A Heartfelt Tribute to the Legacy of Stanley Robert Hale

I first met Stanley Robert Hale in 2005, shortly after I purchased my home in Roanoke. At that time, I was unfamiliar with many facets of the community, one of which was the Lawson Building, a place that would later become significant in my life and work. It was in this building that I would come to appreciate the depth of Stan's commitment to community and



his unwavering support for those looking to make a difference.

Fast forward to 2013, when I brought my business back to Roanoke. I was brimming with fresh ideas and a vision for what I wanted to create. Little did I know, I would find a tremendous ally in Stan. He welcomed my enthusiasm with open arms, encouraging me to explore my ideas and supporting my vision wholeheartedly. I can confidently say that without Stan's guidance and belief in our mission, the Justice Business

> Ecosystem we established might never have come to fruition.

The work we do today is a direct reflection of the community building projects that Stan and his beloved daughter, Valerie Nichole "Nicki" Hale, were actively engaged in during my early days in the Lawson Building. Their dedication to uplifting the community and fostering opportunities for others was evident, and it inspired me to carry that torch forward. Stan was not just a mentor to me; he was a hero, a guiding light who showed me the importance of service, commitment, and love for one's community.

Stanley Robert Hale was born on December 22, 1943, to Eleanor Hale and Richard Reynolds in the Slate Hill area of Roanoke County. He passed away on September 6, 2024, after a brief stay at Carilion Hospital. The legacy he leaves behind is immeasurable and will be felt throughout the community for generations to come.

From an early age, Stan was deeply embedded in his community, becoming an active member of Slate Hill Baptist Church, and later a charter member and trustee at Gospel Truth Ministries, where he worked alongside his childhood friend, Rev. J.R. Hughes. His faith was a cornerstone of his life, reinforced by his participation in evening Bible studies with Rev. Kevin McNeil at the Lawson Building. Stan's educational journey took him through Roanoke County

and City Schools, culminating in his graduation from Lucy Addison High School in 1962. He was a standout student and athlete, excelling in baseball and basketball. His love for tennis blossomed after meeting Rose Hackley, who would not only become his first love but also his lifelong partner. Together, they shared countless memories on and off the court.

Stan's academic achievements earned him a scholarship to Fisk University, where he was actively involved in student council and played on the tennis team, ultimately graduating with a B.A. in Economics in 1966. His thirst for knowledge led him to a post-baccalaureate fellowship at Haverford College, paving the way for a Full Graduate Fellowship at UCLA. After completing his studies, he returned to Roanoke in 1969, married Rose, and welcomed their daughter, Valerie Nichole, who later graduated from Washington & Lee University Law School and began her law practice before her untimely passing in 2013.

Stan began his impactful career with the Southwest Virginia Community Development Fund (SVCDF) in 1969, starting as the Director of Management and Budget. Under the mentorship of Judge George Harris, he rose to the role of Executive Director in 1980 and later became President



of both SVCDF and its subsidiary, Impact Housing. His leadership was pivotal in implementing community development initiatives, such as establishing a medical



center and a childcare facility, as well as supporting recreational programs for youth, including an annual basketball camp. Stan took great pride in the Orange Avenue Industrial Park, which created 200 jobs, and the Shenandoah Industrial Redevelopment Project, which enhanced local infrastructure and generated additional employment opportunities.

Beyond his professional contributions, Stan was a charter member and past

president of the Roanoke-Lynchburg Boule of Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity, the oldest Greek-letter organization primarily for African American men. His commitment to excellence and community welfare extended to various boards, including Virginia Transformer Corporation, where he played a crucial role in securing loans that enabled the company's growth.

Stan actively participated in many organizations, including the National Alliance of Businessmen and the Citizens Services Committee appointed by the Roanoke City Council. His expertise was recognized by Congressman M.C. Butler, who appointed him to the Minority Business Action Committee, further solidifying his influence and commitment to fostering opportunities for others.

