### ***Buy the Best***

When you purchase a market animal from a Junior Livestock exhibitor, you're buying home-grown, high quality, and flavorful meat. The talent of our youth exhibitors can guarantee that you are truly buying the BEST! Here's what you can expect from your purchase of a market animal:

#### **Beef**

Beef in the auction will range from 1,000 to 1,400 pounds in weight. A typical 1,200 pound steer will yield approximately 580 pounds of wrapped meat. A bid of \$2.00 per pound would cost \$2,400.00. Buyers will only be charged per pound up to a weight of 1,350 pounds.

#### **Goat**

Goats in the auction will range from 65 to 130 pounds in weight. A typical 110 pound goat will yield approximately 41 pounds of wrapped meat. A bid of \$4.00 per pound would cost \$440.00.

#### **Lamb**

Lambs in the auction will range from 100 to 160 pounds in weight. A typical 120 pound lamb will yield approximately 75 pounds of wrapped meat. A bid of \$4.25 per pound would cost \$510.00.

#### **Swine**

Swine in the auction will range from 210 to 285 pounds in weight. A typical 250 pound swine will yield approximately 155 pounds of wrapped meat. A bid of \$2.50 per pound would cost \$625.00. Buyers will only be charged per pound up to a weight of 285 pounds.

#### **Holstein Calf**

Holstein Calf in the auction will range from 250 to 350 pounds in weight. A typical 300 pound Holstein Calf will yield approximately 115 pounds of wrapped meat. A bid of \$2.50 would cost \$750.00.

## How to Participate

You have two options for supporting our youth through the auction:

1. *Purchase a market or carcass beef, goat, lamb, swine, or veal animal that has been raised by a youth exhibitor.*

2. Place an “Add-on” (cash donation) to one or more exhibitors. **Minimum donation of \$25 per exhibitor.**

With both options, your financial support will be given directly to the exhibitor(s) you choose in order to help offset project costs and make their project profitable and successful.

## Participation Options in Detail

All buyers must register prior to making a bid or purchase during the auction. Registered buyers will receive a buyer number and auction program. To register, all buyers must fill out a 2025 *Buyer Registration & Agreement Form*.

**1. Purchase an Animal** - An individual or a group of several parties may purchase an animal at the auction by placing the winning bid. Animals are purchased on a price-per-pound basis. If you choose to keep the meat for personal consumption, you will be asked to select a processing facility from the list located on the sales agreement slip. The facility that you choose will contact you after the auction regarding your personal preferences for processing and packing your meat. You will be notified by the processing facility when your meat is ready for pick-up. Processing fees are NOT included in the purchase price of your animal. All processing charges must be paid in full when you pick up your meat.

**CARCASS ANIMAL PROJECT AUCTION** Carcass animal projects will be sold after the Market Auction and will be sold based on live weight. These animals cannot be floored. Buyers will own the meat and processing must occur at Miller’s SW Processing. Buyers will know the carcass grade at Auction time.

**If you do not wish to keep the meat for personal consumption, it can be donated.**

**Donation** - The animal you purchase can be donated back for re-sale at the end of the auction. The re-sale value will go to the P.C. Jr. Livestock Committee Scholarship Fund.

**2. Add-On** - An “Add-On” is a minimum cash donation of \$25 given to the exhibitor(s) of your choice, and can be given to as many exhibitors as you wish to support. To participate in the add-on program, you must sign and complete the “Add-On Agreement Form.” This form is available online at [www.pcjuniorlivestock.org](http://www.pcjuniorlivestock.org), or by contacting Carlos Gamez @ 602-725-2192. Payment in full must accompany the add-on agreement form. For buyers participating/purchasing during the 2025 auction, add-ons may be invoiced with their auction balance.

**3. Blue Ribbon Fund** - The Pinal County Jr. Livestock Committee’s Blue Ribbon Fund was established in order to support those exhibitors with the lowest auction total. After all sale and add-on contributions have been applied, this fund is used to supplement the checks of those exhibitors who were less fortunate in the sale of their project. If you are not sure of a specific exhibitor to support or if you cannot be present at the auction, consider donating to the Blue Ribbon Fund as a great way to contribute.

## Proxy Bids

We welcome your participation at our Jr. Livestock Auction, but we understand that conflicting events and busy schedules may hinder your availability on Saturday, March 15th. To assist you in every way possible so that you are still able to support our youth, the Pinal County Jr. Livestock Committee has authorized our Auction Sales Chairman to administer proxy bids on your behalf. To take advantage of this service, please contact Carlos Gamez, Auction Sales Chairman, at 602-725-2192. If you are already working with a contact to purchase for you that is also welcomed. Please make sure your contact knows and understands your financial expectations and purchasing preferences.

## Payment Process

Payment options include cash, check, or credit card. You may pay the day of the auction or be invoiced. Payment is due within 30 days of billing date. Our exhibitors cannot be paid for their hard work until your payment is received, so we appreciate your promptness. A finance charge of 5%, compounded monthly, will be applied to all payments not received within 30 days.
