- Commenting on land use planning and decisions








OUR CONCERN FOR INTEGRATED WATERSHED MANAGEMENT


- A process of understanding the impacts of human activities on natural resources from a watershed perspective
- Accounting for social, economic and environmental issues, as well as local community interests and issues such as the impacts of growth and climate change



- Headwaters at Glamorgan Road and Zion Line at the western boundary of the Cavan-Monaghan Township
- Drains the subwatershed into the Otonabee River at the Darling Wildlife Area nature reserve



PROTECTING THE FORMER JAIL LANDS

Working with the Kawartha Land Trust to demonstrate our interest in the provincial surplus process for the former Millbrook Correctional Centre lands such that:

- The property will be conserved as a public open greenspace
- A Conservation Easement will protect the lands forever
- Our local community organization will be the steward for the property







BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT AS OF 2021

- A Phase I Environmental Site Assessment was completed that indicated the site may be contaminated.
- A Phase II Environmental Site Assessment was underway which will provide a sampling and analysis of the property to confirm and delineate the presence of soil or groundwater contamination at the site.
- Ministry of Infrastructure undertook an Optimal Use Study for the property between 2011-2013
- Our land use planning concept fits with the current Cavan-Monaghan Official Plan land use policies for the property




SURPLUS PROCESS

- "Ontario Reducing Red Tape and Accelerating Sales of Surplus Government Property: Saving Taxpayer Dollars, Identifying Opportunities for Affordable Housing and Long-Term Care Spaces", December 4, 2018
- "This will put properties back into productive use, benefiting communities and increasing the potential for local economic development":
 - 243 properties identified in the announcement in varying stages of circulation, due diligence and marketing:
 - "Save taxpayers' money by reducing liabilities and ongoing maintenance costs on vacant properties"
 - "The future owner of the property would need to meet environmental obligations related to the proposed future use of that property"



- ORM Act
- Significant woodlands
- Unstable lands (hazard lands)
- Watercourses
- Clean Water Act and Source Water Protection
- Our analysis indicates that the developable area of the property to ~5-7 ha






BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT AS OF 2021

- Province of Ontario (Infrastructure Ontario) owns and manages the property
- The facility was closed in 2003 and the buildings were demolished
- The Province commissioned studies to investigate any possible contamination
- Over the years the Township has been diligent in reviewing these studies
- The Township's approved a Growth Management Strategy in 2020 which recommended the site to meet Millbrook's future residential and commercial needs
- As of August 2022 our understanding is council passed a motion to not amend the Official Plan to permit residential intensification on the property



SOURCE WATER **PROTECTION**







CLEAN WATER ACT

- Millbrook's drinking water is sourced from a groundwater aquifer by a municipal wellhead
- We think it's important to protect this property given it's location
- We support the Province's clean water agencies locally by providing information, education and advice to the public about other environmental issues related to drinking water

The Clean Water Act was developed to protect municipal, residential drinking water sources across the province from contamination and/or overuse by ensuring policies are in place to manage activities that may pose a drinking water threat. Locally, these policies are included in the Trent Source Protection Plan and they apply within the red shaded area shown below.