As I reflect on my journey with Stan, I am reminded of his profound impact on my life and the lives of many in our community. While his accomplishments are too numerous to list, it is the lasting impression he made that will continue to inspire us all. Stan, you will be deeply missed, but your legacy of service, mentorship, and community building will forever resonate in our hearts. Thank you for being a guiding light in my life and for the countless others who had the privi-

lege of knowing you. Rest in peace, dear friend.



Staying Focused on the Future







Being a breast cancer survivor has been one of the most profound and faith-defining experiences of my life. As a 52-year-old African American woman, deeply rooted in my faith and committed to serving both my church and my community, this journey touched me in ways I could have never imagined. It began with an unsettling discovery—a lump, small but significant, that left me feeling shaken and vulnerable. I knew something was wrong, and it wasn't long before my doctor confirmed my greatest fear: breast cancer. That diagnosis marked the beginning of a whirlwind of emotions that included fear, uncertainty, and questions about what the future held for me.

the only anchor I could cling to. Scripture tells us, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future" (Jeremiah 29:11). Those words became my daily meditation, a reminder that even in the darkest of times, God was in control of my story. I had to surrender my fear and lean into the strength that only comes from a deep, abiding trust in Him.

The months that followed were filled with treatments, surgeries, and the discomfort of chemotherapy. There were days when I felt physically drained and emotionally defeated. But even in the most difficult moments, I discovered a well of strength within me that I didn't know existed. Each morning we are the New Focus.

when I woke up, I thanked God for another day. It didn't matter how hard it was—each day was a gift, a testament to His grace.

This journey wasn't just about battling cancer; it was about reimagining my life through a lens of faith and purpose. I started to see the world differently. Little things that once seemed insignificant like a morning walk or a hug from a loved one—became moments to cherish. I came to understand when I needed comfort. The support I received from my community was overwhelming, and I was reminded of how powerful we are when we come together in love and faith. My church sisters, in particular, stood by me, reminding me that I was not fighting this battle alone. Together, we leaned on our collective faith, knowing that "where two or three are gathered in My name, I am there in their midst" (Matthew 18:20).



how fragile life is and how precious each breath we take truly is. My faith deepened as I recognized God's hand in every step of my recovery.

But I didn't go through this alone. My family, church family, and close friends were my rock. They lifted me up in prayer, brought me meals, and simply sat with me I also connected with other survivors, women who had walked the path I was now walking. Their strength, their vulnerability, and their willingness to share their stories gave me hope. We formed a sisterhood of survivors, bound together by a shared experience that only we could truly understand. We celebrated each other's milestones, whether it was the

end of treatment, the return of hair, or simply a day of feeling good. These women taught me that there is beauty in survival and that resilience comes from community.

Now, as a survivor, I feel a profound sense of responsibility. Breast cancer has disproportionately affected African American women, and it is more important than ever for us to be vigilant about our health. We must advocate for early detection, regular screenings, and more awareness in our communities. During the month of October, Breast Cancer Awareness Month, I stand with so many other survivors in my faith community as we declare that there is hope for a cure. Our faith drives us to action, and we use our voices to spread the message of awareness and support research initiatives that will bring us closer to ending this disease.

Through Faith for a Cure, we work to raise awareness in churches and communities across the country. It's not just about pink ribbons or fund-raising events; it's about educating our sisters, mothers, and daughters on the importance of self-examinations and mammograms. It's about creating spaces where women feel supported and empowered to share their journeys. And most importantly, it's about bringing the message of faith into the conversation about healing. We know that God is a healer, and we believe that through Him, we will see breakthroughs in breast cancer research and treatment.

Today, I live with a heart full of gratitude. I am not defined by my diagnosis, but by the strength God gave me to overcome it. My life has been forever changed, not just by surviving breast cancer, but by the deeper faith that this experience has brought into my life. Each day is a new opportunity to give thanks and to use my testimony to uplift others. I know that there are many women still fighting this battle, and I want them to know that they are not alone. With faith, love, and a community of support, we can face whatever comes our way.

Being a breast cancer survivor isn't just a title—it's a testament to my faith, my courage, and my commitment to living with purpose. I stand as a witness to the power of prayer, the strength of community, and the unyielding hope that through faith, we will find a cure.
