On Sept. 28th, 2023, the day after the finale episode aired, Lavender took to Facebook: "Everybody, please don't be disappointed that I got eliminated. I have already won in my own way, because doors are opening for me...I am also feeling like the universe is protecting me from taking on more than I can handle, because I cannot handle the pressures of a neurotypical artist in the professional world".

Of "America's Got Talent," Lavender's father Wil said, "The experience is not about the winner. This experience is about elevating talent in a world that might not have been seen otherwise. There isn't always a home in the world for these acts." Of the winner, dog trainer Adrian Stoica and his border collie, Hurricane, for whom she autographed a piece of confetti, Lavender shared: "Adrian Stoika and Hurricane deserved the win! I'm so happy for them, they are one of my most favorite acts!"

Ultimately, no one lost in that final episode. As the cameras panned the crowd to a tearful and joyous Wil and Jamie, their faces illuminated with pride and love, the victory of making it to the finale was not just Lavender's; it was a triumph for the entire Darcangelo family. Their story became a beacon of hope for families navigating similar journeys, showcasing the transformative power of love, acceptance and the celebration of individual beauty and identity.
