U.S. Department of Education Investigates Washington State School District Over Alleged Sexual Assault of Female Wrestler by Male Competitor

U.S. Department of Education Press Release, February 12, 2026

Today, the U.S. Department of Education’s Office for Civil Rights (OCR) initiated a directed investigation into Puyallup School District (the District) in Puyallup, Washington based on reports that a female wrestler was sexually assaulted by a male competitor during a competition designated as a women’s wrestling event. OCR will determine whether the District violated Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (Title IX) by allowing males to compete in female sports, allowing males to access locker rooms designated for use by female students, and failing to adequately respond to allegations of sexual assault.

On Saturday December 6, 2025, the Rogers High School girl’s wrestling team travelled to district rival Emerald Ridge High School in Puyallup Washington for their first match of the 2025-2026 season. A couple of minutes into the 190-pound match between 16-year-old sophomore Kallie Keeler of Rodgers H.S. and Emerald Ridges’ Trixie Tei, Keeler was face down on the wrestling mat with Tei on top of her. Tei had her arm between Keeler’s legs and her fingers pressing into Keeler’s vagina. Keeler’s mother was taking videos of her daughters’ match, which showed a look of panic and disgust come over her daughters’ face, as she mouthed to her mom, “her fingers are in my vagina.” Keeler was allegedly so upset and confused about what had just happened that she let Tei pin her so the match would end. “I didn’t really know what to do or how to handle that situation. I just wanted the match to be over.” Kallie waited for a break in the action to talk to her coach and inform her of what she felt like was an intentional sexual assault.

Then Kallie found out that her opponent was a biological male who “identifies” as a female, named Taufase’e Tei. After Keeler told her coach Lucia Scott how uncomfortable the incident had made her feel, her coach promised to look into it. Two days later, Scott emailed Kallie’s parents and said she was unaware that Tei was a boy and would never have allowed Kallie to wrestle against him if she had known. Scott then promised Kallie’s parents she would investigate the situation further and get back to them. They never heard from Kallie’s coach again. Tei competed in five matches up to this point, winning four of them, using superior biological male strength and sexual assault techniques like he used on Keeler.

Girls Challenge School Over Boys Competing on Girls' Wrestling Team at Emerald Ridge HS

Female athletes at Emerald Ridge High School in Puyallup, Washington, are speaking out against what they describe as unfair and uncomfortable conditions after biological males joined both their wrestling team and gained access to their locker rooms.

“There’s this base level issue of really wrestling. Girls having to either forfeit or literally wrestle on a mat with a boy... Have you ever watched a wrestling match? You grab all sorts of places,” one of the Emerald H.S. biological girl wrestlers told a reporter. Her teammates complained about the fact that the two boys were allowed to use the girls’ changing spaces to the athletic department and the school’s principal. The principal emailed one of the girls’ parents, saying, “We have spoken to the two girls in question. They have agreed to utilize a different changing space for their practices...” This arrangement lasted for only one day before the biological males returned to the girls’ locker room.

The 13 female wrestlers requested a meeting with the principal and vice principal, hoping to have their concerns addressed. Instead of a solution that would have resulted in protecting the privacy of the girls, administrators gave them “information packets” with documents explaining civil rights laws which prohibit discrimination and discriminatory harassment on the basis of gender expression and gender identity in Washington state public schools. “**All** students have the right to be treated consistent with their gender identity at school... Public schools should provide access to the locker room that corresponds to a student's gender identity. Public schools may provide a separate changing schedule or use of a private area, such as a nearby restroom stall with a door or an area separated by a curtain, to any student-transgender or not-who voluntarily seek additional privacy.”

Keeler has said that she wanted this treated as a sexual assault even before she learned that Trixie Tei was a boy. The Puyallup School District policy states that “every school community member “should be treated with dignity... and socialize in physically, emotionally, and intellectually safe, respectful, and positive school and classroom environments.” Although the district has strict behavior agreements and disciplinary policies for enforcing student safety violations, it was two months before the school informed the local sheriff about the alleged sexual assault. The sheriff’s office said it forwarded the completed investigation to a juvenile prosecutor for review on Wednesday, and “it will be up to the prosecutor to make any decisions on charging.”

