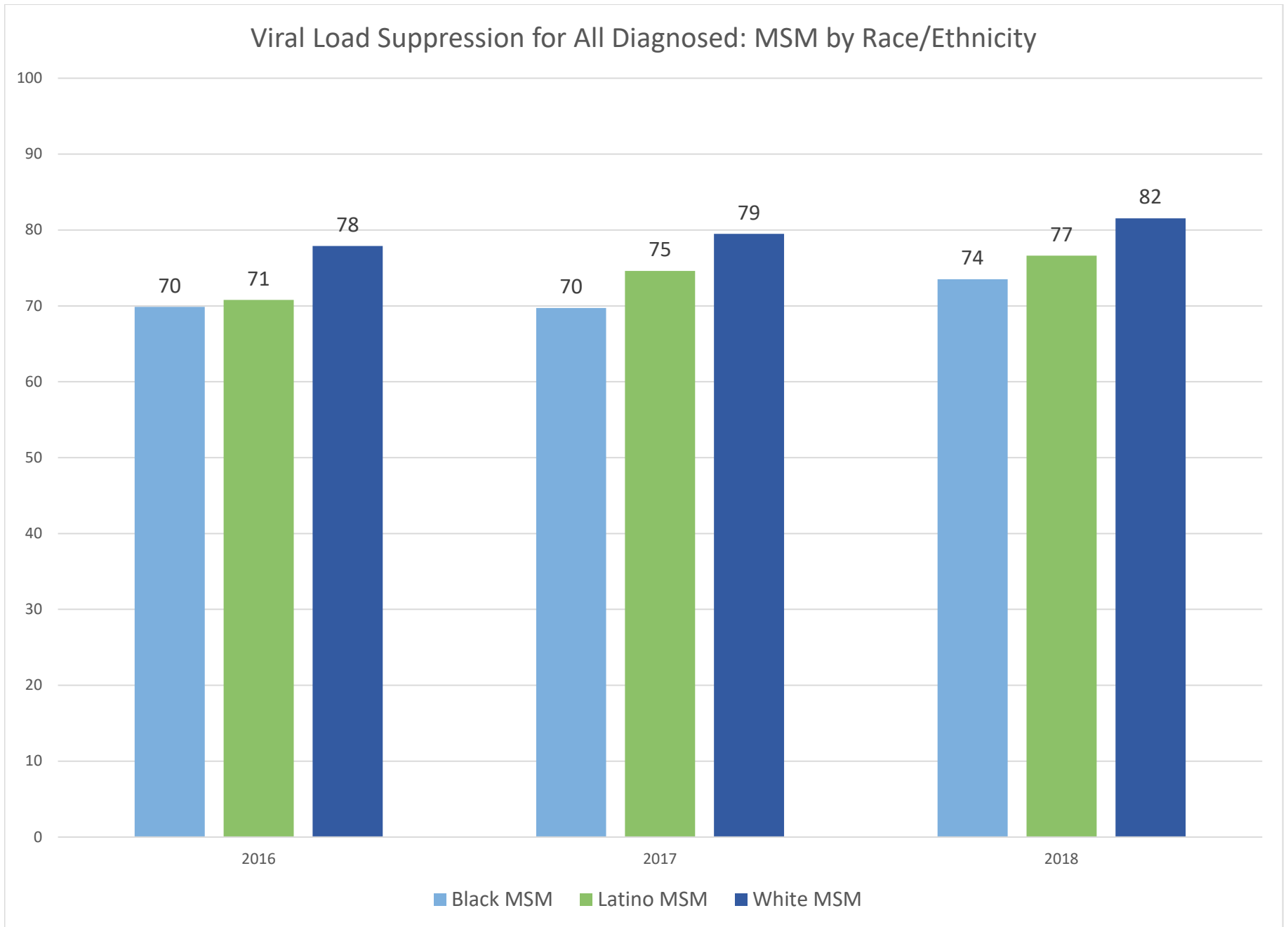
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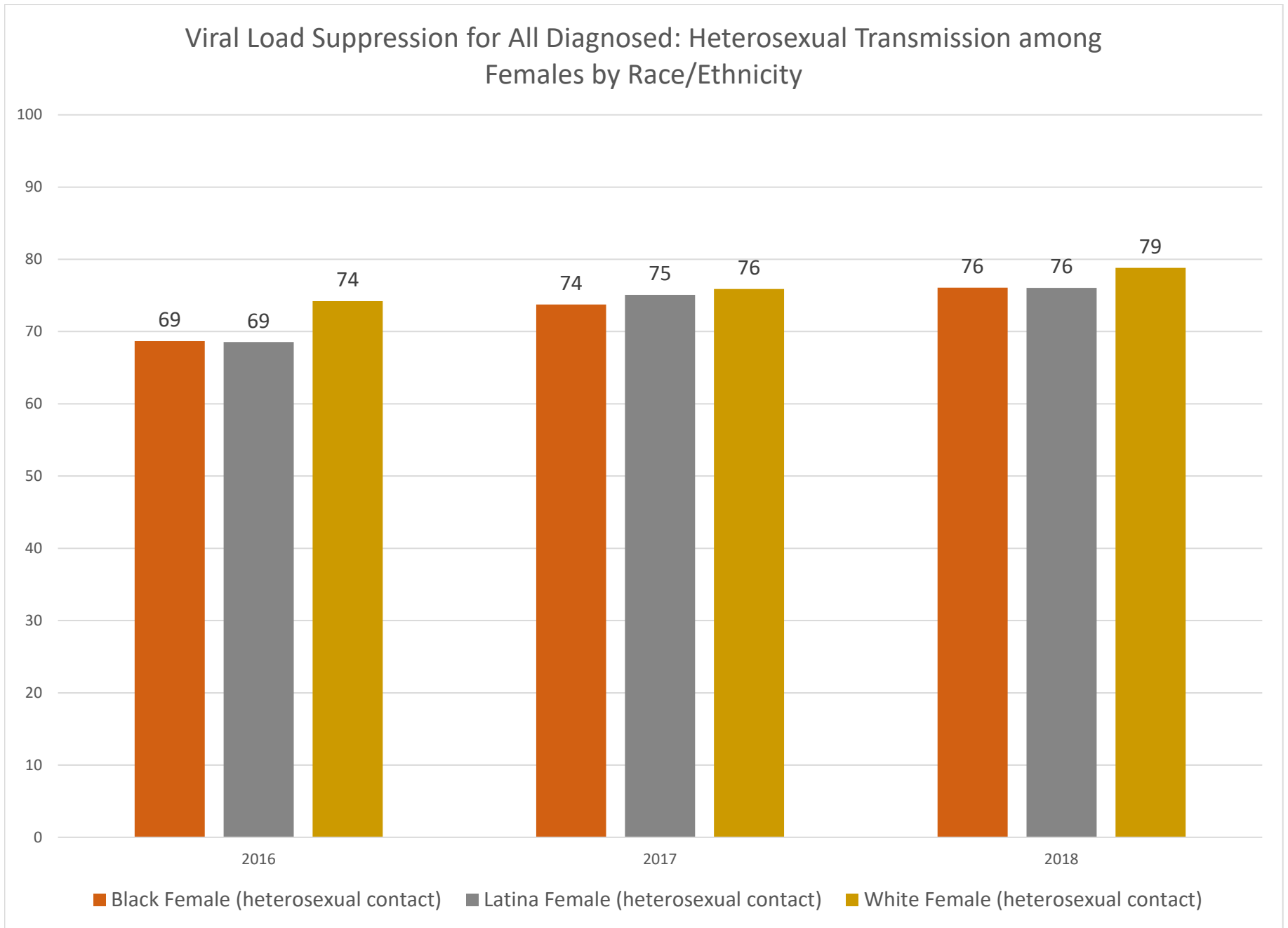
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Handout 4: Setting QPM Priorities for 2023
