A32 comes from a long line of fertile, productive and enduring cows. Her dam, the best daughter of her sire J54, produced here until the age of thirteen, as did her maternal granddam. That cow, GK Golden Lil S94, is also the paternal great-granddam. A32 is freckle-faced, with very good eye pigment for resistance to eye problems. Genetically inclined toward longevity, this young cow should produce daughters and granddaughters even more valuable than she is herself.

The pedigree above shows six Sires and Dams of Distinction. That is no accident. On the fifth generation, just off the pedigree, are nine more. In our opinion, that distinction is far more economically important than a national championship or any other award an animal can receive, because it signifies the ability of that animal to function well in its home pasture and adapt to the environment. The higher the quality of the herd in general, and the smaller the herd, the more difficult it is to achieve. To do this on forage only is even more of a feat. The baby bull calf tag F80 by A16, born 10/3/18 could carry on that tradition. It's in his genes for six generations and more. Take the pair home,. Let F80 adapt to your herd's environment and management. He could reward you for a long time.

The dam of B43 was P34, an extremely fertile cow, with eleven calves and a short calving interval. B43 looks a lot like her mother. Both of B43's granddams, A1 and C62, were Dams of Distinction, with eleven calves each. H65, her dam's sire, qualified as a Sire of Distinction without having semen collected or being used for artificial insemination. H65 simply bred many cows here, siring 62 natural calves for our small herd in his day—a rare grass/performance bull. We sold a total of 23 bulls and breeding females from him. Eight daughters sold to Alex Mih's MM Ranch in Kansas. Two, R32 & R34, became Dams of Distinction. Granddaughter R17, sold to John & Linda Holden in Montana, also achieved DOD status. Productivity and longevity are bred in here for many generations; ditto for her promising grass-type June 18 heifer calf at side:

Both fertility and high performance on grass run deep in the pedigree of this young cow, with seven Sires & Dams of Distinction in her pedigree including all three DWF cows on her maternal line.

Her granddam, 7L, had 12 excellent calves in our herd, including herd sire W37.

The first daughter of B5 will remain in our herd, the second is F20, the calf at her side, born 4/7/2018, sired by herd sire HF Victor 963 1508 above. Cow B05 was pasture exposed to 1508 from June 10 to Sept. 6, 2018. This young cow has done everything right her first two times calving, and like her ancestors, when she stops growing, she will be an easy-fleshing fertile female and an economic asset.

The paternal granddam, the 7L cow, was another highly productive cow that was a Dam of Distinction repeatedly and worked here until the age of 13. Productivity and longevity are bred into this one.

Again, I don't want to sell this heifer. Her Lady M cow family is probably our most fertile, going back seven generations. Some of the females in this line are among our heaviest-milking as well—a high-powered combination for success on grass. This would describe her dam, the X3 cow, whom I consider one of our top five cows. We are using a maternal brother to this heifer, Centrix C88, sired by HF 360 Victor 100,. E22 is a dark red attractive yearling, and is my bet as one that will develop into highly productive cow.

The sire of this D34 heifer, the A251 bull, is a flush-mate to the Bennett Bloodline A260 bull at Knoll Crest Farms in Virginia. A251 is smaller framed and thicker than most of our bulls. Paul Bennett predicted that one of the six bulls from that flush would become a great female producer. This could be the bull.

The dam of D34 is B17, a fertile, productive daughter of HF 360 Victor 1002. So far, B17 has done everything right. On her maternal line, D34 traces back to the great 8D01 cow at Don Ramos Ranch in Texas. Although she is mostly Victor Domino for good Southern adaptability and maternal quality, she also carries some high-performance Hereford genetics on both sides of her pedigree.

This second offering of the A251 daughters comes from another highly fertile cow family. Research tells us that fertility is not always highly heritable, but we have a couple of families of cows that have defied those findings, producing multiple generations that exhibit more fertility than their peers. The anchor cow at the back of this pedigree, the A1 cow, a Dam of Distinction, and her grandmother 43R, are the foundations of one of those highly fertile cow families. D18 was a heifer's first calf. From cow A1 to cow A53 is a period of 22 years, with P34 at year fourteen in between. This heifer's dam A53 and two of her maternal sisters remain in the herd, along with D18's maternal sister, F18.

This heifer's sire, the U2 bull, was our heaviest weanling ever at 850 lbs., a high-growth sire that was still very sound when we sold him at 9 yrs. Granddam 0104 was bred at McMinn Ranch and came here as a four-year old from Teddy Gentry's Bent Tree Farm in Alabama. She produced a very good calf for us every year for the next ten years.

The dam of E16 is among our most devoted maternal females, a direct descendant on her maternal side of the E4 and 501U cows. The only reason we did not register her is that she has some extra white beyond her 13th rib. She will most likely make a good mama cow, and can be registered if the buyer wishes. If you want to breed her to a black bull, the hybrid vigor she will provide should give you some growthy calves with extra pounds; The extra white signifies nothing negative in our opinion, and actually seems to help with heat tolerance.

A straight, strong daughter of the good Tate bull, and a real beef cow with many years of productive life remaining, A26 has such a gentle personality that our grandchildren can pet her. A daughter of A26 by the W37 bull, D71, remains in the herd. During last winter's sub-zero January weather, her fall-born bull calf E54 died of pneumonia. In full disclosure, this cow's udder structure, though functional, no longer meets our standards for registered breeding stock, so she must go. (We have several other cows gentle enough for the grandchildren to pet.)
