Cabinet Installation

If the design layout incorporates Cabinet(s), assemble the Cabinet(s) now using the instructions that come with the Cabinet.



Drawer and/or Adjustable Shelf Installation

If the design layout incorporates Cabinets with drawers and/ or adjustable shelfing, assemble the drawers now with the instructions that come with the drawers and install as shown.





Shelf Installation



There are 3 ways to fasten a Wood Shelf to a Wood Shelf bracket. #1 is the preferred method with additional security of the Shelf by adding #2 or #3 options.

1. Turn a #6 x 2" Flat head screw through the center of the Wood Shelf Bracket and into the Woodshelf.

2. Push a Wood Shelf Attachment Extrusion into the groove of the Wood Shelf Bracket. Peel the paper backing off of the Extrusion. Stick the Wood Shelf to the Extrusion.

3. Place the Wood Shelf Clip into the groove of the Wood Shelf Bracket. Then fasten the Wood Shelf Clip to the Wood Shelf with a $\#8 \ge 9/16$ " Wafer Head Screw.

(If attaching the product to a wall made of concrete, plaster, or other material, purchase and use the appropriate mounting hardware. The attachment hardware must be rated to provide a minimum of 100 pounds of pull strength.)
• Overloaded drawers and shelves.	 Risk of injury. Top-heavy furniture can tip over. Overloaded drawers or shelves can break. 	 Never exceed the weight limits shown in the instructions. Work from bottom to top when loading shelves and drawers. Place the heavier items on the lower shelves or in lower drawers.
