2024 President's Challenge:

- It's curve piecing curves, and more curves.
 - Make a quilt, table topper, wall hanging, pillow, etc. (at least 24" square or larger)
 - Make it modern (your interpretation) but use curves, skinny curves, wonky curves, etc.; let your inner modern designer go wild.
 - o Solid colors or "modern" fabric (i.e., grunge)
 - o Rulers allowed.
 - o Patterns allowed.
 - Try a background fabric other than white/black/grey (live dangerously)

Traditional Curved Piecing:

- Cut the fabric patches using templates or rulers.
- Finger press the patches to mark the center.
- Pin the pieces together, matching the center and edges.
- Sew a quarter-inch seam along the curve, gently smoothing out any bubbles.
- Press the seam toward the pie section or the background, depending on fabric contrast

Free-Form Curves:

- Cut and sew free-form curves without templates.
- Experiment with different shapes and angles.
- Insert strips of contrasting colors between the curved pieces.
- Pin, sew, and press carefully to achieve the desired design3.

Remember, curved piecing allows you to create unique and visually interesting quilt blocks. Whether you follow traditional methods or explore free-form curves, enjoy the process and let your creativity flow!
