The Best Arizona Bred Form must include the name of the exhibitor the animal was sold to, the name of the breeder, the breeder's national or state premise identification number, the animal's permanent identification number if applicable and physical markings on animal. Market Holstein calves shall be fed primarily with milk or a milk replacer for the first 30 - 60 days and then fully weaned before fair.

Supporting Comments for Rule Change Proposal

Holstein calves are not veal and not steer; this would help categorize the animal. 4H children would learn even more by weaning their calves by transitioning them to a different food. It would reduce investment cost and risk and could attract more children into participating in the project.
