INTRODUCTION

Spring in Dallas holds a special place in the hearts of Oak Cliff residents David Hudgens and Korbin King. The duo eagerly anticipates the arrival of tulip season each year. For two decades, they have meticulously cultivated over 2000 tulips in their gardens, reaching peak bloom in March. To honor this floral extravaganza, David and Korbin host an annual Tulip Party, inviting friends and family to revel in the vibrant array of tulip varieties that grace their grounds.

EARLY ROOTS IN OAK CLIFF

In 1998, after a two-year courtship, David persuaded Korbin to relocate from Dallas' Uptown/Oak Lawn to Oak Cliff. A historic enclave annexed in 1903, Oak Cliff maintains its unique identity as one of Dallas' well-established neighborhoods. The couple, drawn to the classic English Tudorstyle homes, purchased their first property in the Kessler Square district in 1998. Following a three-year renovation journey, they settled in their current residence, a 1928-built home, in 2001.
