Rules & regulations 2020 General show rules

The management may add, cancel, combine or divide classes. All judge's decisions are FINAL. The USEF rulebook may be used to resolve any questions. Martingales or tie-downs are prohibited in all under saddle classes. Alcohol or controlled substances are prohibited both for humans and horses and the use of such is cause for expulsion from show grounds without refund of entry fees.

Stallions - may only be shown by riders/handlers 18 & over. They cannot be shown in Beginner W/T/C.

Rider Attire - **All 17 & under riders in ALL divisions and ALL seats are required to wear ASTM/SEI certified helmets, including lead-line riders, when mounted. (Regardless of seat and will not be penalized) Riders of all ages must wear helmets when mounted outside of the show ring. Riders must wear proper attire for all classes entered, with the exception of Therapeutic Riding-class. Classes will not be held for tack or clothing changes without prior notice to management. Even with notice, holds should be limited to approximately 4 minutes. Class will be called if hold is too long.

Tack – Horses should have appropriate tack for discipline being shown. For example, flat saddles and full bridles for saddleseat. Huntseat riders must use bridles or plain leather halters for showmanship classes.

Points & Awards - 1 award and 6 ribbons per class with the following exceptions: 8 ribbons in Walk/Trot 9 & under and Walk/Trot 10-12, Lead Line and Therapeutic Riding-Class. Points are calculated as follows:

Seventh & Eighth place receive 0 points. *Only HRC members in good standing may accrue points. Same horse/rider combination must show at a minimum of 2 shows for points to count for year-end awards. Points will be considered final one week after publication, excluding printing or addition errors.

Membership dues - Membership application forms received the day of the show **MUST** be submitted and paid in full at the time of registration. Payment must be in the form of cash or separate check. Membership form must be correctly filled out with date of birth for juniors before the start of classes. *No points will be awarded retroactively!

Pre-entries- pre-entries must be received by 9 p.m. the Friday prior to the show, no exceptions. To be eligible for pre-entry rate, entries must be received on time and be complete. No numbers will be issued without payment and proof of current coggins. Please mail early, no phone entries! Pre-Entrants may add a class on the day of the show for pre-entry prices.

Post-entries- are defined as:

- Entries received after 9 p.m. the Friday prior to the show.
- Entries submitted the morning of the show.

All entries *must be paid by Cash, Check, or a blank, signed check prior to receiving an entry number.*

*****RETURNED CHECKS***** a service charge of \$25 per check will be levied. All monies owed to HRC must be remitted within 15 days of the date of the dunning notice. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of points accumulated toward year-end awards in all divisions shown at the show in which the check was received.

Coggins test- a legible copy of a current, (within 1 Year) negative coggins test must be submitted for each horse or pony entered in the show. For your and our convenience, a copy may be left with the show manager, and will be kept on file to be used at all HRC shows. *If copy is *outdated (over 1 year), or illegible, no entry number will be issued.*

Entry number-One new entry number will be issued to each horse and rider combination for the 2020 season. Lost numbers will result in an additional number fee of \$5.

Cross Entries – Cross entries are permitted where horse and/or rider is eligible for that division. See Division Specifications and/or Class Specifications.

Adding/dropping classes- Use the add/drop form and fill it out completely. Please be courteous and drop or add classes as early as possible. Post-entrants may add classes on the day of the show at post-entry price. Each class can be added and/or dropped only once. No refunds for additional requests.

Juniors- riders shall be under 18 years of age as of January 1st of this show year. Juniors shall not show stallions. Juniors are required to wear helmets in all under saddle classes and will not be penalized for doing so.

Adults- riders 18 years of age as of January 1st of this show year. Adults are strongly urged to wear helmets in all classes and will not be penalized for doing so.

Horses- kickers must be marked by a red ribbon on the tail (available at entry booth). Any horse endangering the safety of another horse, rider, show official, or spectator will be excused from the class and/or show. Illness, lameness, unruliness, or signs thereof, shall be cause for dismissal from the ring.

Gaited horses - are welcome to show in all eligible divisions but rider must be attired appropriately for that division and horses must be able to perform the appropriate gaits. i.e. Hunt attire – trot/canter, Western – jog/lope. Breed attire and alternate gaits permitted in Walk/Trot, Pony or Adult classes.

Complaints- Show complaints should be presented to the show manager by the end of the show. If the problem is not resolved by the end of the show, the complaint must be submitted in writing, dated, signed and received by the show manager within seven days after the show. Complaints must be registered by the individual, legal guardian or trainer involved. Complaints will be addressed by the board at the next meeting. The Board's decision will be based on their interpretation of the rules.

