Comments on the European Synod Document (DCS)

As a general comment it is important to recognise that Pope Francis is seeking a Church of evangelisation and mission. There is no blueprint for this.

1 The issues which resonated most strongly were:

- a. Those who engaged with the synodal process found it profoundly rewarding. (Para 15 - 17-1.1)
- b. The Church requires to be enriched by hearing and acting on the voices and views of all God's children.
- c. There is much greater scope for ecumenical working at all levels.(Para 1.2).
- d. Developing the Church internally with co-responsibility of clergy and of laity.
- e. There are issues that are specific to religions, denominations, and indeed to countries and parishes.

2 The areas of substantial tension or divergence were:

- a. The tension is between a Synodal Church in which the processes of learning, formation and discernment are more significant than a Church to which relies on doctrine and tradition alone. Clericalism can be a big source of tension.
- b. Attention should be given to the significant work done in Catholic institutions and most notably in schools which have a vital role in the synodal process.
- c. The need for developing a Church in which everyone has their part to play.
- d. The language of the Church has to be accessible to all. There is a gap between church and culture.

3 The priorities and recurring themes to which special attention should be given are:

- a. The Synod might wish to consider "*A Vision Statement*" that invites discernment and reconciliation of its purpose in the modern world-A Church that invites ways of being inspired by The Holy Spirit.
- b. Finding ways of hearing the voices of as many people as possible. Better communication.
- c. The urge for a Church in which everyone is welcomed and has a means of expressing their voice – especially young people and youth.
- d. Some attention needs to be given to the decision-making and structures, especially in relation to women.

The use of technology and especially social media as a force for faith development.
