

Horse Manure: The Magic Key in the Garden

From horse manure to Spring blooms and veggies

Now that Spring is here, many people turn to their gardens with a critical eye. The budding landscaper and master gardener in us begins to picture colorful blooms and vegetables tucked in planned out areas around the house and yard.

Being horse owners, we are already ahead of the game as we have a regular supply of earth feeding nutrients from our generous horses. Composting manure is easy and with a minimum of materials you can be on your way to rich, life nurturing soil. Why is horse manure so advantageous to compost? It has a nearly perfect ratio of Carbon to Nitrogen (C:N 25:1) which helps speed up decomposition. Microbes need carbon for energy and Nitrogen for protein.



There is a one bin, two bin and three bin system that can meet your needs depending on how much manure you would like to compost. Just piling up manure is not composting. The advantage to managing manure by composting is that fly larvae, parasite eggs, and weed seeds can be eliminated and pathogens will be killed off by the heat. (The microbes generate a lot of heat during the active phase.) The

temperature should be between 130 and 160 degrees Fahrenheit.

The best system consists of three bins, ideally set to take advantage of gravity to fill them. One bin, the composting bin, is for the fresh manure to be added (2-4 feet high if you are not using a tumbler) while the next bin, the curing bin, sits and matures and the third bin, the user ready bin, holds the small mound of nutrient rich mulch ready to enhance the garden. If you have one to three horses you could get by with a two-bin system.

For a one bin system, you would pile the manure in the bin, add water to moisten and turn the compost from time to time. (Usually every four to five days.) If you do not add new manure, you can add the compost to the soil in four to six months. If you begin to use the compost at the former time period it is best to add gardening soil to the mixture at about a 1:1 ratio so that the manure doesn't burn the roots. You can also add blood meal, bat guano, or bone meal and perlite (for better drainage) or vermiculite (for better water retention) depending on the plants that are benefiting from the addition.

A two bin system enables the gardener to start a fresh bin while the second bin ages. You will continue to turn the two bins. Adding the third bin provides a holding area for usable compost.

Your compost will need air and moisture. Turning causes air pockets which provides oxygen for microorganisms, controls the temperature and produces aerobic microbes. Be sure to use a cover that lets in oxygen; such as, a compost tarp, a cover with small holes or spaces or a roof with a slant. Fresh manure has moisture but you will need to add more occasionally to keep the pile from drying out, but you don't want to soak the pile in water.

If you want to add kitchen waste to your compost bin you will add the scraps to the new bin but you will need a little more brown (carbon) to green (nitrogen) material (At a 3:1 ratio) Brown material is dry leaves, paper bags, straw, wood chips, and old manure. Green is fresh manure, fruit and vegetable scraps and grass clippings. Be sure to avoid meat, fat or oils.

Your plants, flowers and veggies will only be as good as the soil, so use that manure and thank your horse.

- Minimize your carbon footprint and reduce your methane emissions by keeping food and yard waste out of the landfill. [Food waste is the single largest category of trash.]
- Create natural nutrient-rich soil amendments with your food and yard waste that help your garden grow.
- Avoid using synthetic fertilizers and pesticides.