Division Specifications

1. **Leadline 7 & under**- open to riders 7 years of age or under as of January 1st, of this show year. Exhibitors will show at the walk and individually at the trot or jog. Leaders are to be on foot and must be over 18 years old and an experienced handler. *Tank tops, shorts, open-toed shoes or sandals, bare feet are not acceptable attire for handlers. Lead-Line riders are eligible to compete in Lead Line and Costume classes only. Equitation class is to be judged with emphasis on equitation. Suitability class is to be judged with emphasis on pleasure and suitability of horse or pony to rider. Trail Class is to be judged with emphasis on the rider's efforts and control of his/her horse.

2. **Leadline 8 & over**- open to riders 8 years of age or over as of January 1st of this show year. (See Leadline 7 & under for division/class specifications).

3. **Walk/trot**- walk/trot divisions for riders who cannot canter or lope or have never cantered or loped at any show or on any show grounds. Shows are defined as any event where equitation classes are offered or where equitation is part of the judging criteria. **If you wish to ride in walk/trot and do not qualify but have extenuating circumstances, please contact the board in**

advance of your first show. Rider's age is as of January 1st of this show year. Horse/rider combination is eligible to ride in Walk/Trot Games, Costume and Purina class. Walk/Trot riders cannot cross enter into any walk/trot/canter division classes, including Showmanship.

4. **Huntseat** – walk/trot/canter divisions split into two age groups – Junior Exhibitor (17 & under as of Jan. 1st) and a Senior division (18 & over as of Jan. 1st) Beginner W/T/C riders are not eligible for this division.

5. **Western**- a walk/jog/lope division for all ages. Helmets are optional for riders 18 years and over but juniors must wear a helmet. A junior horse/pony 5 years of age and under (USEF states for competition purposes any horse is considered to be one year old on the first day of January following the actual date of foaling), ridden western, may be ridden two handed with a bosal or appropriate snaffle. No horse or pony older than 5 years of age may do so.

6. **Pony**- pony may be ridden by any age rider. All ponies must be 14.2hh or less. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter.

7. **Therapeutic Riding** - for physically or mentally challenged riders. Riders may not enter in any other divisions with the exception of Costume class.

8. **Green horse**- a walk/trot class for "green" horses who are in their 1st or 2nd season of showing under saddle. These horses are not eligible for any other divisions with the exception of Driving, Leadline, Costume and walk/trot games. Rider may enter individually where eligible. Horses in this division have never cantered at any show.

9. **Beginner Walk/Trot/Canter** – a beginner division for all ages and seats. Division is limited to riders who have never cantered or loped at any show or on any show grounds prior to this show season. Rider may not enter in any other classes or divisions, with the exception of driving and costume. Horses/ponies may be shown by another rider in other divisions or classes at the same show. Riders are eligible for this division for one year.

10. **Games divisions** – (Open and Walk/Trot) no day-end championship awarded. However, year-end awards will be presented. *games divisions include all Command, Egg & Spoon, and Sit-a-buck classes. *Helmets and boots are mandatory for all riders, all seats, all ages, in all games classes!

11. **In Hand** – Open to horses, ponies and miniature horses that are not being shown under saddle. Showmanship and trail class will be shown in hand. Equines may not cross enter into other classes with the exception of driving and costume (horse may not be ridden in costume). Handlers may enter in other classes with another horse where eligible, but they are not eligible for the Spectators & Grooms class. In Hand Showmanship winners may compete in the Showmanship Challenge but are not eligible for the under saddle Supreme classes.

12. **Adult** – Open division where rider and horse may cross enter where eligible into other divisions with the exception of Walk/Trot, Pony, Therapeutic Riding-Class or Lead Line. Rider must be 18 or over.

Class Specifications

1. **Trail**- trail course will close at an announced time. Riders are responsible for completing the trail class. No refunds will be given to riders who do not complete the class in a timely manner. Leadline trail must be completed by lunch break, leadline riders will be given preference in line.

2. **Equitation Limit**- (Walk/Trot) Open to walk/trot riders who have not won 3 or more blue ribbons in equitation at any show (HRC and non-HRC) in any year prior to today's show.

3. **Showmanship**- classes shall be judged on the exhibitor's ability to show a horse/pony in hand with an emphasis in fitting (i.e. cleanliness of horse, tack and attire.) Horses must remain in ring until judge's card is turned in to ringmaster. Entrants must ask ringmaster for permission to leave

ring before end of class. This class is not a halter class, conformation of the horse/pony not to count. To be shown in a suitable halter or bridle and proper attire for handler.