The Puyallup School District *only* contacted the Pierce County Sheriff’s Office *after* they were contacted by reporters on January 29. It is clear who’s civil rights the school district and the state are protecting – transgender boys instead of biological girls. Washington states “Gender-Inclusive Schools” policy protects supporters of the gender revolution, not girls. What ever happened to #MeToo, and how can liberal white women allow the rights they fought decades to achieve be overruled by Democrat Marxist policies like this?

Brooke Slusser sparks liberal social media meltdown by speaking about SJSU transgender volleyball scandal

Left-wing social media users launched a volley of insults at 23-year-old Brooke Slusser in recent days.

In response, dozens of high-profile women's rights activists have come to the former San Jose State University volleyball player's defense.

Slusser has addressed the critics herself in a statement to Fox News Digital.

"I would just say people that don't know my life or my trauma don't have room to say how good or bad my time at SJSU was. I hope they never have to understand going through something as awful as that," she said.

She has also acknowledged the responses in a series of TikTok posts, as she has become more active on the platform this week to speak about her alleged experience at SJSU.

The online hate campaign started after Slusser shared details about living arrangements in the same apartment with transgender volleyball teammate Blaire Fleming while at San Jose State University, in an interview with Fox News Digital.

During the interview, she said, "You find out you're just chilling in a bed with a man that you have no idea about... I [was] unknowingly sharing a bed at that time with a man," and alleged SJSU volleyball coach Todd Kress encouraged her to live in the same apartment as the trans teammate when another group of players was also looking for a final tenant.

The fallout of the interview has prompted high-profile activists, lawmakers and even an actor to speak out, taking a side behind or against Slusser.

Many critics echoed the sentiment that "nothing bad" happened to Slusser, despite the fact that the anxiety from the situation ultimately led to her developing an eating disorder and not being able to complete her college degree.

Oh my... The Progressive Left has got ‘it’s panties in a wad’ over the fact that another white, cisgender biological female dared to speak out against a biological male / transgender female athlete. The background for this story is as follows...

At the center of this controversy, is 6’ 1” biological male Braydon Fleming, a 2020 graduate from John Champe High School in Loudon County Virginia. Around age 14, Braydon Fleming transitioned socially and medically and became Blaire Fleming. Braydon, sorry Blaire, won a spot on her schools girls volleyball team (taking the place of a biological girl) and led them to a championship, while setting the school’s girls volleyball record with 30 kills in a match and single season record with 266 kills. Braydon, sorry, Blaire, was awarded a scholarship from San Jose State University in 2022, taking the place of a biological female volleyball player. While Blaire’s coach knew she was transgender, her teammates and opponents didn’t find out until later in the season.

The revelation caused opponents to forfeit matches rather than play against a biological male, citing fairness in women's sports as a reason for not playing. San Jose State won 14 games and was awarded another 6 wins by forfeit during the 2024 regular season and was seeded #2 in the Mountain West Tournament, before losing to Colorado State in four sets in the championship match. One of the Spartans' co-captains filed two lawsuits arguing Blaire shouldn't be on the team. An associate head coach filed a Title IX complaint against the head coach and joined a lawsuit that says the team's wins should be vacated. But the athletic department at San Jose State continued to allow Blaire to remain on the team, saying all athletes on its volleyball team were eligible under NCAA policy. The Biden Department of Justice took no action on the Title IX complaint.

Brooke Slusser was a senior on the San Jose State University volleyball team in 2024 and was the co-captain who filed the lawsuits against Fleming. With the “encouragement” of head volleyball coach Todd Kress, Slusser spent almost two years living with Fleming in a shared apartment in Santa Clara without knowing Fleming was transgender. Slusser said the discovery of Fleming's true sex deeply affected her personal life and mental health. She claims the stress later led to an eating disorder and other health worries. Slusser said she shared many personal secrets with Flemming during the time they spent as roommates, including a deep personal family trauma, something Slusser says she deeply regrets now. “You find out you're just sitting there in a bed with someone you didn't know was a man,” Slusser said in a March 2026 interview. “It's hard to process.”

“Watching movies snuggled up in bed, like, all the normal things you'd think girls do in an apartment... I would have changed everything about what I was doing in that apartment if I would have known that it was a man.” Slusser said she holds head coach Kress most responsible for causing the stress and her mental problems, for suggesting she live in “the villa” with Fleming, knowing she was a biological male and there was another house of volleyball players she could have lived with. “Todd Kress, knowing this person was a man, and saying that I'm going to ‘fit in better’ with these girls on my volleyball team, couldn't have been further from the truth,” Slusser said. Flemming claimed Slusser already had an eating disorder and said, “So I really don't care or feel bad for her...”

