OUR HISTORY AT A GLANCE

1994-2003

Origins as Allen County Hospital Foundation

Founded to support the Allen County Hospital while it was leased to Health Midwest, a regional nonprofit hospital system.

2003

Transition to Allen County Health Care Foundation (ACHCF)

After Health Midwest sold its hospital assets to HCA, a for-profit corporation, our organization could no longer directly support hospital operations. The foundation amended its charter, adopted the name Allen County Health Care Foundation, and broadened its mission to support the overall health needs of Allen County.

2010-2013

Supporting the New Allen County Regional Hospital

As plans for the new regional hospital moved forward, ACHCF served as the charitable partner for fundraising. Community volunteers helped raise more than \$2 million to equip the new hospital.

2012

Becoming a Community Foundation

ACHCF qualified for a Kansas Health Foundation initiative to strengthen community philanthropy. The foundation changed its name to Allen County Community Foundation (ACCF) and began building long-term charitable resources for the region. The Kansas Health Foundation provided more than \$400,000 in matching funds, helping grow endowments that continue generating annual grant support today.


Expanding Our Reach

Crucial Funding for Local Organizations

Match Month is Your Community Foundation's annual campaign to grow permanent endowment funds that provide lasting support for local nonprofits and community causes. During this campaign, every donation is matched from a match pool of \$100,000. Since the first campaign in 2023, giving has grown from \$79,000 to \$105,000 in 2025, showing the impact of donors coming together. These endowment funds invest gifts to provide sustainable, long-term support and help build a stronger community for the future.

Established in 2025 through the endowment grant initiative, the Hope Unlimited Fund provides lasting support for Hope Unlimited's mission to serve victims of domestic violence and sexual assault by sustaining critical, trauma informed services for individuals and families across the region for generations to come.

The Growing Place Fund was established through the endowment grant initiative to support the long term sustainability of The Growing Place and its mission to nurture children through a safe, developmentally appropriate, Montessori inspired learning environment where they can grow and thrive.



The USD 257 Alumni Endowment Fund, established in 2025, exists to invest in the future of USD 257 by supporting school based projects and opportunities that contribute to strong, vibrant learning environments.


Masterson Family Youth Recreation Endowment Fund

YCF COMMUNITY GRANT CYCLE

Each year, our community grant cycle supports programs that address pressing local needs. These grants help nonprofits fund projects and cover essential expenses. Supported by the KHF Health Endowment Fund and the YCF Public Health Endowment Fund, grant awards have grown from \$8,200 in 2018 to \$24,741 in 2025, demonstrating the impact of community generosity and an effective investment strategy.

2025 Community Grant Cycle Recipients:

\$1,500 – Southwind Extension Educational Foundation
To purchase a transportable AED for the Iola Extension Office and Allen County Fairgrounds.

Supports the Zero Reasons Why mental health campaign in local schools.


\$5,000 – Allen County Recycling


Asset Growth



Performance Breakdown