4. **Showmanship Challenge**- exhibitors placing first in each showmanship class (all divisions) from any HRC or affiliated show in a calendar year will be eligible to participate in the Showmanship Challenge at the **HRC September Open Show**. Note: exhibitor must be a member of HRC in good standing to qualify. Same horse/handler combination must be used in the challenge class. No substitution of horse or exhibitor is allowed. Winner will be announced at the Awards Banquet.

5. **Purina Senior Challenge**- a walk/trot class for all Walk/Trot and Walk/Trot/Canter or Lope horses over the age of 15 as of January 1st of this show year. Sponsored by Hanson Grain and Purina Feeds.

6. **Open Driving**- Horse/Pony to be shown at a walk, collected trot and working trot. Exhibitors may be asked to back up. Junior drivers must have a header. All juniors in cart must wear a helmet. Headers are optional for Adult drivers. Shown only single in harness.

7. **Pleasure Driving**- Horse/Pony to be shown at a flat-footed walk, pleasure trot and a working trot. Exhibitors must stand quietly and back readily. A junior driver must have a header. All juniors in cart must wear a helmet. Headers are optional for Adult drivers. Shown only single in harness.

8. **Spectator Leadline** – for any rider who has not competed in any other class that day with the exception of costume. To be shown at a walk-only and led by a qualified adult handler.

9. **Spectators & Grooms** – for any rider that has not competed in any class that day with the exception of costume. To be shown at the walk and trot/jog only. Proper show attire is not required, however, helmets are required.

10. **Benefit Costume Class** – open to all horses and riders. Shown at the walk only. Proceeds from this class will be donated to a charity to be determined by the class winner.

11. **Egg & Spoon**– game class where last rider with egg remaining on their spoon wins. Thumbs to remain behind the line. To be shown in both directions at different gaits.

12. **Sit-a-buck** – game class where last rider with "buck" remaining under leg wins. To be shown in both directions at different gaits.

13. **Horsemanship Classics** - (Open and Walk-Trot) Horsemanship is judged on the rider's appearance and position in the saddle, and their ability to control their horse, as indicated by the horse's performance in the maneuvers prescribed in the class. The horse should move naturally, quietly and smoothly throughout their performance. The horse and rider should give the appearance of confidence and ease of movement. The judge will be looking specifically at the basic riding position, the smoothness and correctness of the class maneuvers, and the correctness of the pattern which will be posted that date. Rail work to be performed first, judge may excuse riders before pattern. Top 3 places will receive voucher for monetary prize – 1st place 25%, 2nd place 15%, and 3rd place 10% of class entry fees. Special entry fee of \$20.

Please note: Highlighted areas are changes or additions to the rules since last posting.

HANSON RIDING CLUB
BY-LAWS
Amended as of February 16, 2020

Article I – Name

The name of this organization shall be the Hanson Riding Club, Inc., and shall be referred to hereafter as such.

Article II – Objects

The objectives of the association are to foster, encourage and promote the general interest, welfare, and study of the horse; to ride the trails, hold horse shows, other equine activities and to make high score awards to the leading point winners at shows and trail rides according to the scoring system and rules adopted in 1956, together with amendments and revisions as subsequently adopted.

Article III – Policy

The policy of the organization shall be to cooperate with and assist various local organizations in their efforts in all phases of horse activities in accordance with Chapter 180 General Laws. No profits shall inure to any individual member of this corporation from club-sanctioned activities other than essential paid positions.

Article IV – Membership and Dues

Membership in this organization shall be granted after an application for the same has been submitted by the interested party to the membership secretary (chairperson). Membership is open to individuals, families, and juniors.

- a) Adult Membership: Members over eighteen years of age on the preceding 1st of January.
- b) Junior Membership: Members under eighteen years of age on the preceding 1st of January.
- c) Family Membership: Members shall be considered to consist of a Parent(s) or Guardian(s) and any of their “Junior” children residing in the same household.
- d) Life Membership: An individual member who has paid a lifetime membership fee.

Article V - Rules of Procedure

All business shall be conducted in accordance with “Robert’s Rules of Order”:

Article VI – Powers and Duties of Officers

Elections will be held on an annual basis at the final open meeting for positions that are expiring, some special elections may be held to prevent multiple concurrent vacancies.

Section 1: President:

- a) The President shall preside over board meetings, delegate duties, appoint committees and appoint chairmen for special functions at open meetings.

Section 2: Vice President:

- a) The Vice President shall preside over meetings and carry on duties of the president during his or her absence.