Melissa Batie-Smoose, was the Spartans' assistant coach who filed the Title IX complaint against the head coach, claiming SJSU's transgender-inclusion policy created a toxic environment for female athletes and Fleming had received favorable treatment from the coach and athletic department. Batie-Smoose was suspended days after the university found out about the lawsuit, upsetting many women on the team who looked to her as the one person who would stand up for them against Fleming. The team was called to a meeting after Batie-Smoose was suspended and told not to reach out to her or speak to her at all. It later came out that Batie-Smoose did not know Fleming was a male until two weeks into her tenure as assistant coach, after she asked head coach Todd Kress about it. She also told reporters that she was threatened not to tell the players or their parents, or she would be fired. No one was allowed to know, she said. Well, Batie-Smoose did tell, and she was fired.

The U.S. Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights announced on January 28, that it had determined San Jose State University violated Title IX and had 10 days to comply with a series of agreements or risk enforcement action. “SJSU caused significant harm to female athletes by allowing a male to compete on the women’s volleyball team—creating unfairness in competition, compromising safety, and denying women equal opportunities in athletics, including scholarships and playing time... Even worse, when female athletes spoke out, SJSU retaliated—ignoring sex-discrimination claims while subjecting one female SJSU athlete (Brooke Slusser) to a Title IX complaint for allegedly ‘misgendering’ the male athlete competing on a women’s team,” Education Department Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights Kimberly Richey said when announcing the decision.

On March 6, 2026, San Jose State University President Cynthia Teniente-Matson announced that the school and the California State University (CSU) system were suing the federal government to challenge the U.S. Department of Education's determination that SJSU violated Title IX in its handling of the Blaire Fleming situation.

“Our support for the LGBTQ members of our community ... remains unwavering,” Teniente-Matson said. San Jose State University’s “mission statement” says; *SJSU is an empowering institution enrolling students from a range of backgrounds, fostering inclusion, and embracing talent from diverse cultures from our region and across the globe...*

We are committed to fostering an environment grounded in equity, dignity, and respect for every individual.

We embrace a culture of care and respect that delivers on our commitments to transparency, honesty and integrity to each other and those we serve. We hold ourselves to the highest ethical standards.

But at San Jose State University, as throughout the state of California, biological women are afforded inclusion and care and respect only as long as they toe the line on gender inclusion and don’t make any waves. Biological women are expected to share bathrooms, locker rooms, bedrooms and the athletic court with biological men. Brooke Slusser did not return to SJSU for her final semester at the insistence of her parents, who said they saw the ‘physical toll; the season had taken on their daughter. “You’re not going back. You can go get your stuff next summer when your lease is up, and stay here,” her father Paul Slusser told the reporter. Slusser ended up withdrawing from the university, losing her scholarship and costing her parents the full semester's worth of tuition and housing.

The . Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights said that SJSU must meet the following terms to avoid enforcement action:

- * Issue a public statement to the SJSU community that SJSU will adopt biology-based definitions of the words ‘male’ and ‘female’ and acknowledge that the sex of a human – male or female – is unchangeable;

- * Specify that SJSU will follow Title IX by separating sports and intimate facilities based on biological sex;

- * State that SJSU will not delegate its obligation to comply with Title IX to any external association or entity and will not contract with any entity that discriminates on the basis of sex;
- * Restore to individual female athletes all individual athletic records and titles misappropriated by male athletes competing in women's categories, and issue a personalized letter of apology on behalf of SJSU to each female athlete for allowing her participation in athletics to be marred by sex discrimination; and
- * Send a personalized apology to every woman who played in SJSU's women's indoor volleyball (2022–2024), 2023 beach volleyball, and to any woman on a team that forfeited rather than compete against SJSU while a male student was on the roster—expressing sincere regret for placing female athletes in that position.

President Cynthia Teniente-Matson responded, "... we have a responsibility to defend the integrity of our institution and the rule of law, while ensuring that every member of our community is treated fairly and in accordance with the law. Our position is simple: We have followed the law and cannot be punished for doing so." Again, atheists, non-Christians, progressive liberals, people of color and the LGBTQ+ members of the San Jose State community will receive fair treatment under Cynthia Teniente-Matson. White, cisgender biological men and women, Christians, Jews and conservatives will just have to 'suck it up' and deal with it...
