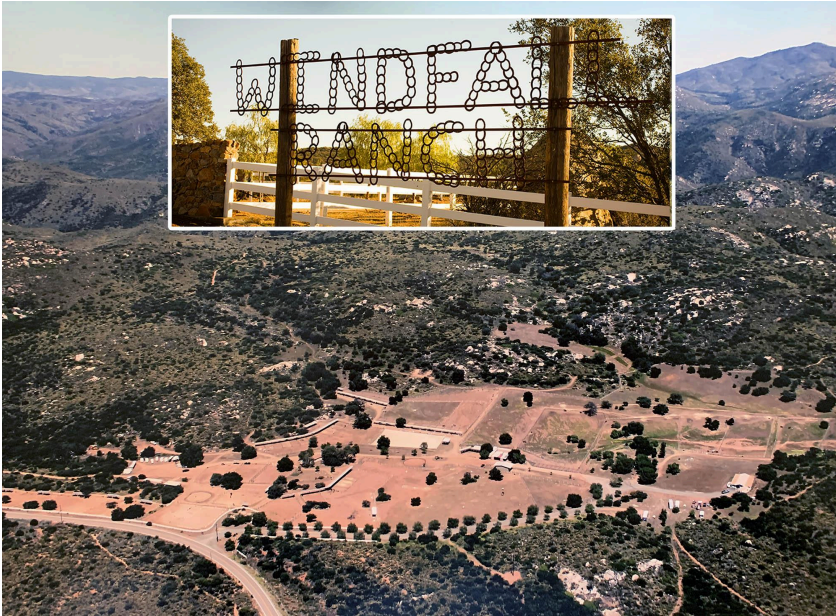

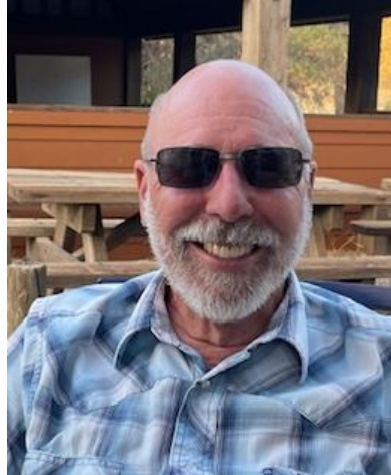

It's close to our house. There are some nice trails here; one leads to the mine. I like their shower and dinner area facilities. -Jim King



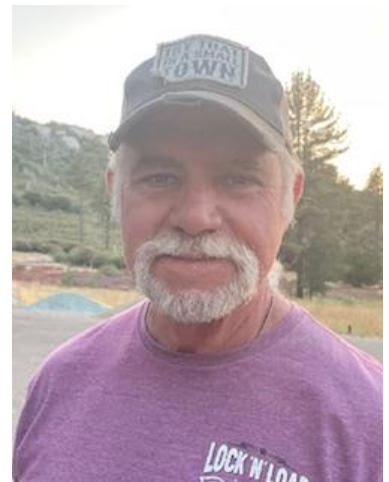

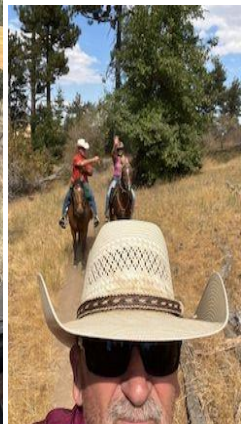


It's close to the lake. Good trails and the bathroom facilities. -Bob Whining

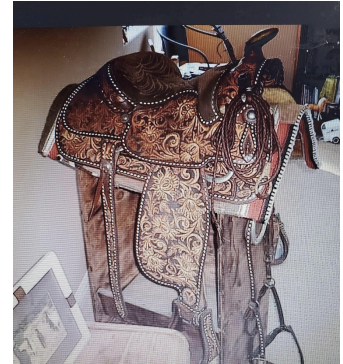



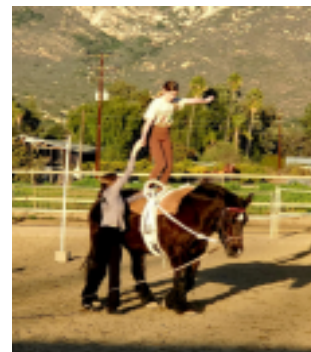
