### **General Information**

1. This Rose Show & Display has both Judged and Non-Judged/Display Only Divisions. The Public votes for Most Fragrant, Best Photograph, Best Arrangement and Best in Horticultural Show. In addition, Judges may award any entry “Award of Excellence” ribbon.
2. Set-Up for Show is Fri Oct 11 from 1 – 4 PM.
3. Entries accepted on Sat Oct 12 from 7 AM – 10 AM.
4. Judging will begin at 10:15 AM.
5. The Show will be open to the public on Sat Oct 12 from 10 AM – 4 PM.
6. Exhibitors, Judges and Show Volunteers will receive wristbands for complimentary breakfast and lunch.
7. This year’s theme “Under Construction” is to commemorate the rebuilding of MLRS after the pandemic. Exhibitors and Judges are encouraged to wear hard hat, toolbelt, safety vest, or other item related to construction theme as part of the fun.
8. In addition, a Rose & Plant Sale on Sat Oct 12 from 10 AM – 4 PM or until sold out. Bring items for Plant Sale Fri Oct 11 during set-up or by Sat Oct 12 @ 9 AM.

## Rules & Guidelines for Entering Rose Show & Display

1. Judged Horticulture Division Section A Class 1 – 6 will follow standard ARS Rules. Exhibition form, one bloom per stem per vase. May enter as many varieties as choose, however only one of same variety. Additional blooms of that variety may be entered in Display Only Division.
2. Exhibitors may provide their own vases or containers for all classes. A limited number of vases will be provided by MLRS on first-come basis.
3. Display Only Horticulture Division/Section B Class 1 – 7 may contain up to 3 stems of same variety in one container, and may be at any stage of bloom.

## HORTICULTURE – JUDGED DIVISION – SECTION A

Section A, Class 1 – 6: One stem per container. May enter more than one entry per class, as long as each a different variety. Must use ARS entry tags, complete top half with name of variety, Section, Class, and exhibitor name, then fold tag closed. Exhibitors may use their own vases/bottles. A limited number of vases provided by MLRS on a first-come basis.

Class 1            Hybrid Tea/Grandiflora. One bloom per stem, Exhibition form.

*Awards: ARS Certificates for Queen, King and Princess.*

Class 2            Miniature. One bloom per stem, Exhibition form.

*Awards: ARS Certificates for Queen, King and Princess of Miniatures.*

Class 3            MiniFlora. One bloom per stem, Exhibition form.

*Awards: ARS Certificates for Queen, King and Princess of MiniFloras.*

Class 4            Floribunda Spray. One spray per stem.

*Award: ARS Certificate Best Floribunda Spray.*

Class 5            Novice, Hybrid Tea. One bloom per stem, Exhibition form.

Class 6

Novice, Miniature or MiniFlora. One bloom per stem, Exhibition form.

A Novice is someone who has not won more than 5 blue ribbons in MLRS Show.

*Award: ARS Certificate Best Novice for Class 5 or 6.*

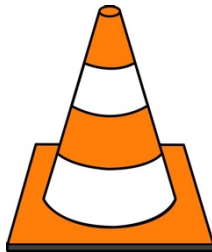


## **HORTICULTURE – DISPLAY ONLY/NON-JUDGED – SECTION B**

Section B Class 1 – 7 Section may have up to 3 stems same variety in one container, and at any stage of bloom. Horticulture Section B is Display Only/Non-Judged, however Judges may bestow Award of Excellence Ribbon to any entry they feel merits special recognition. Exhibitors may use either ARS entry tags or their own tags – be sure to list the name of the rose. Exhibitors may use their own vases/bottles. A limited number of vases will be provided by MLRS on a first-come basis.

- Class 1            Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora Bloom or Spray. Any stage, ie. Exhibition or Fully Open.
- Class 2            Floribunda, Bloom or Spray.
- Class 3            Miniature or MiniFlora, Bloom or Spray. Any stage, ie Exhibition or Fully Open.
- Class 4            Climbing Rose, Bloom or Spray.
- Class 5            Shrub, Bloom or Spray.
- Class 6            Polyantha Spray.
- Class 7            Old Garden Rose, Bloom or Spray. Please note date of introduction on tag if known.
- Class 8            Bouquet of Roses. Any combination of varieties. More than 6 stems.
- Class 9            Large Rose in Bowl. May use own container, ie. Bowl, Wine Glass, Martini Glass. Limited number of bowls provided by MLRS on first come basis.

- Class 10      Small Rose in Bowl. May use own container, such as Bowl, Shot Glass. Limited number of bowls provided by MLRS on first come basis.
- Class 11      3 Stages of Bloom – Bud beginning to unfurl, Exhibition, and Fully Open. Same variety, each in separate container. Shows beauty of rose at all stages.
- Class 12      Catch-All. Any type of rose not included in other classes. May include rose hips.
- Class 13      Unknown variety. If other exhibitors or public can identify, please do.
- Class 14      Most Fragrant – One Bloom or Spray.

## **PHOTOGRAPHY – DISPLAY ONLY/NON-JUDGED DIVISION – SECTION C**

The Photography Division is Display Only. Though Non-Judged, the Judges may bestow Award of Excellence to any Non-Judged entry in Photography Section. In addition, the Public may vote for Favorite Photograph.

List name of rose(s) on entry tag if known.

### **Large Photograph. 8" x 10" mounted.**

- Class 1            Rose one bloom.
- Class 2            Rose spray.
- Class 3            Macro – Closeup of portion of rose.
- Class 4            Rose Garden, private or public.
- Class 5            Other. Any other rosy photograph.

### **Small photograph. 5" x 7" unmounted.**

A limited number of 5 "x 7 "acrylic holders provided by MLRS on first-come basis.

- Class 6            Rose one bloom.
- Class 7            Rose spray.
- Class 8            Macro – Closeup of portion of rose.



Class 9            Rose Garden, private or public.

Class 10          Other. Any other rosy photograph.

## **ARRANGEMENTS – DISPLAY ONLY NON–JUDGED DIVISION – SECTION D**

The Arrangement Division is Display Only. Though Non-Judged, the Judges may bestow Award of Excellence to any Non-Judged entry in Photography Section.

In addition, the Public may vote for Favorite Arrangement.

List name of rose(s) on entry tag if known. Roses may be non-Arranger grown.

- Class 1            Large Arrangement. Designer’s Choice.  
                         “Under Construction” theme.
- Class 2            Small Arrangement.    Designer’s Choice.  
                         “Under Construction” theme.
- Class 3            Designer’s Choice of style and theme. May  
                         be Abstract, Modern, Under Water, Line,  
                         Mass, Dried, etc.

### **Best Arrangement – Section D**

## SECTION E – JUDGES ONLY

For the Judges judging our Show. Use ARS entry tags, complete top half. May use own containers. A limited number of vases/bottles will be provided by MLRS on first come basis.

- Class 1            Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora. One bloom per stem.
- Class 2            Miniature or MiniFlora. One bloom per stem.
- Class 3            Floribunda. One Bloom or Spray.
- Class 4            Shrub. One Bloom or Spray.
- Class 6            Old Garden Rose or Polyantha. One Bloom or Spray.
- Class 7            Any other type of rose. May be one bloom or spray.

*Award: ARS Certificate for Best Judges Section E Class 1 – 7.*