Section 3: Recording Secretary:

- a) The Recording Secretary keeps complete records of the proceedings of the club.

Section 4: Treasurer:

- a) The treasurer shall receive and disburse all funds of the club, keep the accounts.
- b) Prior approval of the board shall be sufficient warrant for the payment of any indebtedness to the club.
- c) Shall be responsible for renewing insurance policies for club.

- d) Books shall be audited annually by an audit committee comprised of the treasurer and two HRC NON board members, and appointed by the board.

Article VII – Board of Directors

Section 1: Henceforth, the Board of Directors shall be called the board.

Section 2: The board will consist of:

- a) Officers (as described in Article VI) for a two year term.
- b) The immediate past President as advisory only (for 1 year).
- c) Eight members elected at large:
 1. Two for a one year term.
 2. Two for a two year term
 3. Two for a three year term
 4. Two alternate for a one year term

Section 3: Any board member or officer who is absent 3 times in a fiscal year (unless absence was excused by board) shall be required to resign. The vacancy shall be filled by the alternate board member or by the board.

Section 4: Two alternate board members shall be chosen from the list of those running for a position but not selected, and shall replace any board member who is absent or who may have abstained from their duties through resignation or removal.

Section 5: Membership Secretary – Shall keep accurate dated records of membership and will provide current lists of members to the board and/or other committees as needed with approval by the board for purposes of club use only.

Section 6: Point Secretary – Shall keep updated lists of members' points on horse shows and trail rides, making point standings available, after events, to the newsletter editor for publication.

Final points will be totaled after the last HRC event of the season and then posted for approval and publication as year-end final standings. Point Secretary may appoint a committee to review points as needed.

Section 7: Appointed Chairmanship:

- a) Legislative Chairperson – To keep members informed of upcoming legislative actions that can affect us in any way, horse related issues and to advise on voting for, or writing to individual legislators.
- b) Trail Rides Chairperson: To run pleasure/judged trail rides in accordance with the N.E.H.T. rule book, to handle all aspects of each ride.
- c) Activities Chairperson: To run an event for the sole purpose and enjoyment of the members and their families.

All preceding positions shall be appointed by the board with a 2/3 majority vote.

Article VIII– Meetings

Section 1: Open meetings shall be a minimum of once a year. Open meetings may include but are not limited to clinics, demonstration and guest speakers. Dates will be posted in the newsletter, on the website, by electronic or special mailing.

Board meetings of the club shall be held on the first Friday of each month or at the request of the president and/or the board of directors.

Section 2: Quorum: 15 members shall constitute a quorum at an open HRC meeting. 6 board members will constitute a quorum at a board meeting.

Section 3: Voting Requirements: All club members in good standing at an open meeting are eligible to vote, except Junior Members.

Section 4: Nominations: Open positions will be posted on the website and social media. Nominations will be accepted up to November 1st. Candidates will be posted in the Winter newsletter with ballot.

Section 5: Voting: Available Officer and Board Member positions will be voted on once a year at the January banquet. Ballots will be provided at the meeting and write ins will be accepted. Absentee ballots will be made available by mail and digitally.

Article IX – Removal of Officers, Board Members, Chairmen, General Members

The procedure to have any member removed is as follows:

- a) The board has the power to dismiss any member for non-payment of dues, disorderly conduct, un-sportsman like conduct, inhumane treatment to an animal, or conduct detrimental to Hanson Riding Club Inc.
- b) Written notice of complaint must be received by the board within one week of the date of the incident in order to be presented for discussion at the next board meeting.
- c) The member against whom the complaint has been filed will be notified in writing with specifics of the complaint and given ample opportunity to be heard before the board at the following meeting.
- d) A 2/3 majority vote of the board is required for dismissal.
- e) An appeal of the decision may be made in writing within ten days to the board and to be placed on the agenda of the next open meeting for a vote.

Article X – General Complaints

- a) Complaints or concerns regarding a specific incident at any HRC event or function must be reported within 24 hours to the event chairperson.
- b) Complaints not filed or resolved the day of the incident must be submitted in writing, dated, signed and received by the board within 7 days after the incident.
- c) Issue will be discussed at the following board meeting with a 2/3 vote for resolution.
- d) Claimant will receive notification of resolution in writing.

Article XI – Amendments

These by-laws may be presented for amendment by:

- a) The Board.
- b) Any member in good standing may present, in writing, to any member of the board, any proposal to amend. Changes will be discussed at the next board meeting.
- c) Written notification will be sent to the general membership for a mail-in vote. Lack of response to a mail-in vote will constitute agreement.
